If you have a question about an invoice or need help tracking an order, Jess will be your "Johnny-on-the-spot".


Jess has a wonderful sense of humor. We're confident you'll enjoy a quick visit with him when you call.

be easier and faster. The ordering process was tweaked and streamlined to make it so your orders will go through without some of the glitches we've run across over the last few years. We still use Shopify, which accepts a variety of payment methods.

Using a purchase order is also an option. Someone from VoWac will call your school to verify any PO.

Of course, orders can call your order in, email it, or fax it. Emailed and faxed orders will have a brief response so you know your order was received. If you do not get an email or returned fax response, give us a quick call for confirmation.

Sometimes emails and faxes get stuck in some black hole. It's easy to complete your order

in its entirety without error when we are both on the same page.

If by chance an order looks like a duplicate or if something looks amiss, we'll call and inquire. That's part of the personal service we try to provide.

And finally, we value your opinion and input. We can't do what we do without you. If you have a suggestion to make something better, easier or more efficient, please tell us. Quite often we get a pat on the back from you...gotta admit...that feels pretty darn good, too!

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#### Price guide available for 2021

#### Only workbooks see slight increase of 3.5%

If you have used our price guide in the past, you'll have no problem with the 2021 guide. There are no changes that will prevent you from easily maneuvering through the many items we offer.

If you're new to VoWac, here's a few tips that will make it a little easier to get from point A to point B.

VoWac can email you a new price guide or you can download a copy from the website. Go to the bottom of the homepage and click on 'price guide' Download the PDF and print it.

Specific grade level items are colorcoded. There will be some overlap. A few items are relevant to two or more levels. Pre-K is a goldenrod hue. Kindergarten is blue; Level One - red; Level Two - yellow; Three is red, and Level Four is purple.

You'll see stars beside various items. The stars indicate which items are included in specific level kits. The two remedial packages are colored orange or gray - Remedial 1 or 2 respectively.

VoWac item codes are essentially the initials of the item itself. We tried to keep this simple and easy.

Here's a few examples: a Level One teacher guide is labelled TG1-a or -b; Teacher Guide • Level One • 'a' is the first volume, 'b' is the second volume. The spelling teacher guide is labelled STG-1. Workbooks are listed in a similar fashion; W-K-D or W-K-Z - workbook•level K•D'Nealian

(slant) (D) or Zaner-Bloser (upright) (Z) font. Workbooks and any other items without a 'D' or 'Z' indicator will be printed in the 'Z' or upright font.

If you aren't sure if you are ordering the right item, you can always contact us. You can also go to the website and enter the item code in the search icon. It will direct you to that specific item, give you a picture and a brief description.

One of the practices VoWac DOES NOT use is needlessly creating or updating new editions in order to drive sales. Updates are done as needed, usually without a price increase. If we find something minor that needs to be edited before a print cycle, we will provide information on the change and have you make that edit in your existing guide. VoWac understands budgets. Using this practice has saved schools hundreds of dollars over the years.

And finally, we need to inform our schools of the necessary price increase. We have held steady for five years without an increase in workbooks. It was decided that a minimum increase of 3.5% would have to be added to the skills and spelling workbooks, bring them to \$17.60 and \$16.50 respectively.

We hope we can hold that pricing structure for several years to come. The Covid pandemic has cause a bit of a dilemma in our operation. We hope things get back to normal soon.

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## What message do you really want to send?

REPORT S CARD

How many times have you heard an education guru say something like, "if schools are doing 'this', they should stop because it makes no sense." The 'this' is usually some small change that seems effective at the time; making a child stay in for recess as punishment, giving extra credit to students that finish tasks early, eliminating homework, etc.

We rarely, if ever, hear anyone suggest changes that would effect a much larger systemic issue - something we have let become an archaic sacred cow - the report

As educators and parents, we have created this 'report card monster' that is supposed to be able to tell us everything we want to know about any child in school. Let's set the record straight on three things.

First, report cards are intended to communicate student academic and non-cognitive progress. Second, the single letter grades do NOT tell the most accurate story of student progress over time. And third, student performance is far more than a single letter grade, percentage or performance level on any learning standard.

That being said, here are three suggestions that parents might support to rid your school of that 'report card monster'.

First, communicate to parents that frequent communication on academic progress is essential to student success. Provide parents access to an online gradebook that they may check was often as they'd like. Also provide them with an option of receiving a paper report card at the end of each grading period.

All that stuff you send home....newsletters from teachers, from school, from the PTA, from the boosters....whatever....STOP! Parents are becoming numb to all of the often, mindless communications and begin to miss the important communications - like how their child is performing.

Start an email schedule that parents know about. Perhaps every Sunday night, parents will receive an email about their child. Week 1 could be from the teacher telling about classroom events. Week 2

could be about building events. Week 3 might be important district level information. Week 4 might be PTA information, and so on. But EVERY email reminds parents to review their child's progress by logging into the online gradebook.

At the end of a grading period, send an email informing parents of such and kindly remind them, "Please log into your online gradebook."

There will be a rub to this. If parents don't receive a paper report card and do not have access to the internet how will they know how their child is doing in school?

One current study indicates that about

89% of Americans have

access to the internet If you have any parents that fall in that 11% without internet, provide access to a computer in the office of your school....kind of like a Report Card" kiosk. Let families know they are welcome to come to the school and review their child's progress at any time. This will also give you a great opportunity to visit with those parents. It is those parents that often feel disenfranchised from the school. It could change the entire level of home support for that student, not to mention you would be providing a great service to the parent.

All of these things can be done gradually. But they become moot if your school does not have an online

gradebook. If you're one of those systems - keep the paper flowing, but do so without killing so many trees.

Don't forget...a good old-fashion phone conversation also goes a long way. Very few homes are without some sort of

telephone, be it landline or cell. The call doesn't always have to be when something negative happens. On the contrary Report the good stuff too! The important thing - communicate.



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
