From window coverings to cushions and accessories, whether practical or decorative, textiles can help create different moods. We can see that this reading nook is conducive to tranquillity. Different textiles are combined to dress up the space with simplicity. Covering a whole section of a wall from ceiling to floor, the soft folds of the ripple fold curtains infuse elegance and amplitude while offering privacy

without cutting off natural light. Adding cozy-looking elements in harmonious tones, such as geometric print cushions, beige-patterned throws and textured carpets helps to enhance the feeling of comfort. Beyond their practical side, fabrics can also be transformed into works of art. Here, a piece of framed fabric takes on the look of a masterpiece.

PRO TIP

Creating ripple fold style sheer curtains

1. Create a 2.5 cm (1") fold along the top of the fabric. Fold the fabric again over itself. Fold the side of the fabric to prevent it from fraying. Align the top of the snap tape with the top of the double fold and pin it in place. With a sewing machine, use a zipper foot to sew at the top and bottom of the tape with the snaps. Make sure to sew the tape in the same direction to prevent the fabric from shifting.
2. Using a rubber mallet, attach part A of the carriers to the snaps.
3. Slide the top of part A of the carriers into part B of the carriers that are attached to the string.
4. One by one, insert the top of part B of the carriers on the wave drape track while keeping the string straight. To create the soft S-shape, alternate the direction of the fabric folds.



You will need

- Channel track
- Snap tape
- Two-piece detachable carriers
- Sewing machine
- Rubber mallet
