




CONNECTION

(1) Connect USB plug of keyboard to USB port on your desktop computer or laptop.




(2) LED on keyboard will illuminate once it is connected and ready to use.



FUNCTION KEYS




RGB BACKLIGHT CONTROLS

MACR0 KEYS



A macro key can be used to create a shortcut of key sequences. A sequence can be recorded with a single key or a combination of keys. G1-G5 keys can be manually recorded, and each macro can be recorded at 15 bytes maximum.

- Press Rec key to start recording and press the valid macro key (G1-G5) you want to record your sequence to after the LED light above the number keypad illuminates.
- Press one of the G1-G5 macro keys to stop recording. Once LED light stops flashing and returns to current state, the recorded content will be stored in the applicable macro key.
- ③ Press the Rec key to exit recording. Alternatively, if there is no action for 30 seconds, the recording will automatically exit. The LED light will then return to current state after exiting.
- Press FN+Esc keys for 3 seconds to clear the macro recording information. The default setting will be restored after the middle of the keyboard illuminates sequential flashing of red, green and blue colours.

WARNING

- Keep keyboard away from water and moisture to avoid any damage to hardware.
- Keep keyboard away from direct sunlight to avoid colour fading.
- Regularly wipe dust from keyboard with dry cloth to extend keystroke lifespan.
