## **Registration Policy**

To ensure that classes meet their minimum enrollment, please register at least 12 days prior to the scheduled class. In most cases, registrations will be accepted after this, if the classes have met their minimum. Payment of tuition and materials fee is due at time of registration.

## **Refund Policy**



Projects might include texturing still-wet pots by carving with wires and tools, using fabric and underglazes to create colored textures, and creating depth with applications of thick slip. Bring your clay tools and packing material to take home leather hard work. This class is not for beginners. You should know how to center clay and draw up a wall. This class does not include glazing or firing. Studio members can take care of this with their studio membership or non-members can pay an additional fee.


how to center clay and pull up a 2 lb. cylinder. We are concentrating on forms and techniques so the class does not include glazing and firing. Bring your clay tools with you.






