TINY CLAY OWLS

You can make lots of tiny owls, or just a few, it's up to you!

- 1. Pinch off as much clay as you want to use to make your first owl.
- 2. Roll it into a ball between your hands.
- 3. Flatten it like a pancake! Try to keep it circular in shape.
- 4. Use the top of a Crayola marker or similar object to make a feather design on the bottom half of the circle.
- 5. Fold in the two sides of the circle so they are just touching.
- 6. Fold down the top of the circle and pull up the points to make "ears".
- 7. Use the marker top and bottom and pencil tip to press eyes into the head.
- 8. With a pencil, make a 'V" for the beak.

That's it, you're done! If you want to hang your owl like an ornament or as a necklace, have an adult help you make one or two holes above the eyes or in the "ears". Use the pencil and slowly twist it as you push it through. You can *gently* write your name with the pencil on the back or on one of the wings. Set your owl aside to dry and make another one!
