


The Great Wall of China is an iconic specimen of ancient Chinese architecture.

This massive fortification wall, the greatest ever built in human history, dates back to the time of the Great Ming Empire. 

RAMSES II

TOMB OF THE GREAT ANCESTOR

His name is 'Ozymandias, King of Kings', wrote the poet Percy Bysshe Shelley of Ramses II, the third pharaoh of the 19th Dynasty of Egypt and hailed as the 'Great Ancestor' of the Egyptian people. Regarded as the greatest and most powerful pharaoh of the New Kingdom, the tomb of Ramses II, or Ramses the Great, lies in the Valley of the Kings on the Nile's west bank near Luxor. In the ancient necropolis that accommodates 63 magnificent royal tombs, the tomb of Ramses II, numbered KV7, marks the final resting place of Egypt's 'Keeper of Harmony and Balance, Strong in Right, Elect of Ra'. An ardent patron of Egyptian art and culture, Ramses II lived to be 96 years old, cementing his position as one of the most charismatic and influential rulers that Egypt has ever produced.

TRANQUIL ARCHITECTURAL MASTERPIECE

The temple's central hall can accommodate up to 2,500 people at a time and has no religious symbols or idols, making it a unique place of worship that promotes unity and oneness among all people. The Lotus Temple is not only a symbol of architectural excellence but also represents the spirit of inclusiveness and harmony that is at the heart of the Bahá'í faith.

SYMBOLIC CHRIST STATUE

Christ the Redeemer is a statue located in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, and is one of the most famous and iconic monuments in the world. The statue stands at 30 meters (98 feet) tall and is situated on top of Corcovado Mountain, overlooking the city of Rio de Janeiro. The statue was constructed between 1922 and 1931 and is made of reinforced concrete and soapstone. It is a symbol of Brazilian Christianity and is a popular tourist attraction, drawing millions of visitors every year. The statue has become a cultural icon of Brazil and is widely recognized as one of the New Seven Wonders of the World.




