SIZING GUIDE - RINGS

Before measuring your ring size, make sure you have printed this guide on a full A4 size (21 x 29.7cm) page and scaled to 100%. Check the accuracy of the print by positioning a credit card on the line below. If the card lines up, you're all set.


### OPTION 1 MEASURE WITH THE VL CEPHER RULER

After you cut out the ruler, carefully cut the line to create a slit. Wrap the ruler around your finger at the base and pull the tapered end through the slit. To make sure the ring will fit comfortably, we suggest also measuring your knuckle. We recommend selecting a size that goes on and off your finger easily. Ring size may also vary slightly depending on style of the ring. If your ideal fit falls between two sizes, we recommend choosing the larger size. The numbers on the ruler reflect your US size.



### OPTION 2 MEASURE BY MATCHING YOUR RING

To find your VL. Cepher ring size, use an existing ring that fits you well. Match the inside of that ring with one of the circles below. When your ring has been placed on the right size, you should see only the black circle—with no white space—inside your ring. If your ideal fit falls between two sizes, we recommend choosing the larger size. Numbers below reflect US sizing.

### NOTES:

Finger size can change depending on the time of day and weather; for the most accurate measurement, measure your finger at different times of the day and on different days to compare. Avoid measuring your fingers when they are cold or wet, as they will be at their smallest. If your measurement falls between two sizes we recommend choosing the larger size.

SIZING GUIDE - BRACELETS

The usual bracelet sizing rules differ slightly for the VL. Cepher bracelet due to its design. Once you have defined the circumference of your wrist with the VL. Cepher ruler, we recommend adding one centimeter for a true/tight fit and two centimeters for a loose fit. If your ideal fit falls between two sizes, we recommend choosing the larger size. Please note that the wrist sizer is an indicative guide only and therefore may not be an exact measure.

### MEASURE WITH THE VL. CEPHER RULER

Before using the ruler to find your fit, make sure this guide is printed on A4 size paper and scaled to 100%. To check the accuracy of your printout, position a credit card under the line below. The scale is correct if the credit card and line length match.

Place credit card below:



Cut out the ruler.

Cut a horizontal line below the VL. Cepher ruler. Wrap the ruler around the circumference of your wrist, below your wrist bone closer to your hand, with the numbered side visible. Slip the numbered end through the horizontal opening and pull until the ruler is flush against your skin. The number that lines up with the edge of the opening is your wrist size in centimeters.

We recommend adding 1cm for a true/tight fit and 2cm for a loose fit. If your ideal fit falls between two sizes, choose the larger size.
