Conducting your own Vase Life Studies

- Adapted from Dr. Pat Holloway's protocol
- Consistency is key
- Part 1: Cutting and Storing Stems
 - Choose the stems you want to test
 - Try not to collect all stems from same plant
 - Cut, label, and store them all under the same conditions
 - i.e. at the same temperature for the same length of time
 - Best to use merchandise tags for labelling (label with the date picked and the variety)



Conducting your own Vase Life Studies

- Part 2: Post-storage
 - Trim stems another 2 inches
 - Keep stems in vases filled with regular water
 - Ensure that stems are receiving plenty of sunlight and that all stems receive roughly the same amount of light
 - Keep stems as close to room temperature as possible



Conducting your own Vase Life Studies

- Part 3: Recording bud opening, full bloom (FB), and petal fall (PF) or wilt (W)
 - Record the date the bud begins to open up (first day of vase life)
 - Full bloom: when you see the large guard petals are as perpendicular as possible to the stem
 - Check each stem everyday to see if it has fully bloomed
 - Record the date of the full bloom
 - Then continue to check the stem until it reaches petal fall or wilt
 - This is the point where a consumer would throw the stem away
 - i.e. the end of its vase life
 - You can gently flick each stem everyday to check for petal fall
