It fascinated and continues to fascinate me.



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
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Romney's son, John, described this piece in 1830.

In the winter of 1795 he painted a head of himself, which, though slight, and not entirely finished, being painted at once, shows uncommon power of execution; the likeness also is strong, but there is a certain expression of languor. . . .

Some paintings go beyond the sum of their parts.

For me, this portrait is just such a piece.

I feel like I am on the outside looking into his state of mind.






Featured Artist: Stefan Harris
