

Design 10 - Classici 25

PULLOVER ECOPUNO

## **PULLOVER · ECOPUNO**

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**Size** 36/38 (40/42, 44)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 400 (450, 500) g of Lana Grossa Ecopuno (72% cotton, 17% Merino wool, 11% baby alpaca; 215 m/50 g) in Pearl Beige (col 66). Size 3.5 mm needles; size 3 mm crochet hook.

Rib patt: K1, p1.

St st: K on RS, p on WS.

**Full-fashion decrease (dbl decrease)**: At beg of RS row, k3, skp (sk2p); at end of RS row, work to last 5 (6) sts, k2tog (k3tog), k3 – 1 (2) st(s) decreased at each edge.

**Full-fashion increase**: On RS row: M1R, 6 sts in from each edge.


**Gauge**: 22 sts and 30 rows =  $10 \times 10 \text{ cm}$  in St st on size 3.5 mm needles.

**Back**: With size 3.5 mm needles cast on 155 (165, 175) sts. Next row (WS): Selvage st, \* p1, k1; rep from \* to last 2 sts, p1, selvage st. Next 2 rows: Work in rib patt as set by last row. Work in St st and shape sides as foll: Working full-fashion inc, inc 1 st at each end of next 46 RS rows, then every alt RS row 2 times = 251 (261, 271) sts. Work even until piece meas 35 cm from cast-on. Place marker in first and last st on last WS row to indicate beg of armholes. Cont until piece meas 25 cm from armhole markers, ending with a WS row. Shape shoulders: At each shoulder edge bind off 5 sts 20 (15, 10) times, 6 sts 1 (6, 11) time(s). Bind off rem 39 sts.

**Front**: Work <u>left half</u> first as foll: With size 3.5 mm needles cast on 54 (58, 64) sts. Next row (WS): Selvage st, \* p1, k1; rep from \*, end selvage st. Next 2 rows: Work in rib patt as set by last row. Work in St st, increasing 0 (1, 0) st at center of first row = 54 (59, 64) sts, work full-fashion incs for side shaping at right edge same as for back. <u>At same time</u>, work shaping for front slit as foll: Working full-fashion inc, inc 1 st at end of every alt RS row 19 times, then every 6th row 4 times = 125 (130, 135) sts. Work even until piece meas 34 cm from cast-

on, ending with a WS row. Place sts on holder, do not cut yarn. Work <u>right half</u> same as left half, reversing all shaping. Place sts on holder, cut yarn. Join left and right halves: Next row (RS): Work 125 (130, 135) left half sts, inc 1 st, work 125 (130, 135) right half sts = 251 (261, 271) sts. Work even across all sts until same length as back to shoulders. Shape shoulder same as for back. <u>At same time</u>, when piece meas 3 cm from beg of shoulder shaping, shape neck as foll: Next row (RS): Bind off center st. Working each side separately and working full-fashion dec/dbl dec, dec 2 sts at each neck edge every RS row 4 times, then dec 1 st at each neck edge every RS row 11 times. No sts rem.

**Finishing**: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder/overarm and side seams. Using crochet hook, work 1 row chain sl st along center of front.






## Gauge Swatch

#### Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.

**beg** = begin(ning)  $\cdot$  **ch** = chain  $\cdot$  **cont** = continue  $\cdot$  **dec** = decreas(e)(ing)  $\cdot$  **inc** = increas(e)(ing)  $\cdot$  **k** = knit  $\cdot$  **kwise** = as if to knit **meas** = measures  $\cdot$  **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop  $\cdot$  **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop  $\cdot$  **patt** = pattern  $\cdot$  **pm** = place marker  $\cdot$  **p** = purl **pwise** = as if to purl  $\cdot$  **rem** = remain(ing)  $\cdot$  **rep** = repeat(s)  $\cdot$  **rev St st** = reverse stockinette stitch  $\cdot$  **rnd(s)** = round(s)  $\cdot$  **RS** = right side  $\cdot$  **sc** = single crochet  $\cdot$  **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch  $\cdot$  **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch  $\cdot$  **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch  $\cdot$  **s1** = slip  $\cdot$  **st(s)** = stitch(es)  $\cdot$  **St st** = stockinette stitch  $\cdot$  **tbl** = through the back loop  $\cdot$  **tog** = together  $\cdot$  **wyib** = with yarn in back of work  $\cdot$  **wyif** = with yarn in front of work  $\cdot$  **WS** = wrong side  $\cdot$  **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
