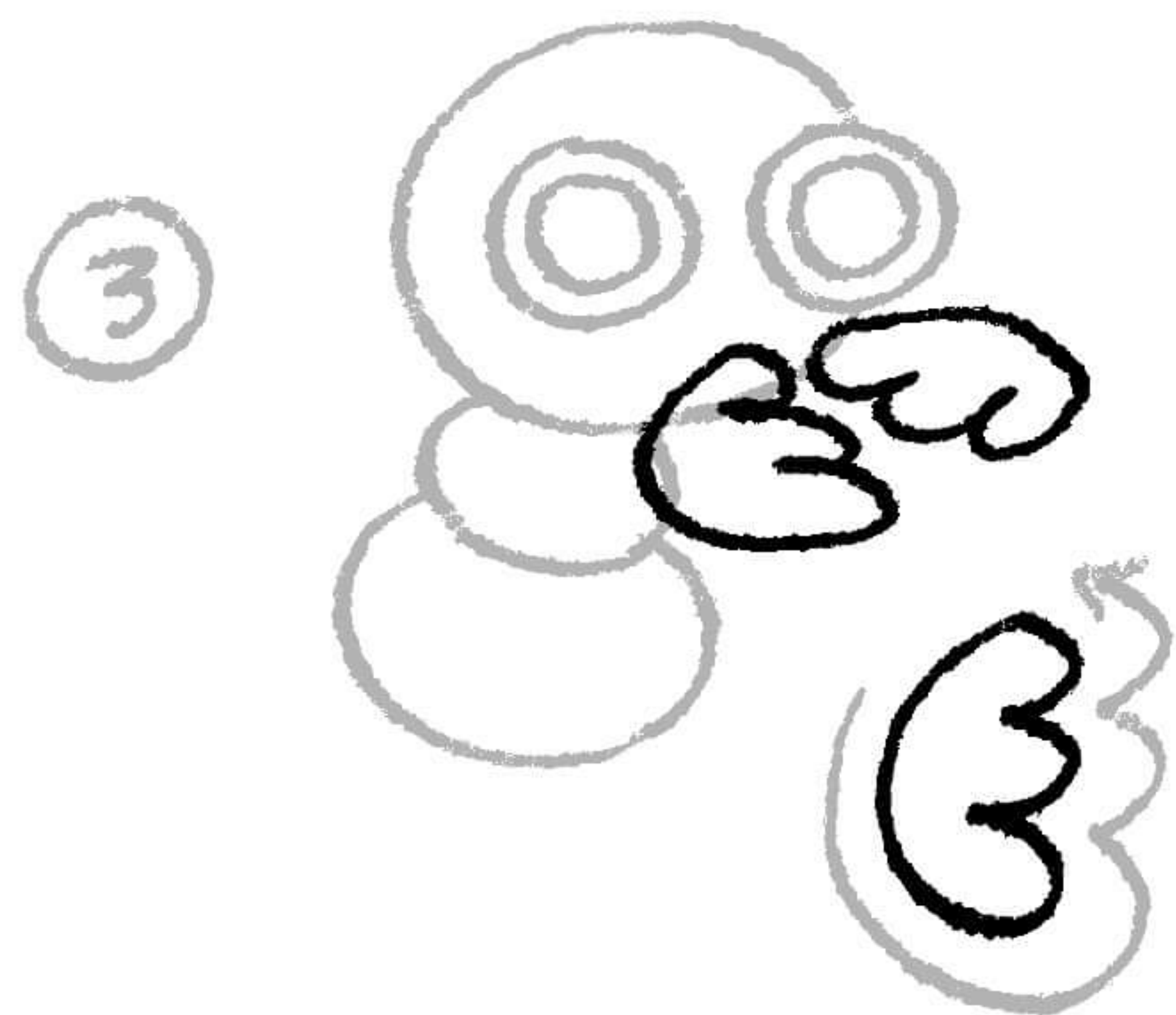
Understanding the head means you can draw the face from different angles. Follow these tips to help you draw from different angles.

Add the legs and antennae.



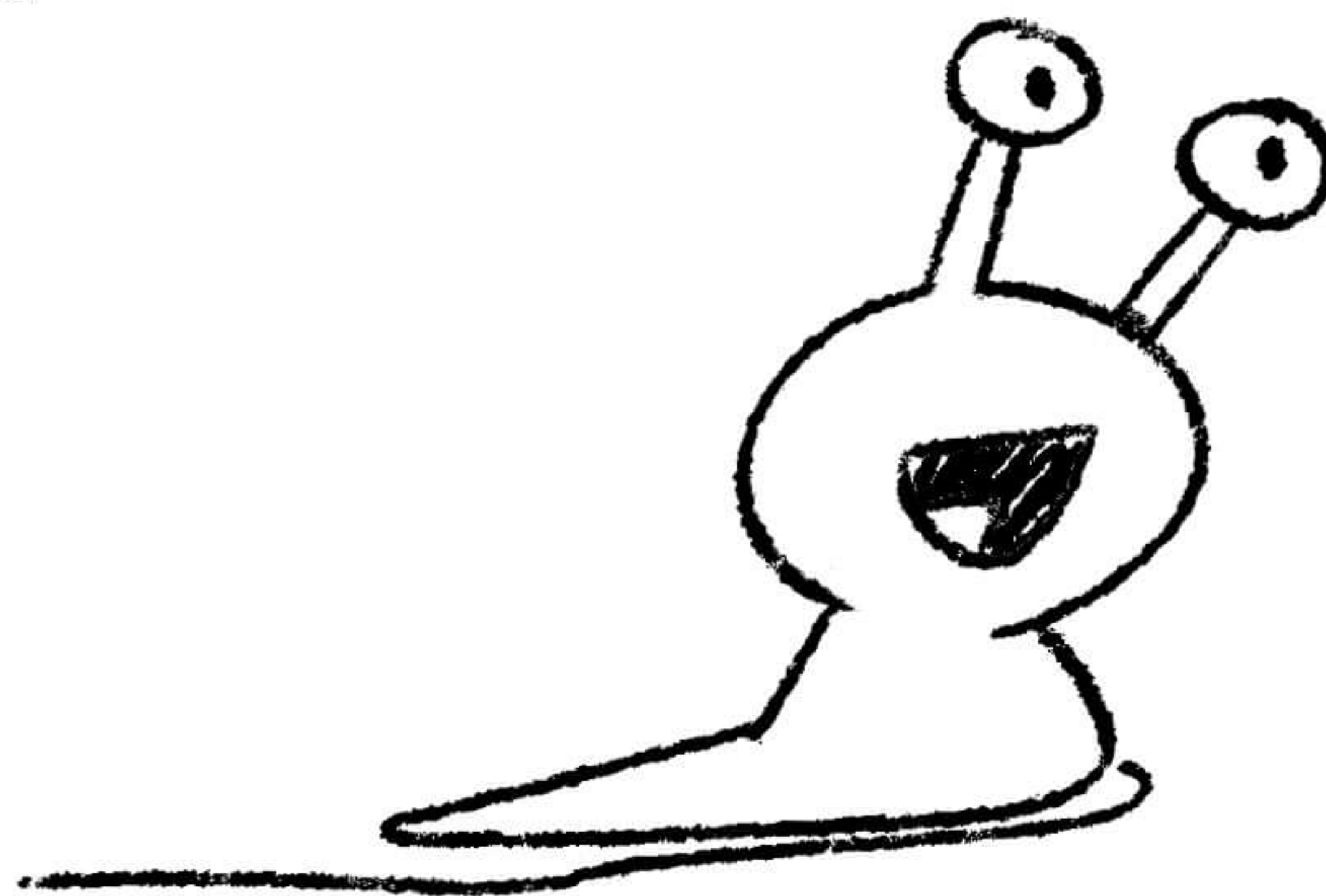
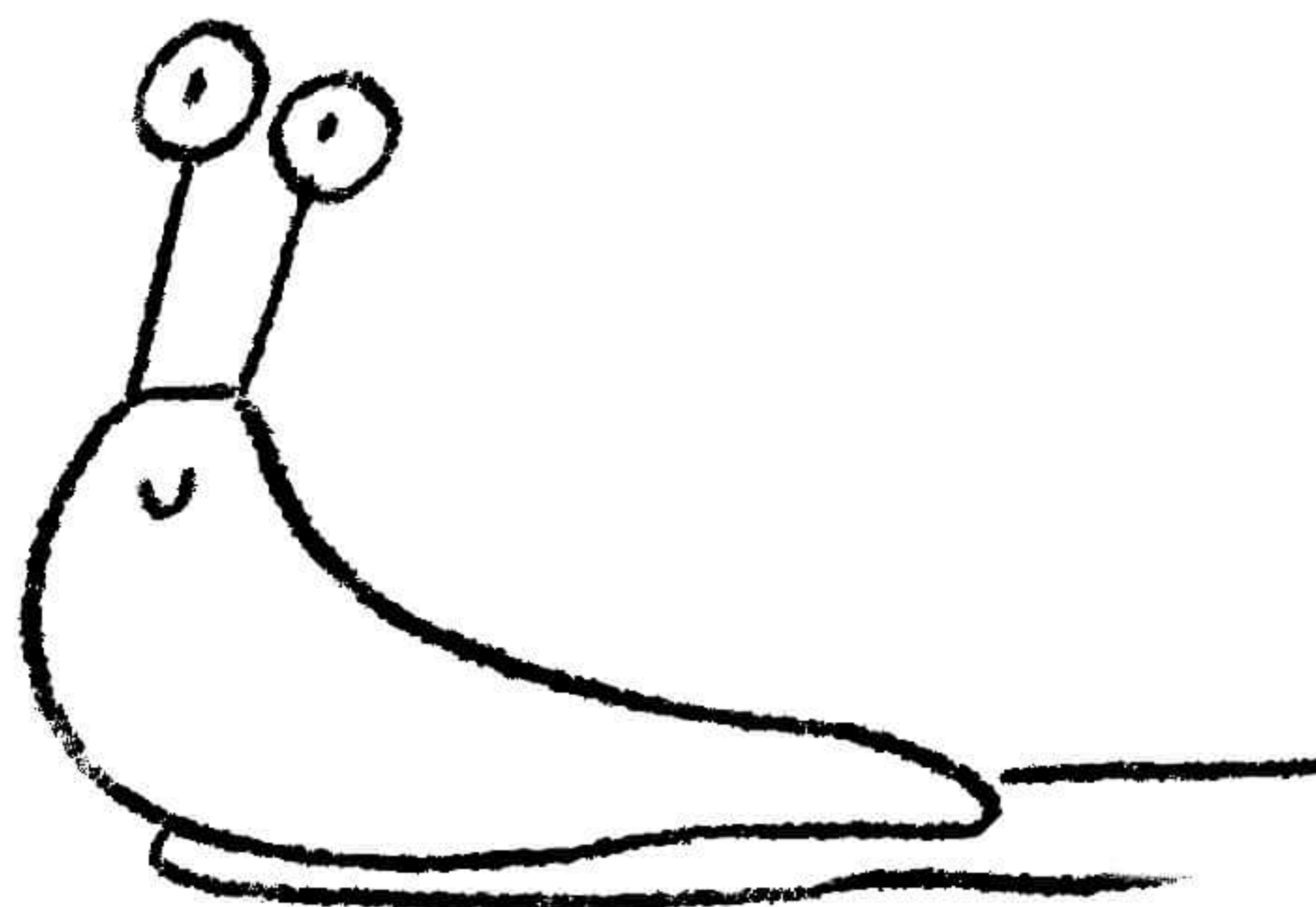
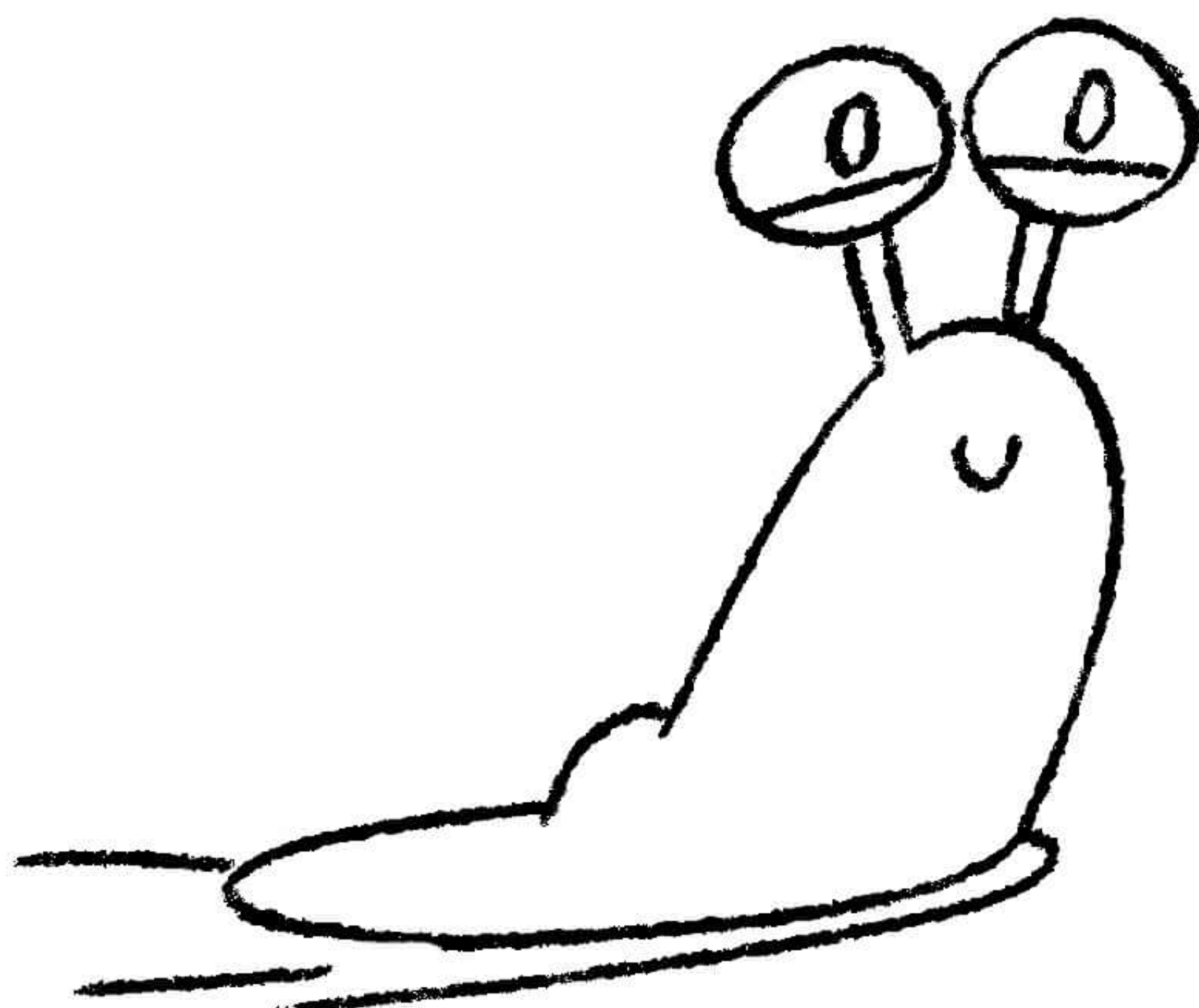
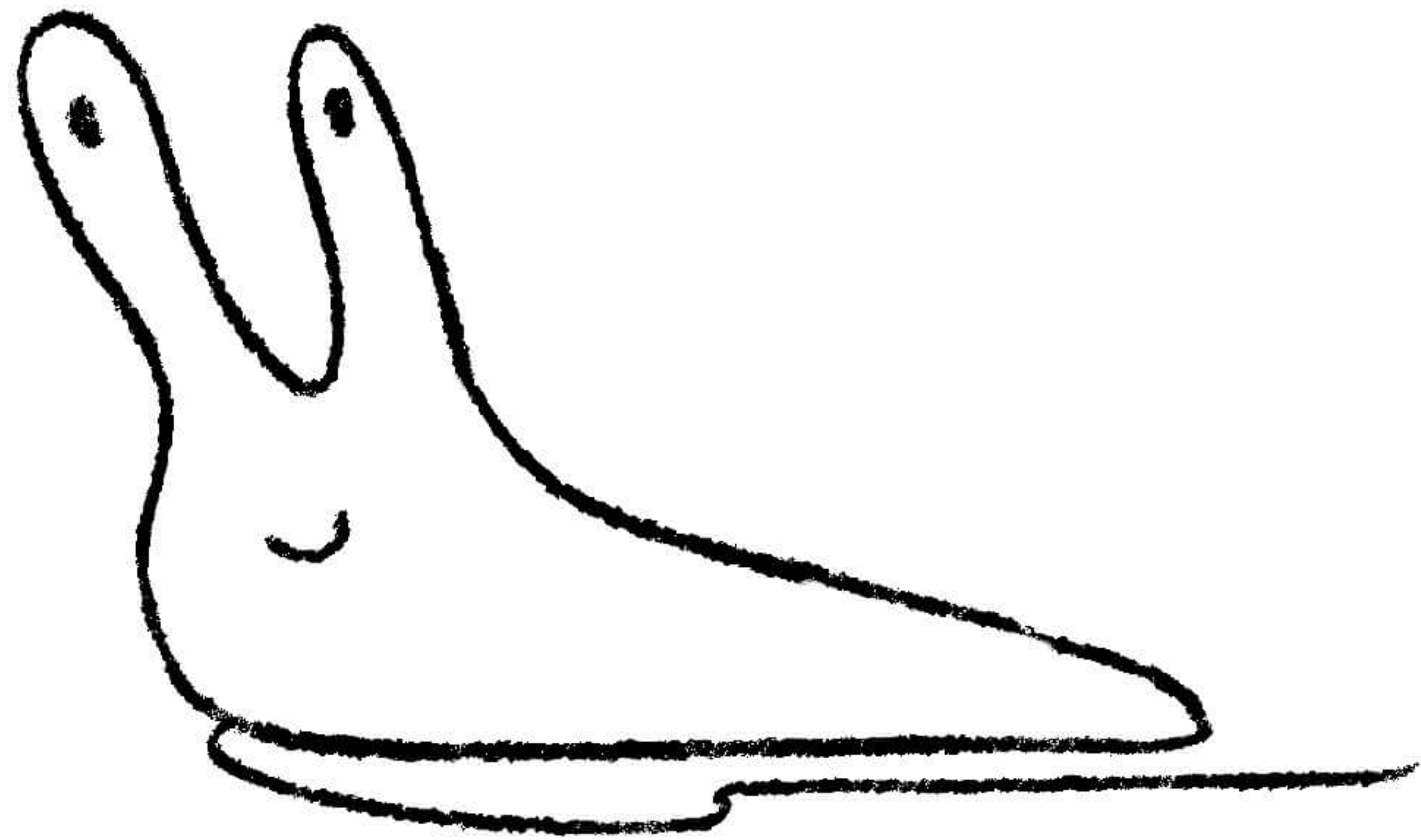
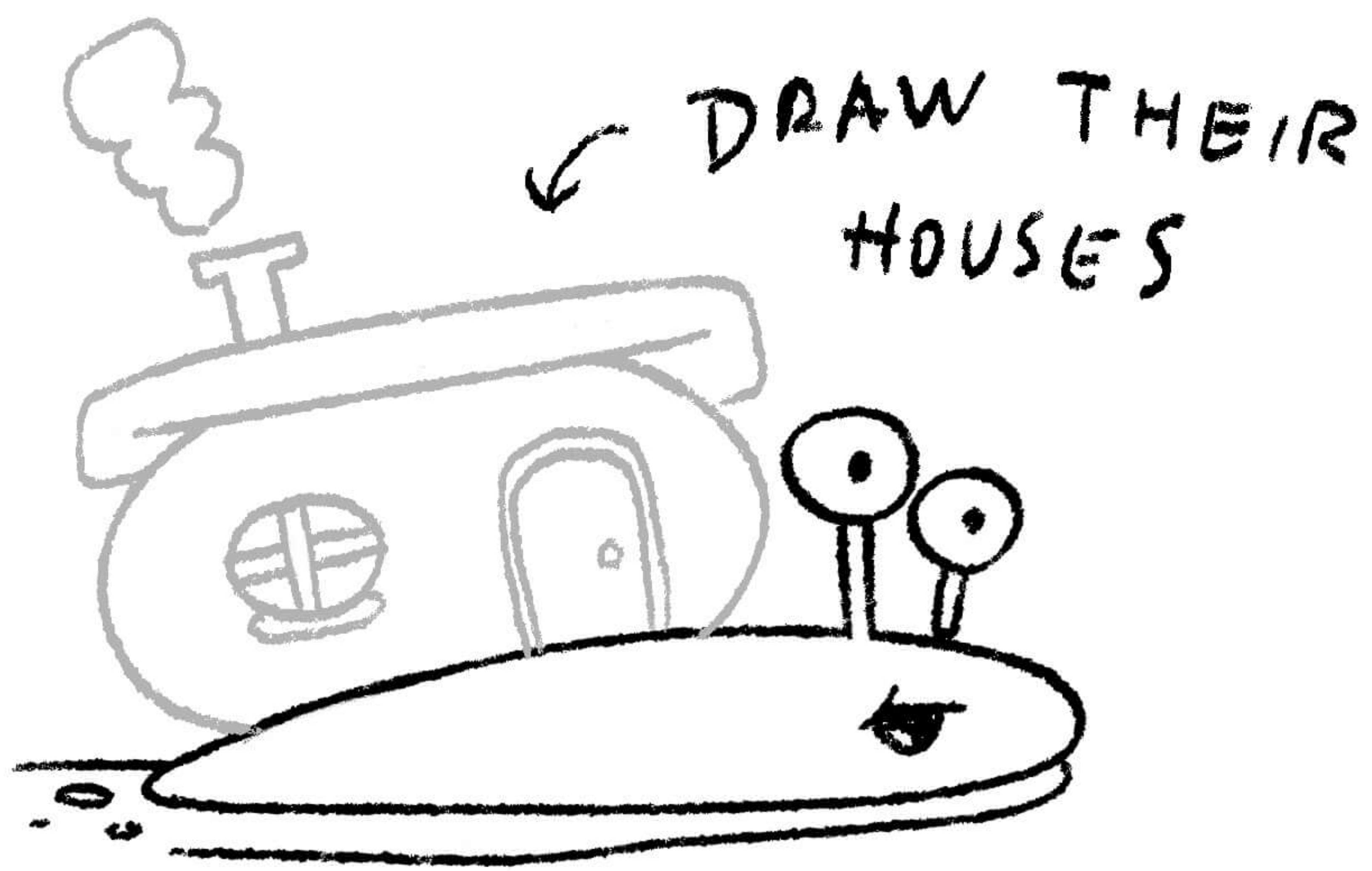
Add extra arms. Ants have 6 legs!



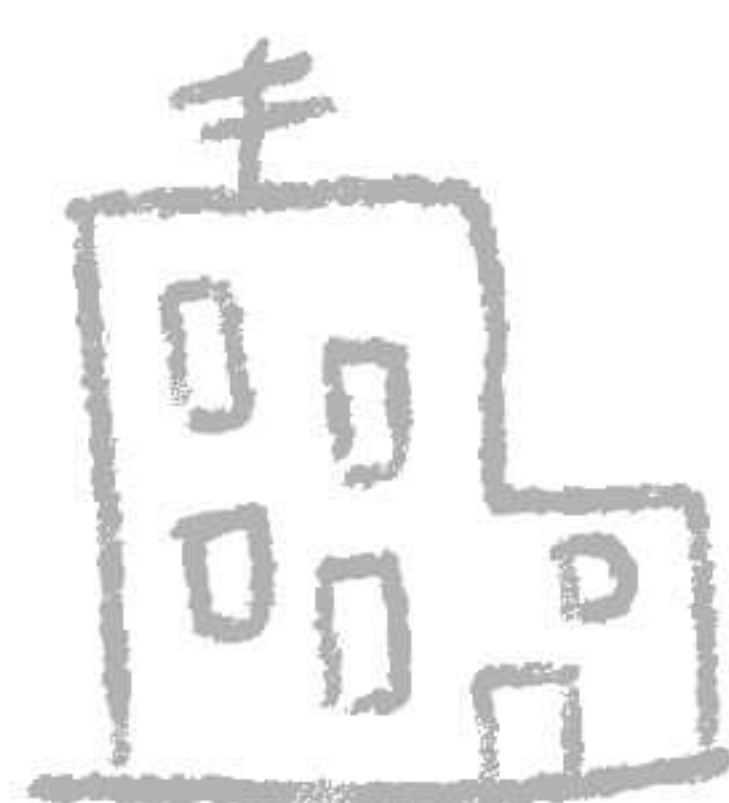
Once you finish, try giving the character something to do.

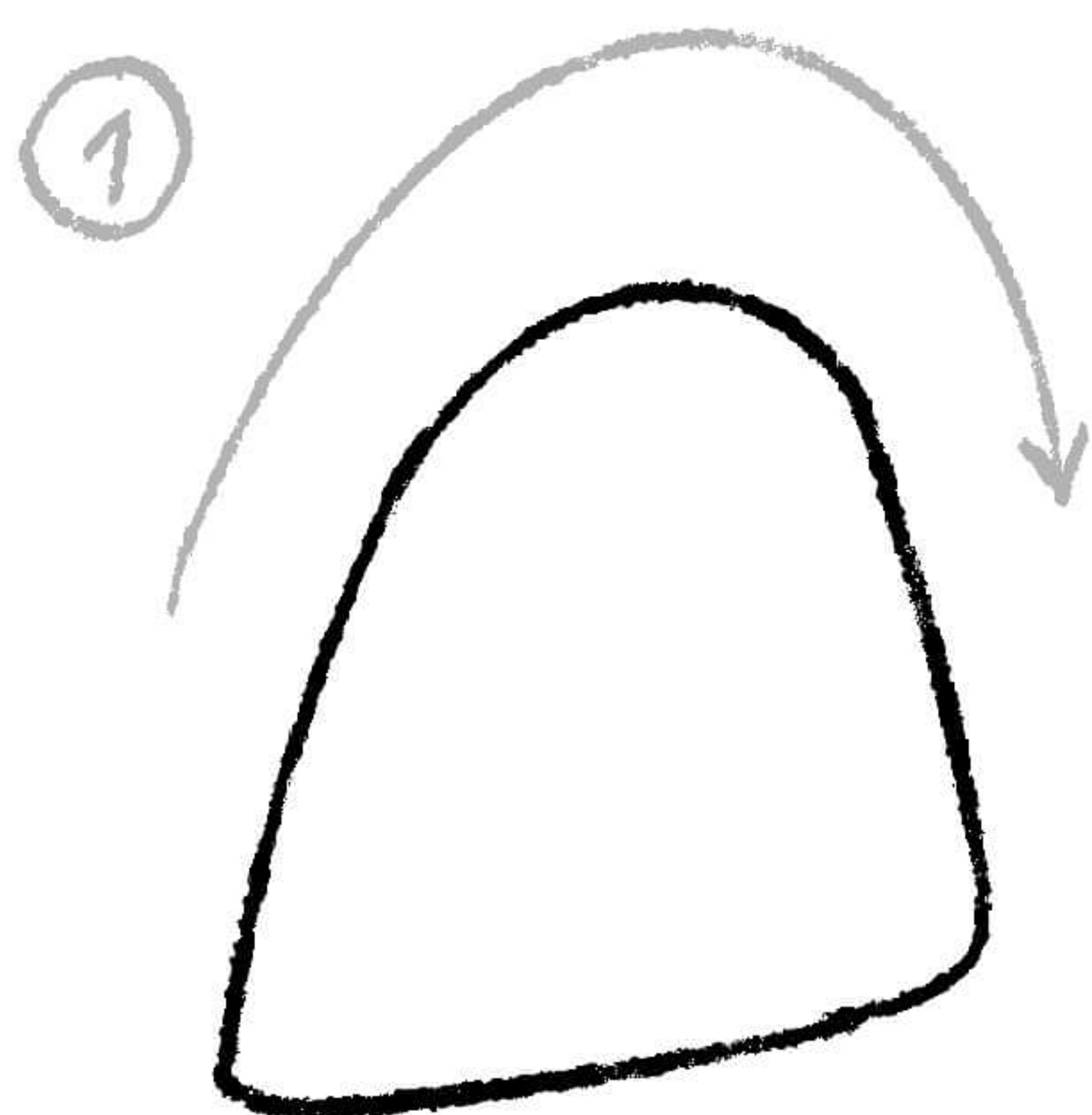

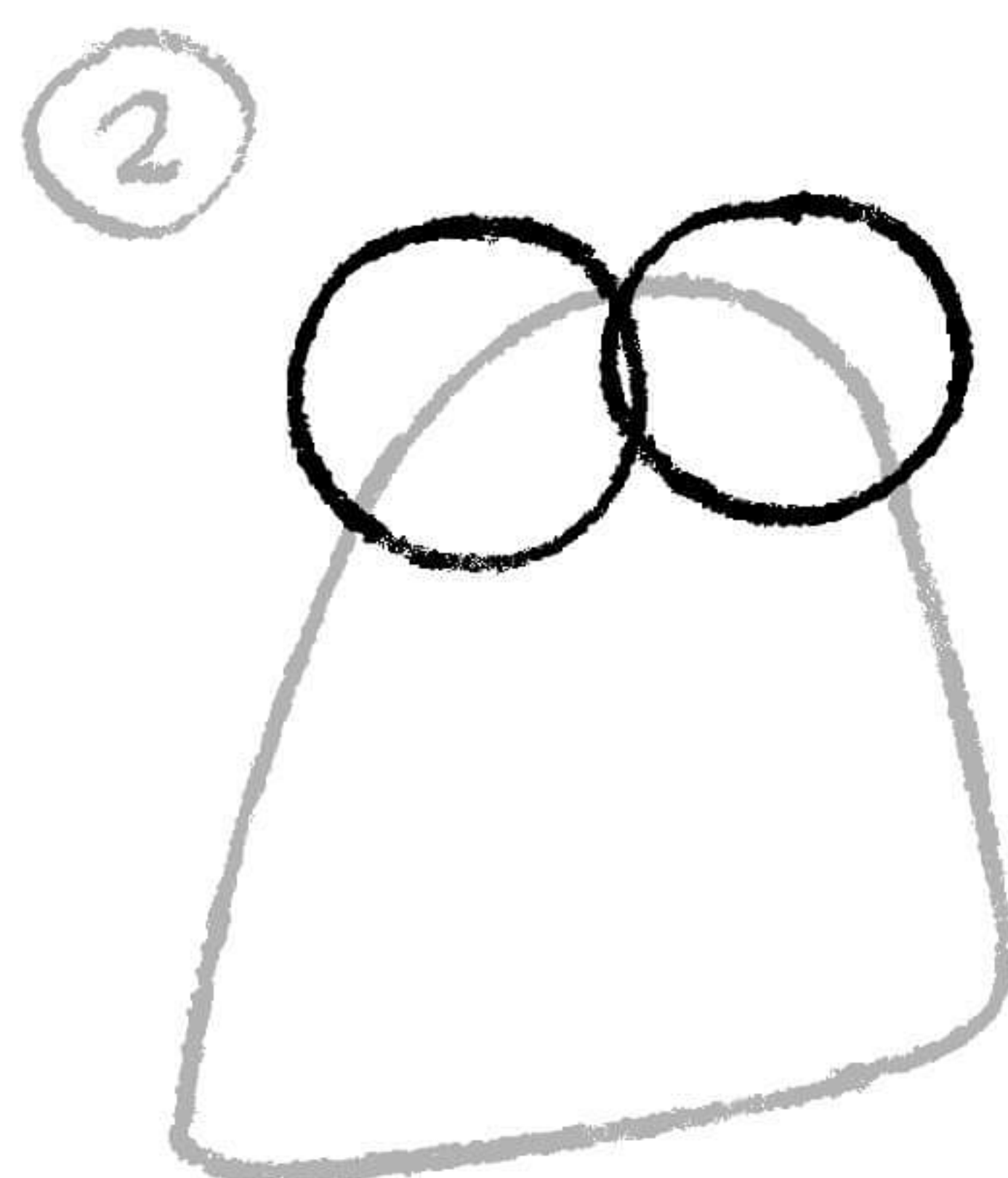
Frogs

Frogs have a visual field of almost 360° so they can look completely around themselves all the time!



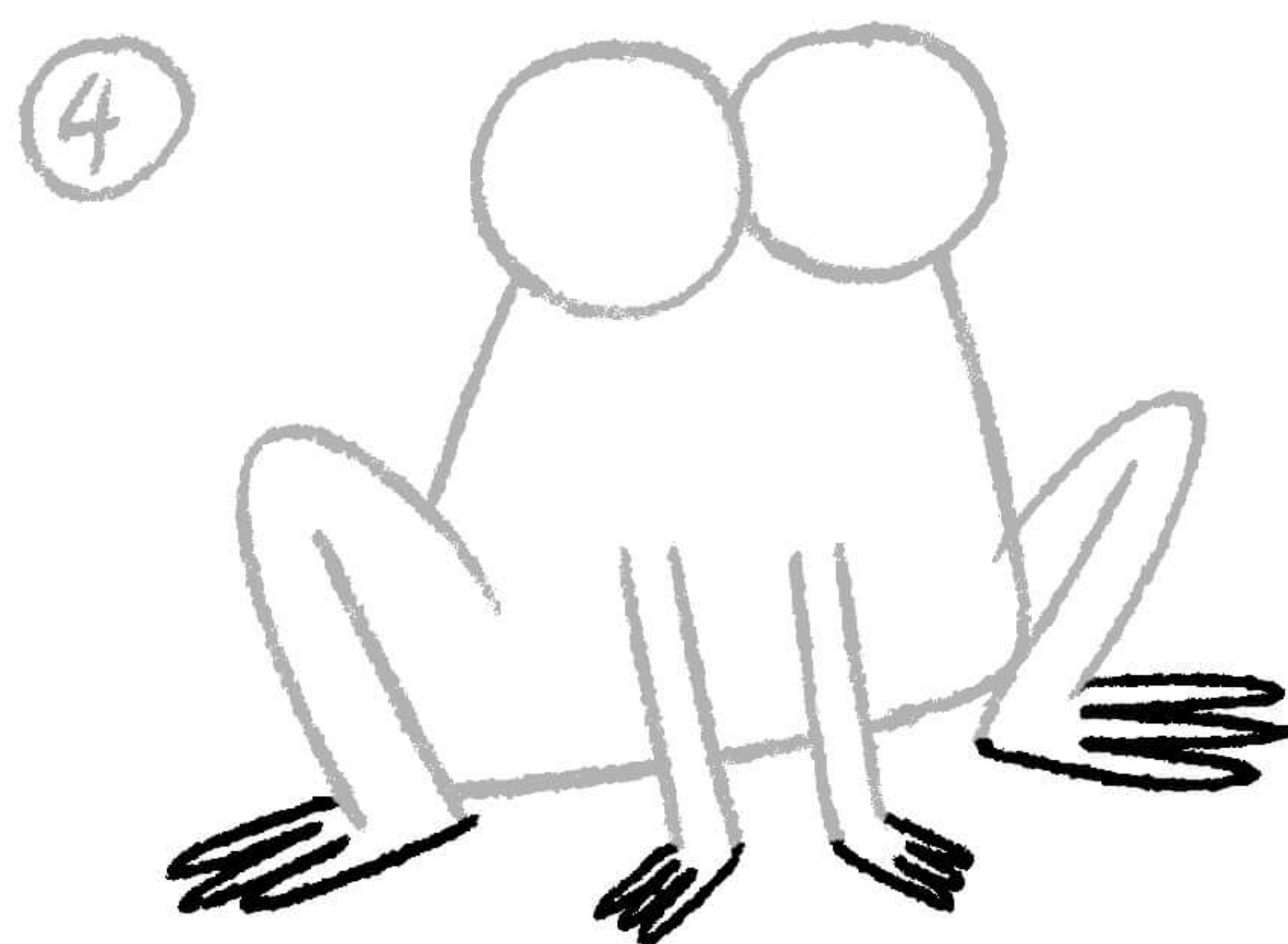
Draw a gummy drop.

Set the foundation for the legs.



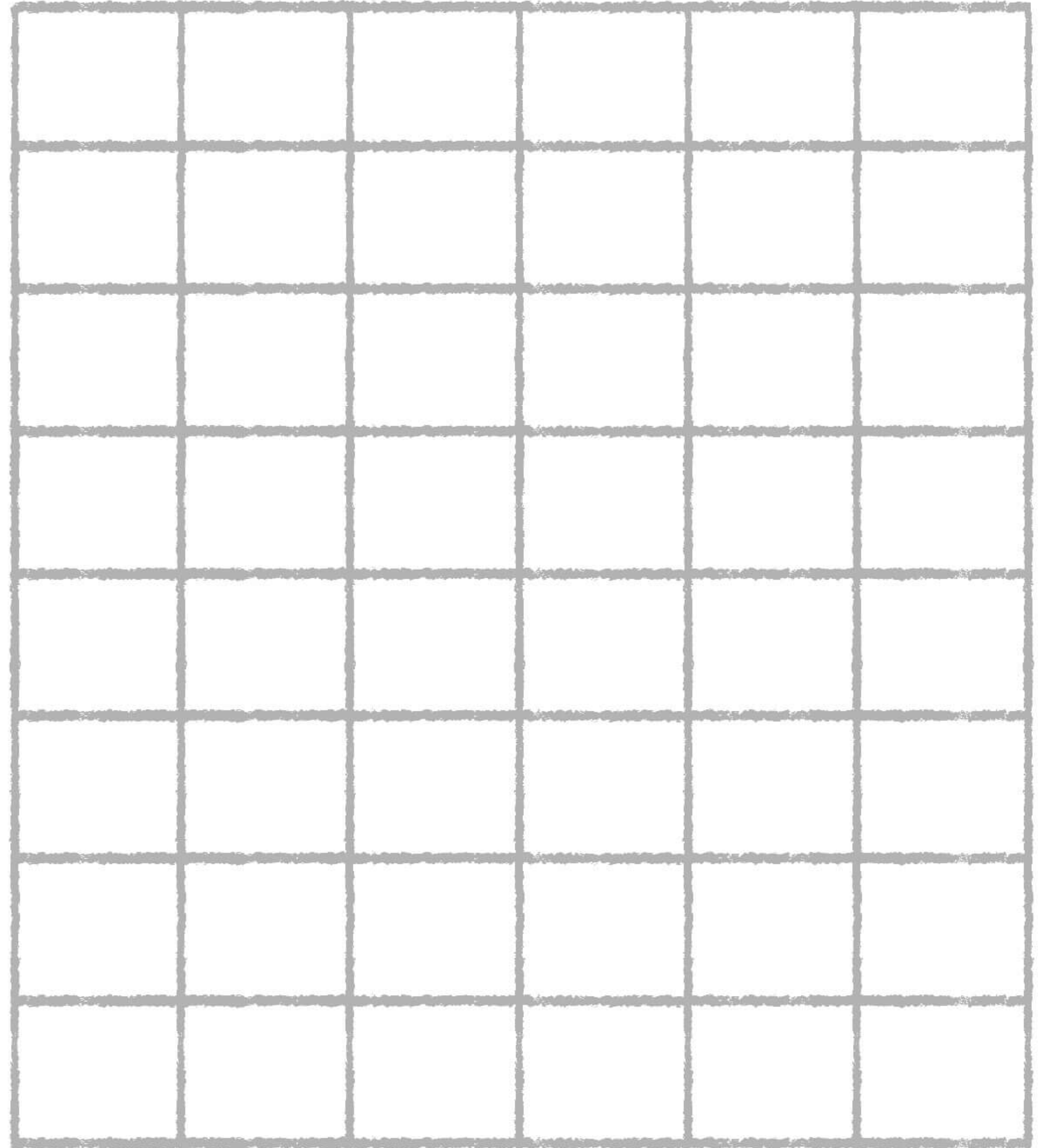
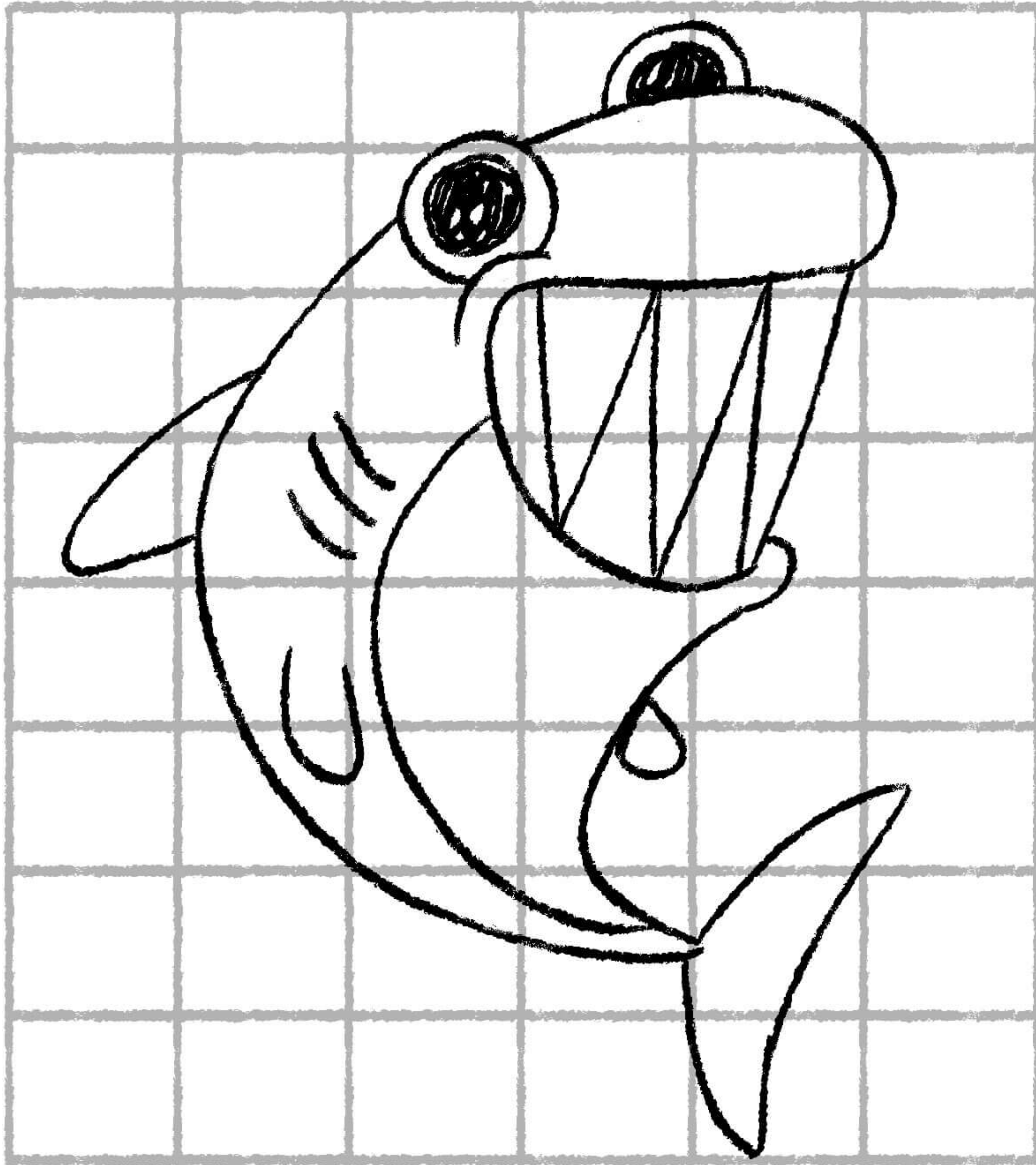
Think of the number 3 while adding the toes.

Use the grid to copy the shark drawing.

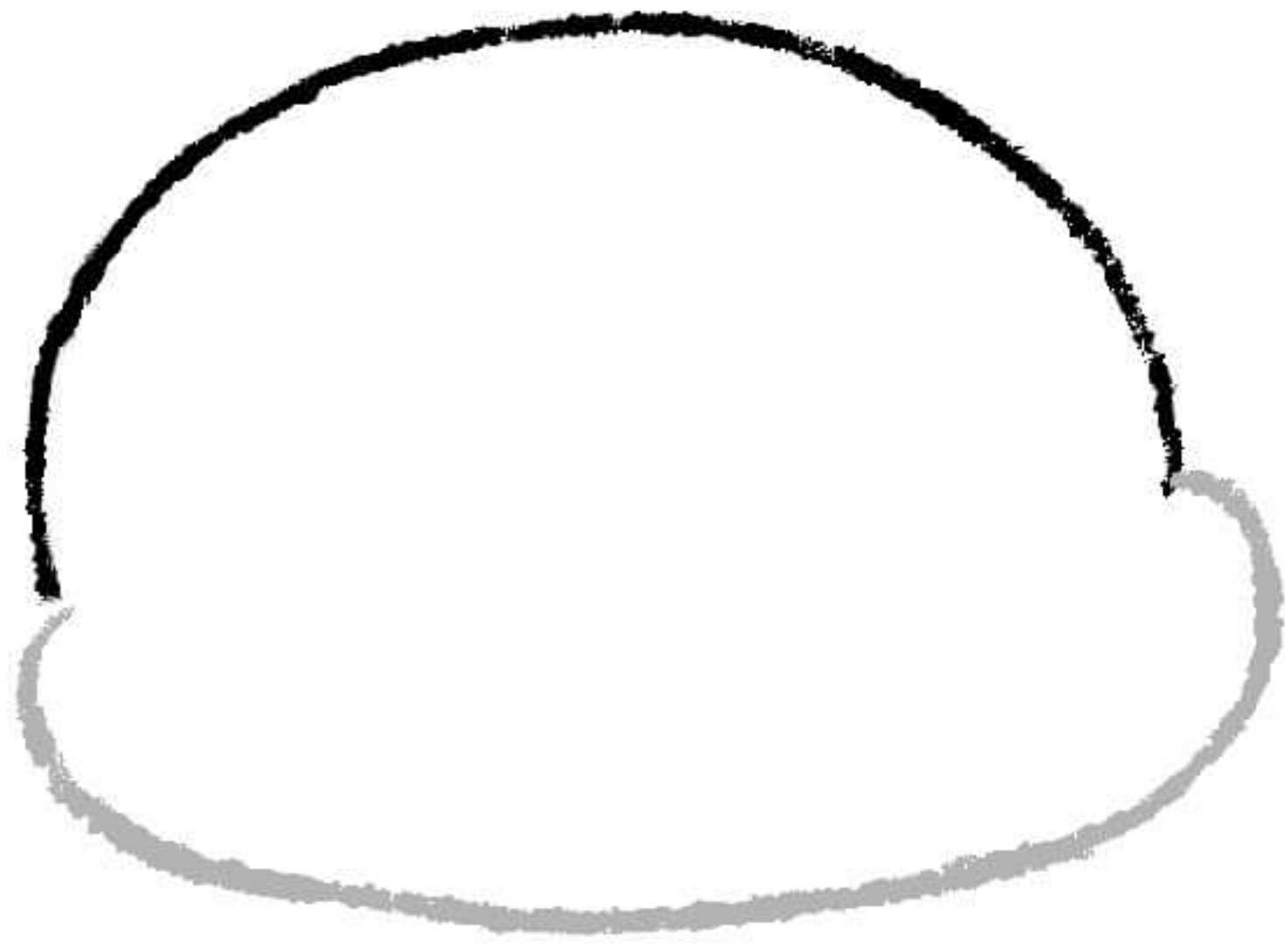
Sharks can sense the presence of blood in the water.

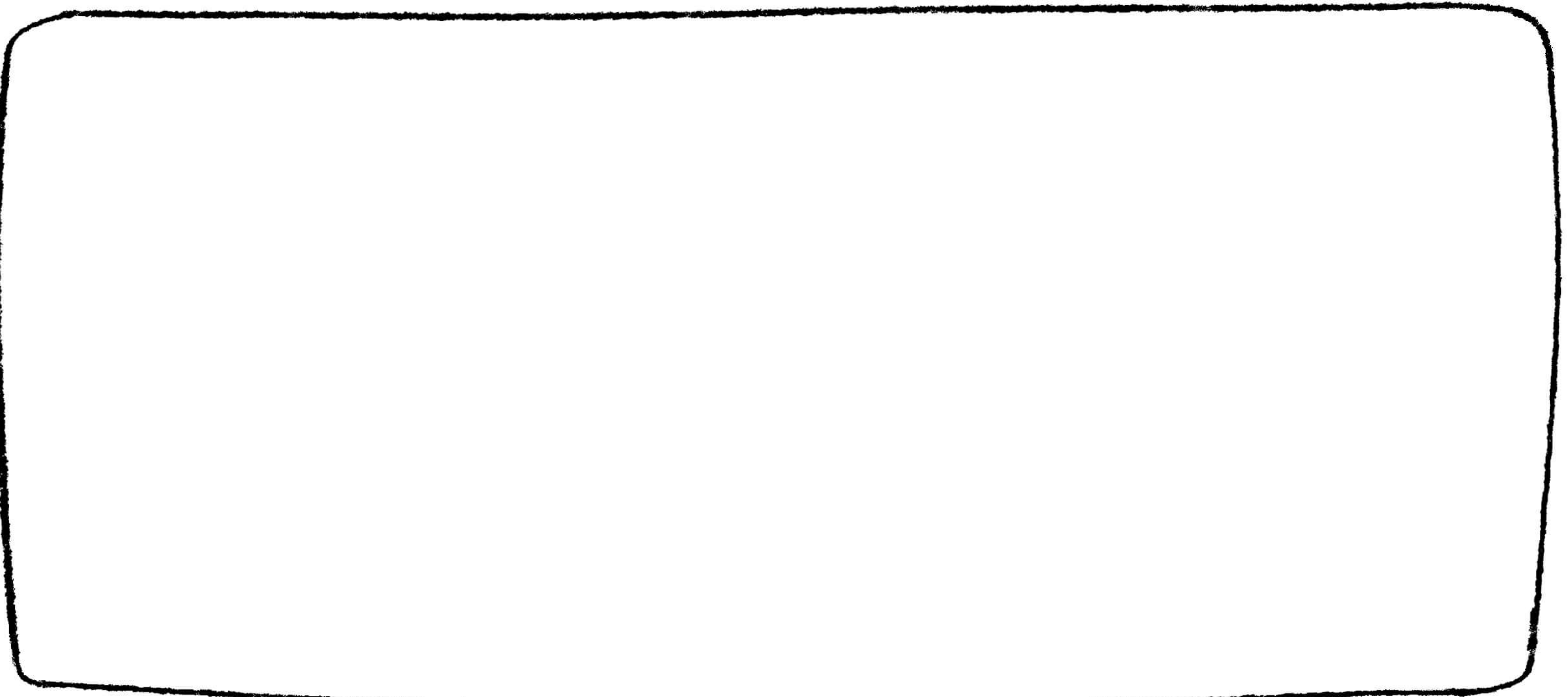
