

Cleaning Instructions

The metal may be wiped with a dry microfiber cloth. A small amount of lemon oil, applied then removed completely, can restore a shine. To clean glass, spray a microfiber cloth with a 1:1 mixture of vinegar and water. Wipe down glass and repeat if needed. Remove any streaks using a dry microfiber cloth. The cord may be wiped with a dry cloth.

Ontologia

The metal may be cleaned with a dry microfiber cloth. For a patina finish, a small amount of lemon oil, applied then removed completely, can restore a shine. To clean glass, spray a microfiber cloth with a 1:1 mixture of vinegar and water. Wipe down glass and repeat if needed. Remove any streaks using a dry microfiber cloth. The cord may be wiped with a dry cloth.

Taku

For best results, clean when the light is turned off and the glass shade is at room temperature. Spray a microfiber cloth with a 1:1 mixture of vinegar and water. Wipe down glass and repeat if needed. Remove any streaks using a dry microfiber cloth. The metal may be cleaned with warm, soapy water and a microfiber cloth.

Foliole & Bruma

To properly clean without damaging the wood, it's best to follow the assembly instructions and take apart before cleaning. To clean glass, spray a microfiber cloth with a 1:1 mixture of vinegar and water. Wipe down glass and repeat if needed. Remove any streaks using a dry microfiber cloth. To clean wood, use a cloth dampened lightly with water. The cord may be wiped with a dry cloth. Avoid getting cleaner or moisture on the cord.

Celeste & Neena

For best results, clean when the light is turned off and the glass shade is at room temperature. Spray a microfiber cloth with a 1:1 mixture of vinegar and water. Wipe down glass and repeat if needed. Remove any streaks using a dry microfiber cloth. The cord may be wiped with a dry cloth. Avoid getting cleaner or moisture on the cord.

Parallel & Halo

For best results, clean when the light is turned off and the glass shade is at room temperature. Remove the bulb and spray a microfiber cloth with a 1:1 mixture of vinegar and water. Wipe down glass and repeat if needed. Remove any streaks using a dry microfiber cloth.
