▲ WARNING: CHOKING HAZARD

Adult assembly required because of small parts. Keep assembly parts out of reach of children under 3 years.

WARNING: Please follow all of these instructions to ensure the safety of your child.

Keep these instructions for future reference.

WARNING: Failure to follow these instructions could result in serious injury or death.

- Avoid serious injury from falling or sliding out. ALWAYS insure that the child is properly positioned by using the safety harness according to these instructions. ONLY children who have developed enough upper body control to sit without leaning forward can use the front seat in the upright position.
- NEVER leave children unattended.

WARNING: CHOKING HAZARD Adult assembly required because of small parts.

Keep (assembly parts) out of reach of children under 3 years.

CAUTION: Purses, shopping bags, parcels, diaper bags or accessory items may change the balance of the stroller and cause hazardous unstable conditions.

TO PREVENT INJURY

- Never leave the stroller on a sloping surface with the child it, even if the brake is activated.
- Do not allow children to stand on the seat or footrest.
- Do not lift and carry the stroller when the child is seated. The stroller may slip or the guard rail may come off.
- Always apply the brakes whenever the stroller is stationary.
- · Make sure all body parts are clear of the stroller when folding and unfolding.
- The maximum weight that can be carried in the lower basket, and child tray, each is 4.4 lbs (~2 kg). Excessive weight may cause a hazardous unstable condition to exist.
- Before allowing the children near the stroller, be certain the stroller is fully erect and latched in the open locked position.
- Use of the **stroller** with children weighing more than 35 pounds (15.87 kg) or over 42 inches (106.7 cm) tall, may cause a hazardous unstable condition to the stroller.
- Use of the carriage with chilren weighing more than 15 pounds (6.80 kg) may cause a hazardous unstable condition to the stroller
- NEVER use the stroller on stairways or escalators.
- NEVER allow your stroller to be used as a toy.
- NEVER use the stroller in conjunction with bicycles, skateboards, roller skates, or in-line skates.
- · We recommend that the child occupant needs to be 6 months of age, at the minimum, before use of the stroller.

WHEN USED IN THE INFANT CARRIER MODE

SUFFOCATION HAZARD: Infant carrier can roll over on soft surfaces and suffocate child.

Never place carrier on beds, sofas, or other soft surfaces.

STRANGULATION HAZARD: Children have strangled in loose or partially buckled harness traps.

Fully restrain the child at all times.

FALL HAZARD: Child's activity can move the carrier.

- Never Place Carrier on counter tops, tables, or any other elevated surface.
- Never use this carrier as a means to transport an infant in a motor vehicle.

GARE AND MAINTENAN

- To clean the plastic parts on stroller use a mild cleaning solution with warm water on a sponge or damp cloth. Hand wash fabric with damp cloth and air dry. Do not use bleach.
- To keep your stroller wheels from squeaking, use silicone or graphite based lubricant.
- Check your stroller for loose screws, worn parts, torn material or stitching on a regular basis. Replace or repair parts as needed, discontinue use of stroller if it should become damaged or malfunctions.
- Strong sun exposure may cause aging and color fading.





ASSEMBLY

Remove stroller from box. The front wheels, rear wheels, reversible handle, and child tray need to be installed prior to use.










OPENING THE FRAME

- **To open the frame:** Unhook the latch, located on the right hand side of the stroller frame (Fig. 1)
- Lift the handlebar up until stroller frame locks into place (Fig. 1A)











INSTALLING THE REAR WHEELS

- To install the rear wheels, Insert the axle through each rear wheel, with the axle going through the break cluster on the wheel first (Fig. 2).
- (1) Fix the smallest locking cap at the end of the axle to lock the wheel on, then (2) repeat with a washer, and then (3) the hub cap. Repeat this for both wheels, ensuring both sides are securely locked in place. (Fig. 2A).
- Once the wheels are fixed onto the axle, place the axle onto stroller frame by aligning and pushing up until you hear a 'CLICK' on both sides (Fig. 2B).
- To remove the rear wheel axle, push both release pins in, and pull away until the axle is clear of the stroller frame (Fig. 2C).



INSTALLING & REMOVING THE FRONT WHEELS


- To install front wheels, Push each front wheel onto the front wheel bayonet until you hear a 'CLICK'. Ensure it is securely attached to the stroller before use. (Fig. 3)
- To remove the front wheels, locate the release button which can be found at the top of the wheel bayonet, on the inner side. Push the button in firmly and the wheel will disengage (Fig. 3A).



INSTALLING & REMOVING CHILD BAR

- **To install child bar:** Align the child bar with the fitting on the frame and push inwards until you hear a 'CLICK'. Child bar is properly inserted when safety release buttons are in the raised position (Fig. 4).
- **To remove child bar:** Push in safety release buttons on both sides and pull the child bar away from stroller frame (Fig. 4A).

ASSEMBLY






- To prepare seat unit: Locate the support bar attached to the bottom of seat unit and lift so that the bar is vertical. (Fig. 5).
- Align and wrap button straps around support bar (Fig. 5A, Fig. 5B).
- Clip together and repeat for the other side (Fig. 5C).
- **To undo seat unit:** Unclip buttons from support bar and return to flat position.

ATTACHING SEAT UNIT TO FRAME

- **To install seat unit**, align the seat unit with the corresponding holders on the stroller frame in preferred orientation; facing parent, or facing away from parent (Fig. 6).
- Push the seat unit downwards until both sides 'CLICK'. Ensure that the seat is securely fastened before use (Fig. 6A). **To remove seat unit**, press the release buttons on both sides of the
- stroller frame and lift the seat upwards. (Fig. 6B).





- **To install canopy**, Align the canopy clip with the stroller frame (Fig. 7). Press onto frame until you hear a "CLICK". Repeat for other side (Fig. 7A). Attach top of canopy to Velcro to secure (Fig. 7B).

- Align zipper with frame, and clip buttons on both sides (Fig. 7C) **To remove canopy,** undo buttons and zipper, then pull clip away from stroller frame on both sides (Fig. 7D)

SECURING CHILD

Before Placing your Child in Stroller:

Close Canopy. Press both brake pedals down until they "click" into the locked position.


Make sure the brake pedals are pressed down completely.

Always set both brake pedals when parking the stroller.




Securing Child


- Place your child in the stroller. Position the crotch belt between your child's legs.
- Pull shoulder straps over child's arm and shoulder and fasten both strap ends to the restraint system.
- Fasten **both** waist belts to the buckle on each side of the crotch belt. Make sure you hear a "**click**" on both sides.
- Check to be sure the restraint system is securely attached by pulling it away from your child. The restraint system should remain attached.



• Tighten each waist belt and shoulder strap so that the restraint system is snug against your child.

Please refer to the next section for instructions to tighten the waist belts.






To tighten the waist belts and shoulder straps:

- Feed the anchored end of a waist belt up through the buckle to form a loop (A). Pull the free end of the waist belt (B).
- Repeat this procedure to tighten the other waist belt.
- Feed the top end of the shoulder strap through the plastic stay to form a loop **G**. Pull the bottom end down to tighten the strap **D**.
- Repeat this procedure to tighten the other shoulder strap.

To loosen the waist belts and shoulder straps:

- Feed the free end of the waist belt up through the buckle to form a loop 4. Enlarge the loop by pulling on the end of the loop toward the buckle. Pull the anchored end of the waist belt to shorten the free end of the waist belt 4.
- Repeat this procedure to loosen the other waist belt.
- Feed the bottom end of the shoulder strap through the plastic stay to form a loop **©**. Pull the top end up to loosen the strap **D**.
- Repeat this procedure to loosen the other shoulder strap.


Please note: After adjusting the restraint system to fit your child, make sure you pull on it to be sure it is securely fastened.




CONVERTING STROLLER TO CARRIAGE

To use the seat in carriage mode:

- Adjust seat angle by pressing safety release button and angling flat. Make sure safety release buttons are in raised position before continuing (Fig. 1).
- Unbuckle straps located at the bottom of the seat unit (Fig. 1A).
- Adjust seat recline to fully reclined position by squeezing clips and adjusting down (Fig. 1B).
- Push the fabric downwards from the inside to ensure carriage lies flat (Fig. 1C).










CONVERTING CARRIAGE TO STROLLER


To use the seat in stroller mode:

- Re buckle straps located at the bottom of the seat unit (Fig. 2).
- Adjust seat angle by pressing safety release button and angling full or half incline. Make sure safety release buttons are in raised position before continuing (Fig. 2A).
- Adjust seat recline to upright position by squeezing clip and adjusting up (Fig. 2B).
- Ensure that all fabrics and buckles are secure before use.




USING THE REAR WHEEL BRAKES

- To engage brakes, apply a light downward pressure to the brake lever on both sides. Ensure that the brakes have been applied correctly and that the stroller will not move (Fig. 3).
- **To release brakes**, gently lift up the brake levers (Fig. 3A).




USING THE FRONT SWIVEL WHEEL LOCKS

- **To engage the lock**, pull the lever located at the rear of the front wheel inwards towards the frame (Fig. 4).
- **To release the lock**, pull the lever outwards. Note that each wheel will require the lever to be pulled in the opposite direction (Fig. 4A)




USING THE SEAT INCLINE & RECLINE

- To adjust seat incline & recline: Locate and squeeze the clip located at the back of the seat unit (Fig. 5).
- While squeezing clip pull up or down to set desired seat incline or recline (Fig. 5A).
- Please note that the fully upright positions should only be used for a child over 6 months old.



ADJUSTING SEAT ANGLE

- To adjust seat angle: Press and hold safety release buttons located at the center of stroller frame (Fig. 6).
- While safety release buttons are held, adjust angle to one of 3 positions flat, half incline, and full incline (Fig. 6A).
- Make sure safety buttons are in raised position before use.
- Please note that the fully upright positions should only be used for a child over 6 months old.



FOLDING STROLLER & CARRIAGE

- If in carriage mode make sure to unbuckle straps before continuing (Fig. 7).
- If in carriage mode make sure to set to full incline before continuing (Fig. 7A).
- Make sure both brake pedals are engaged before continuing (Fig. 7B).
- Make sure canopy is closed before continuing (Fig. 7C).
- **Begin fold** by pressing the folding lock located at the top of the handle-bar with your thumb, while squeezing the folding button located at the bottom of the handlebar (Fig. 7D).
- Once the stroller begins to fold, release the folding button and allow to fully collapse (Fig. 7E).
- Secure the stroller in the folded position by ensuring the latch is fastened on the knob (Fig. 7F).
