

# 10 BEST WAGON STROLLERS THAT WILL HAVE YOUR KIDS RIDING IN STYLE

If you've ever tried to push your kids across a beach or ball field in a traditional stroller, you know how big of a pain it is. Add in a few bags of *stuff*, and it quickly becomes an impossible task.

Enter the wagon stroller. It's a fairly new concept that's been gaining traction for the past year or two, and thankfully, they've only gotten better since their first inception. There are now a decent number of wagon strollers on the market, but it's important to know which features you should look for before you invest in one.

Stroller wagons (or wagon strollers, whichever you prefer) are a genius portmanteau of wagon and stroller. They offer comfy seating with belts and cushioning, as well as plenty of room to store your things. The great thing is that not only are they all double (or more) strollers — they're also equipped with the ability to glide over rough terrain without any problem, thanks to the fact that they can either be pushed or pulled. You'll find that it's easier to pull the wagon stroller over beach sand or up hills than it is to try and push a traditional stroller. Some wagon strollers even have footwells, adding an additional layer of comfort.

# WHAT TO CONSIDER

With wagon strollers, there's a pretty wide variety of choices available, at a ton of price points. The main differences will be among seat styles, canopy styles, wheels, handles, load limits, and how much they cost. Stroller wagons with all the bells and whistles are not cheap, typically running upwards of \$400. They're perfect for vacations, parks, camping, and activities where you'll be hobbling over multiple types of terrains. They're also especially great for boardwalk strolling. So, while their steep price tags might freak you out, we assure you they're worth it if your family is one for adventure.

The higher-end stroller wagons generally have rubber wheels and more durable fabrics. They typically have extra storage space and tons of cup holders. Sometimes, they even have a bar across the center for your kids to stash their cups and snacks. Their canopies are UPF-rated, which indicates how much UV radiation transmits through a piece of fabric, and they're usually fairly easy to open. Many of them even have car seat adapters, so you can put your baby on one side and your toddler on the other — making them ideal for growing families.

Less expensive stroller wagons might still have many of these features, but the materials won't be as plush, and they generally don't have the same durability or amount of storage.

The strollers on this list were selected because they represent a range of prices and styles. They're all highly rated, durable in relation to their cost, and very convenient. I have personally tried several wagon strollers on this list, and I can honestly say that they're a game-changing innovation that's genuinely worth the investment.
