HOW TO MEASURE YOUR RING SIZE

Measure your own ring

Take a well-fitting ring and measure the diameter of the inside of your ring. This is your ring size. For example: Size 18 corresponds with a diameter of 18 mm.



OR Measure your finger to determine your ring size

Use a measuring tape to measure the circumference of your finger. If you don't have a measuring tape, use a piece of paper or string, no thicker than 0.5 mm. Mark where the paper overlaps and measure the length of the paper / string with a ruler.

This is the **circumference** of your finger. Pull it as tight as you would like the ring to be. If your ring is between two sizes we advise to size up.

Extra Tips to measure your ring size

Do not measure your fingers when they are cold, they will be smaller.

It is also not convenient to measure your finger on a very hot summer day

If your knuckles are very large, it is best to choose a larger size.

Measure your fingers at the end of the day.

Please note the ring size of each hand can be different.

If the ring has a stone, it is important to measure the size as exact as possible otherwise the ring will turn.
