I didn't have the desire to read the Bible for myself-I had great teachers who could explain these Biblical facts for me and I was covered by grace after all. Doesn't that mean I can sin as many times as I want and just ask for forgiveness before I die to gain access to my eternal mansion? Looking back, I will admit I

When Yahuah began revealing Himself to me through His Word, I kept coming back to this word... 'repentance'. I became obsessed. I spent more time in the Bible seeking out the truth and meaning of 'repentance' than any other thing I had ever studied—at least willingly. It became clear to me that there was a huge flaw in my foundational understanding of this belief system I held. A broken compass. A faulty vestibular system. A hairline fracture in the scaffolding which supported the leaning structure of my wavering faith. As I looked at repentance, I couldn't help but also look at sin; realizing there was a

somewhat tragic connection between the two—like bondage and freedom.

refused and said to his master's wife, "Behold, because of me my master has no concern about anything in the house, and he has put everything that he has in my charge. He is not greater in this house than I am, nor has he kept back anything from me except you, because you are his wife. How then can I do this great wickedness and sin against Elohai? Bere'shiyth 39:7-9 Joseph knew it was a sin **against His El** to lay with his master's wife-before Torah was written. And [Aaron] received the gold from their hand and fashioned it with a graving tool and made a golden calf. And they said, "These are your elohiym, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt! [...] The next day Moses said to the people, "You have sinned a <mark>great sin</mark>. And now I will go up to Yahuah; <mark>perhaps I can make atonement for your **sin**." So</mark> Moses returned to Yahuah and said, "Alas, this people has sinned a great sin. They have made for themselves elohiym of gold. Shemoth 32:4, 30-31 Moses interceded for Israel for their great sin against Yahuah; creating a golden cow and worshiping it as though it was Yahuah-the very El which delivered them from Egypt. Let us lie down in our shame, and let our dishonor cover us. For we have sinned against <mark>Yahuah Eloheinu,</mark> we and our fathers, from our youth even to this day, and we have <mark>not</mark> obeyed the voice of Yahuah Eloheinu. Yirmeyahu 3:25 Noticing a pattern? I left a hint in bold at the end of the passage from Jeremiah. We can further analyze this term of sin *and* the New Testament writers' understanding of sin by using the Septuagint; the Hebrew Old Testament translated into Greek.

This word *hātā'* is translated 188 times in the Old Testament as 'sin'.

does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Yahusha Ha'Mashiach the righteous. 1 Yochanon 2:1 Reading what this meant to the writers of Scripture while under the inspiration of Yahuah Himself, we see that 'to sin' was actually to 'wander from the ancient path (or way) of righteousness'. So what is this elusive 'way'? For this holy order came not by man nor the will of man, neither by father nor mother, neither by beginning of days nor end of years, but <mark>of Elohiym</mark>. 4. For it <mark>was established **in**</mark> <mark>the beginning</mark> of the earth by the Ancients of days, <mark>wherefore it is called the Order of the</mark> <mark>Ancients</mark>, and it was delivered unto men from the beginning <mark>by the calling of Elohiym's own</mark> <mark>voice according to His own will</mark> through the voice of His Priesthood, unto as many as believed on His name and were faithful until they had obtained. The Writings of Abraham 98:3-4 This isn't the only passage from Abraham's Writings informing us that Yahuah's Way existed before Yahusha was born and before Torah took written format. Fascinatingly, this only confirms what Yochanon wrote about exhaustively: sin

Everyone who makes a practice of sinning also practices lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. You know that Yahusha appeared in order to take away sins, and in Him there is no sin. No one who abides in Him keeps on sinning; no one who keeps on sinning has either seen Him or known Him. Little children, let no one deceive you. Whoever practices righteousness is righteous, as He is righteous. Whoever makes a practice of sinning is of the devil, for the devil has been sinning from the beginning. The reason the Son of Yahuah appeared was to destroy the works of the devil. No one born of Yahuah makes a practice of sinning, for Yahuah's seed abides in him; and he cannot keep on sinning, because he

has been born of Yahuah. By this it is evident who are the children of Yahuah, and who are the children of the devil: whoever does not practice righteousness is not of Yahuah, nor is

Whoever says "I know Yahusha" but does not guard His commandments is a liar, and the truth is **not in him**, but whoever guards His word, **in** *him* **truly the love of Yahuah is** perfected. By this we may **know** that we are in Yahusha: whoever says he abides in Him ought to walk in the same way in which He walked. Beloved, I am writing you no new commandment, but an old commandment that you had from the beginning. The old <mark>commandment is the word</mark> that you have heard. At the same time, it *i*s a new commandment that I am writing to you, which is true in Him and in you, because the

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with El, and the Word was El. [...] And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the

IN CLOSING

The teaching, instruction, and direction (tôrâ/nomos) was **given** by Yahusha as The Word of Yahuah; first to Adam and Eve. He then exemplified how to follow His Way through Himself as The Word made flesh and now He - as The Word, is being written on our hearts

by the Ruach Ha'Qodesh as we spend more time abiding in Him.

Analyzing the context given through studying these passages using the Greek, we can determine that Yahusha is saying:

"I have not come to abolish the Torah or the Prophets, but to obey them as they should be, and bring Torah to its fullness. Listen, until Heaven and earth perish, not even the smallest syllable will perish from Torah. Because of all this, anyone who does away with the smallest commandment and instructs others to do the same will be called the smallest in the Kingdom of Heaven. But whoever keeps Torah, celebrates the righteousness brought by

doing so rightly and instructs others to do the same; he will be called virtuous and capable in the Kingdom of Heaven and to him will be given authority."
