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Anthea has always had a passion for the environment, studying Zoology and training as a SCUBA diving instructor. In 2016, having a child confronted her with the disconnect between her actions and her household's environmental impact. She began to reduce waste where possible and in 2018 set up her environmentally focused education business, Remix Plastic.

Remix Plastic reached over 500,000 people when Jacinda Ardern wore a pair of their recycled plastic Huia feather earrings. Breaking into a mainstream market with a sustainable product provided her an opportunity to educate consumers on environmental issues.

Helen Townsend

After living in Nepal and witnessing how much plastic ends up in their rivers, Helen realised that in NZ we produce so much more rubbish but because it's collected every two weeks we never have to confront how much we produce.

In response to this Helen founded The Rubbish Whisperer in 2013 - one of the first companies in NZ to provide easy alternatives to single-use plastics. Helen and her team of 17 manufactured enough reusable produce bags to replace over 30 million plastic bags, pioneered eco-friendly school fundraising and spearheaded the paper straws on request campaign. Helen advises businesses and organisations on sustainability, business development and circular economy.



Award-winning Christchurch women entrepreneurs launch EcoSplat Reusable Water Balloons; a new spin on an old favourite.

Imagine a summer filled with endless water fights. Water fights that are self-perpetuating allowing you to sit back, relax and let the kids run around for hours. All you need is a bucket of water; no messing with the taps all day, no arguing about who is going to pick up all the rubbish. Just pure summer fun.

Then, imagine if those water fights were environment and ocean-friendly. No pieces of rubbish strewn on the lawn waiting to get chewed up by the lawnmower or ingested by the dog. No finding rubbish in your veggie patch for years afterwards and no litter down the drain to the sea. Guilt free.

This is the exciting concept behind EcoSplat Reusable Water Balloons; a new, Kiwi-designed eco-friendly water toy born out of frustration at the lack of genuine green options for family fun. Founded by two Christchurch women stemming from award-winning businesses, The Rubbish Whisperer and Remix Plastic, EcoSplat originated from a joint vision to put the concept of climate-friendly fun into practice.

"We don't want our kids to use disposable water balloons, but we also don't want them to miss out on the classic Kiwi water fight experience," says Helen Townsend, co-founder of EcoSplat.

"Our reusable water balloons provide a way to embed sustainability into the lives of our tamariki," says Anthea Madill, director of Remix Plastic and co-founder of EcoSplat. "In a time of massive global climate issues, parents are wanting tangible and accessible solutions and to live by example."

Through her project Remix Plastic, Madill has been raising awareness of the environmental impact of plastics by actively promoting alternatives and selling recycled plastic accessories such as the huia feather earrings worn by RT Hon. Jacinda Ardern in 2020.

Townsend set up The Rubbish Whisperer to provide plastic-free options for households and school fundraising. When she started 8 years ago, she had to explain why single-use was bad for the planet and why people may want to consider reusables. "We are past the point of raising awareness of the issues, we now need to empower people to take action, and part of that is providing solutions."

EcoSplat is a modernisation of children's play. It shows kids that they don't have to compartmentalise their lives into 'sustainability' versus 'things I want to do'.

"The exciting part about environmental solutions is taking a problem and redesigning it to better suit the current context," says Madill. "Not everything has to continue on its current trajectory, we need to step back from our norms, have a think and take action to make changes. And this can be as simple and fun as having an endless ocean-friendly water fight!"
