Don't panic! These are the first two blocks in the Sew-along. We will not be piecing the blocks in numerical order. We have organized the blocks by the things they have in common—tools, techniques, design grid, etc. And we'll be sprinkling in surprises!

Today is a two-in-one day—two quick and easy blocks in one sitting.

## 12 Becky

The From Marti Michell 6½" square Truing Up Ruler is perfect for Becky and you will love it for checking the size on all of your finished blocks. Pick 4 fabrics; fabric 1 has the biggest pieces and fabric 4, the smallest. The cutting measurements are in a PDF on the CD in the back of the book; refer to the PDF to fill in the blanks in the chart below and start cutting.

Assemble in vertical rows as shown in book. Press rows in the same direction, then join the rows. Press the pieced row on the outside of the block toward the center row to distribute the bulk of the seam allowances.

## 16 Bonnie

To make the Bonnie block, cut the pieces using From MARTI MICHELL Template Set A, Product #8251, and, if you have it, our Log Cabin Ruler #8037. Cut on the side of the ruler for 1½" finished strip width, or use a regular ruler and refer to the "Rotary Cutting" PDF on the CD.

Observe grainline arrows on templates when cutting.

Assemble as shown in the book, pressing the seam allowances so they oppose each other.
