

Observe grainline arrows on templates when cutting.

Put those fabrics that are going to be sewn together right sides together before cutting strips. Cut triangles from the strips in the quantities indicated in the book. Do not separate the triangles; they are ready for sewing.

NOTE: Pressing is suggested based on Marti's block. You may have to press your block differently, depending on your fabric selections.


- 1. Join pairs of A-4 large triangles on the legs. Press seam allowances toward the darker color (blue).
- 2. Join the units made in step 1; the seam allowances should butt against each other for perfect matching. Swirl press the center to distribute the bulk, in the same direction that the pairs were pressed (for my block, that was counter-clockwise).



3. Join the A-6 small triangles on the hypotenuse (long side) to make half-square triangle units. Press seam allowances toward the color that is in all 8 pairs (pink in the book diagram).

4. Arrange and join the units made in step 3 to make 2 Pinwheel units. Swirl press the center where the 8 seam allowances meet in the same direction as you pressed the units made in step 2.

5. Arrange and join the units into 2 rows as shown in the book. Then join the rows. Swirl press the center in the opposite direction from the previous units.
