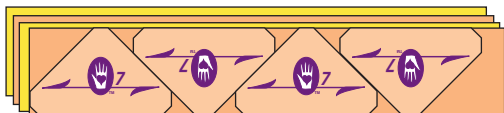

Observe grainline arrows on templates when cutting.

Mirror Image Alert!

- To cut and piece the 1D pieces, put your two chosen fabrics right sides together and cut 2 strip sets $1\frac{1}{4}$ " wide x 7" long (7" on the lengthwise grain.)

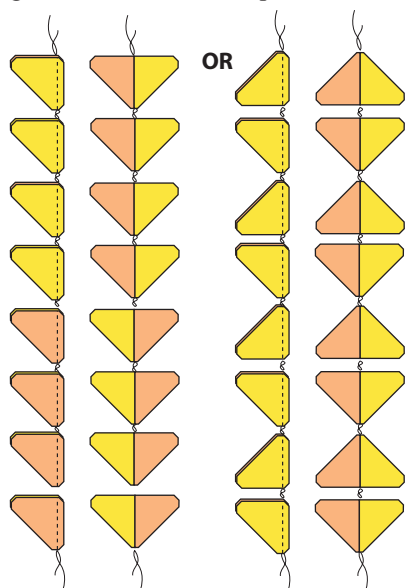
Illustrated to show 4 layers; stack them evenly.



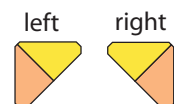
Cut 4 stacks. Total: 16 triangles

Stack the strips so you have 4 layers of fabric. Position template A-7 on the strips as shown and cut 4 sets of triangles, rotating the A-7 template down the strip. Trim all the corners. Do not separate, the pieces are ready to sew edge to edge along one leg, not on the long edge!

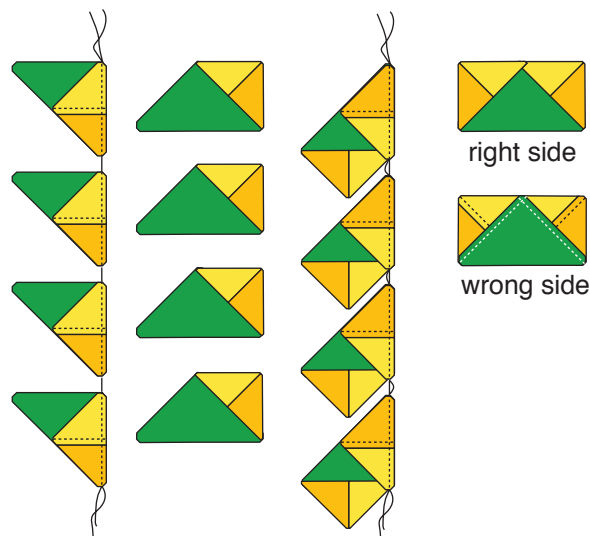
- When sewn together, the triangle pairs need to be mirror image units. You can either sew 4 pairs with fabric A on top and four pairs with fabric B on top in the same orientation OR matching fabric on top and 4 leading into the needle with square corner and 4 leading into the needle with a point.



- Press seams open. Use template A-6 to confirm accurate size; the pieced triangles should be exactly that size. Separate into right and left triangles.



- Add pieced triangles to the A-4 triangles to make 4 Flying Geese units.



- Join units from step 4 with cut squares to make horizontal rows. Press toward squares.
- Join rows to complete the block as shown in the book. Press seams open.
