## From MARTI MICHELL Perfect Patchwork Templates Conversion Chart

For personal use in conjunction with the book



Jewel is not From MARTI MICHELL template friendly, but it is easy to machine or hand piece. Use the paper templates in the book to rotary cut the pieces. I cut them with a little extra paper (rough cut) and then aligned the 1/4" line on an acrylic ruler on the pattern cutting line and cut against the ruler with a rotary cutter to get fabric pieces that include the seam allowance.

### Mirror Image Alert!

1. 46B and 46C pieces are mirror image pieces. Cut them in pairs from fabric that is folded wrong sides together using pattern piece 46B. Identify the edge that will be on the outside of the block and put it on the straight lengthwise grain. Separate into 2 piles. The first fabric right side up is piece 46B, the matching fabric wrong side up is piece 46C, etc.
2. Cut 46A with the long edge on straight grain.
3. Cut 46D so the square corners that meet in the center are on straight grain.
4. Piece as shown in the book. All seams will be sewn edge-to-edge. Press so you will have opposing seams as you join the sections.
