## From Marti Michell Perfect Patchwork Templates Conversion Chart

For personal use in conjunction with the book and these From Marti Michell Tools: Perfect Patchwork Template Set S, Product #8166

Georgia Template	37A	37B
is the same as FMM Set S Template	S-99	S-100

Observe grainline arrows on templates when cutting.

Our finished block looks the same but is more easily constructed in 3 rows rather than 5 and several seams were eliminated. Also, by using this technique, directional fabrics can easily be arranged so that all the pieces go in the same direction.

## **Cutting**

Use template S-98 to measure strip width and cut strips the Marti Way. After cutting the strips, fold them in half so the short ends meet.

1. Cut a strip of fabric 1 (going from the top to the bottom of the list in the book) 14" long. Fold and cut 4 pairs of S-99 squares (total 8).



**2.** Cut a 23" strip of fabric 2. Cut 1 square S-99. Fold the strip and cut 2 pairs of S-99 squares (total 5) and 2 pairs of S-98a trapezoids (total 4).



Do not separate remaining strips.

## **MIRROR IMAGE ALERT!**

Cut first pair of S-98a trapezoids.



Rotate remaining fabric; do not separate. Cut second pair.




**3.** Cut a 14" strip of fabric 3. Cut 2 pairs of S-99 squares and 2 pairs of S-100 triangles (total 4 each shape).




## **Making the Block**


1. Chain piece 4 pairs of squares of fabrics 1 and 2, followed by 4 pairs of fabrics 1 and 3. You will have 1 fabric 2 square left.



2. Chain piece S-100 triangles to the trapezoids.



3. Join units as needed to make 4 of the 4-patches shown below.



**4.** Arrange the sewn units and the remaining square to match the block as shown in the book. Assemble into 3 rows. Join the rows to complete the block.
