Observe grainline arrows on templates when cutting.

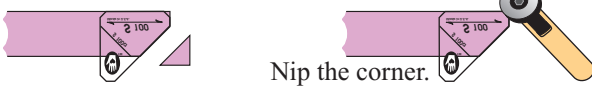
Please note, in our printing of the pattern on the CD that accompanies the book, there were discrepancies between the two types of patterns. These are the measurements and templates we used to make a 6" finished block.

Cutting the S-100a Triangles

Use Template S-100 with the hypotenuse on straight grain, as shown, to cut the S-100a triangles.

1. Measure the strip width by aligning the printed corner of S-100a with the cut edge of the fabric.

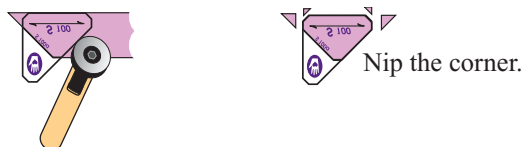
2. Working on a small mat and rotating it as needed, place template S-100 on the strip as shown, with words reading backwards. Cut the first angle.



3. Rotate the mat. Flip the template right side up. Align the template with the bottom of the strip and the guideline for S-100a on the diagonal end of the strip. Cut the second angle to release the triangle from the strip.

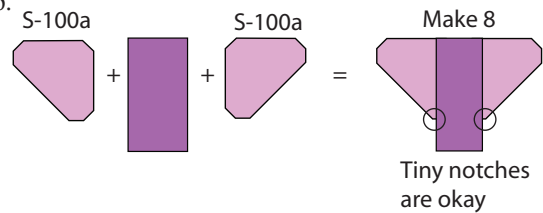


4. Flip the template so it's wrong-reading again. Align it with 100a guideline and the top of the strip. Cut the next triangle. Continue flipping the template and rotating the mat as needed to cut all the S-100a triangles.

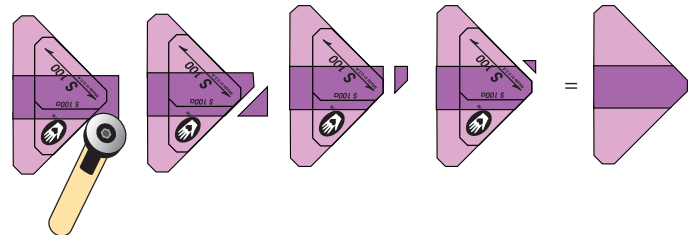


Making the Block

1. Join S-100a triangles to the long sides of the scant 1 1/2" x 2" strips, as shown below. Press the seam allowances toward the strip.



2. Rotate and trim each of the units made in step 1 using any right triangle template, as shown with S-100.

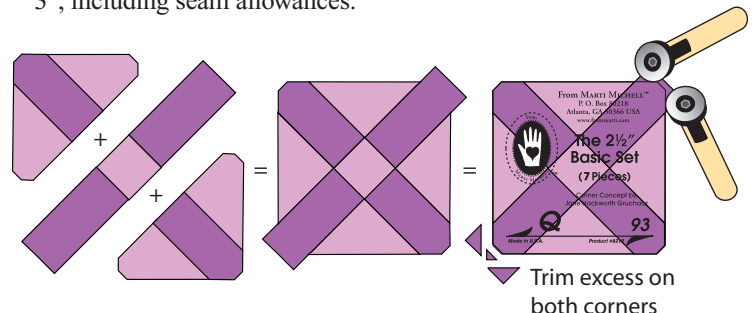


3. Join scant 1 1/2" x 2" strips to 2 opposite sides of the scant 1 1/2" square. Make 4. Press toward the strips.



4. Join 2 of the sections made in step 2 on opposite sides of 1 pieced strip made in step 3. Press open. Make 4.

5. True up the diagonal center rows of the 4 square units using template Q-93, as shown below. Or you can true up with the 6 1/2" Squaring Up Ruler and then align template S-100 on each corner to nip off the points. The pieced squares should measure 3", including seam allowances.



Complete the block as shown in the book.
