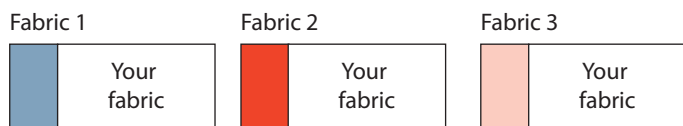
Perfect Patchwork Template Set A, Product #8251 and Log Cabin Ruler #8037

Observe grainline arrows on templates when cutting.

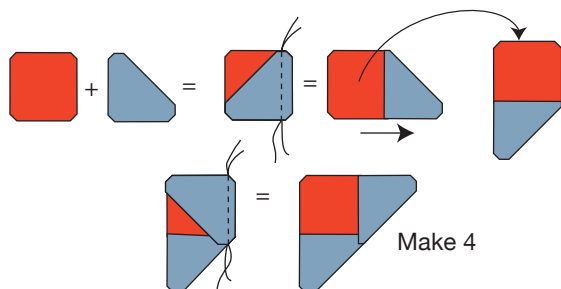
The A-7 double-cut triangles (See Chart 42, Alice block) are a little tricky but they are not hard to cut. They are used in the Flying Geese units on the sides of the block and also in the pieced triangles in the corner units. Doing the double-cut takes a little practice but once you “get it,” pat yourself on the back – It’s okay to feel smug because you can rotary cut perfect $\frac{3}{4}$ ” half-square triangles! Cut 8 each of fabrics 1 and 3. You can compare with the printed pattern; for printing accuracy, make sure 32F is 2” square, the same as template A-5.

The block is shown in 5 rows in the book. We chose to make 3 rows for easier assembly. Identify the fabrics on page 191 from top to bottom as shown in the book. Add a sample of your fabric to the fabric key shown here:



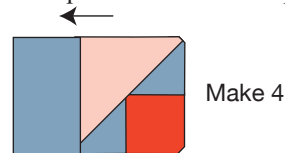
Making the Corner Units

1. Make the Bird in the Air pieced triangle units. Add fabric 1 A-7 double-cut triangles to adjacent sides of the $1\frac{1}{4}$ ” squares of fabric 2 as shown below. Press toward the triangles.



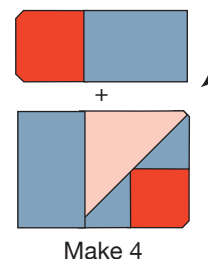
2. Join the units made in step 1 to A-6 triangles (they should match in size) to make pieced squares. The completed square should be the same size as template A-5. Press toward the unpieced triangle.

3. Add a fabric 1 Log Cabin Ruler strip **b** to the A-6 triangle side of the unit made in step 2. Press toward strip **b**.



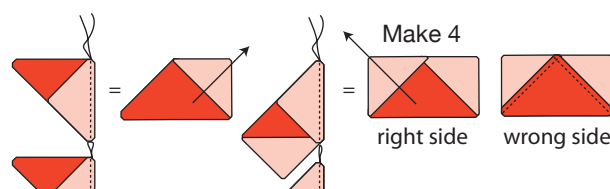
4. Join Log Cabin Ruler **a** squares to Log Cabin Ruler **b** strips. Press toward the squares. Make 4.

5. Arrange units from steps 3 and 4 to make 4 corner units. Press toward the 2-piece strip. Make 4.

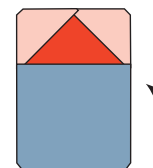


Making the Flying Geese Side Units

1. Make 4 Flying Geese units. Press toward the small triangles.



2. Add an A-5 square to each of the Flying Geese units. Press toward the square. Make 4.



Completing the Block

Referring to the book for placement, arrange the corner units, Flying Geese side units and center square into 3 rows and join. Press all rows toward the Flying Geese side units.

Join the rows to complete the block. Press these seams open.
