Observe grainline arrows on templates when cutting.

## Cutting

Piece 54A-Use the $3 / 4 / 1$ Log Cabin Ruler size a to cut the small squares. Eliminate a seam by cutting size $\mathbf{b}$ strips to replace 2 color 2 (light pink) squares.

Pieces 54D and E-If you own Template Set C, use template C-17 right side up to cut the 54D pieces perfectly. Turn C-17 over for the 54 E pieces.

If you have Set D (and not Set C), cut out the paper pattern and align the pointed end of D-23 with the pattern. Cut against the acrylic ruler as we did with Starlight (Chart 63) last week.

Squares A-1 and A-5-Cut the squares as indicated in the book.

## Making the Block

1. When C-17 triangles are sewn together to make a rectangle as in Magnolia, the points align like this:

2. Press toward the dark fabric. Make 1 each as shown of both color combinations. Confirm that the triangles are pointing in the proper direction before stitching.

3. Make the units as shown in the book. Arrange and sew into rows. Press toward the squares.
4. Join the rows. Press the seam allowances open.
