

### **Cutting**

- 1. Cut 14 A-6 background triangles with legs on straight grain.
- 2. Layer the 2 remaining fabrics. Use A-6, rotated as shown, to measure the perfect strip width as shown. That's 1.56", halfway between 1½" and 15%", or 15/16". Cut one strip set that wide and 15" long, or 2 strip sets 8" long.



3. Cut 1 pair of A-6 triangles and 1 pair of C-20 strips. If you don't own From Marti Michell Perfect Patchwrk Template Set C, cut out paper patterns 73A and 73B, place them on the strip sets and use the A-6 template to trim corners and cut strip to size.



#### Sewing Mrs. Taft

- 1. When these pieces are being sewn correctly, they tend to look odd and "feel" wrong to me. So, I like to lay the entire block out right side up as shown in the book.
- 2. Turn the first triangle right side down with the edges properly aligned for sewing. Pick up the pair and sew a triangle to one end of every strip. Press toward the strip fabric.



3. Lay the sewn pieces back in place and repeat. It may take a tiny bit more time, but it almost always saves ripping out!
