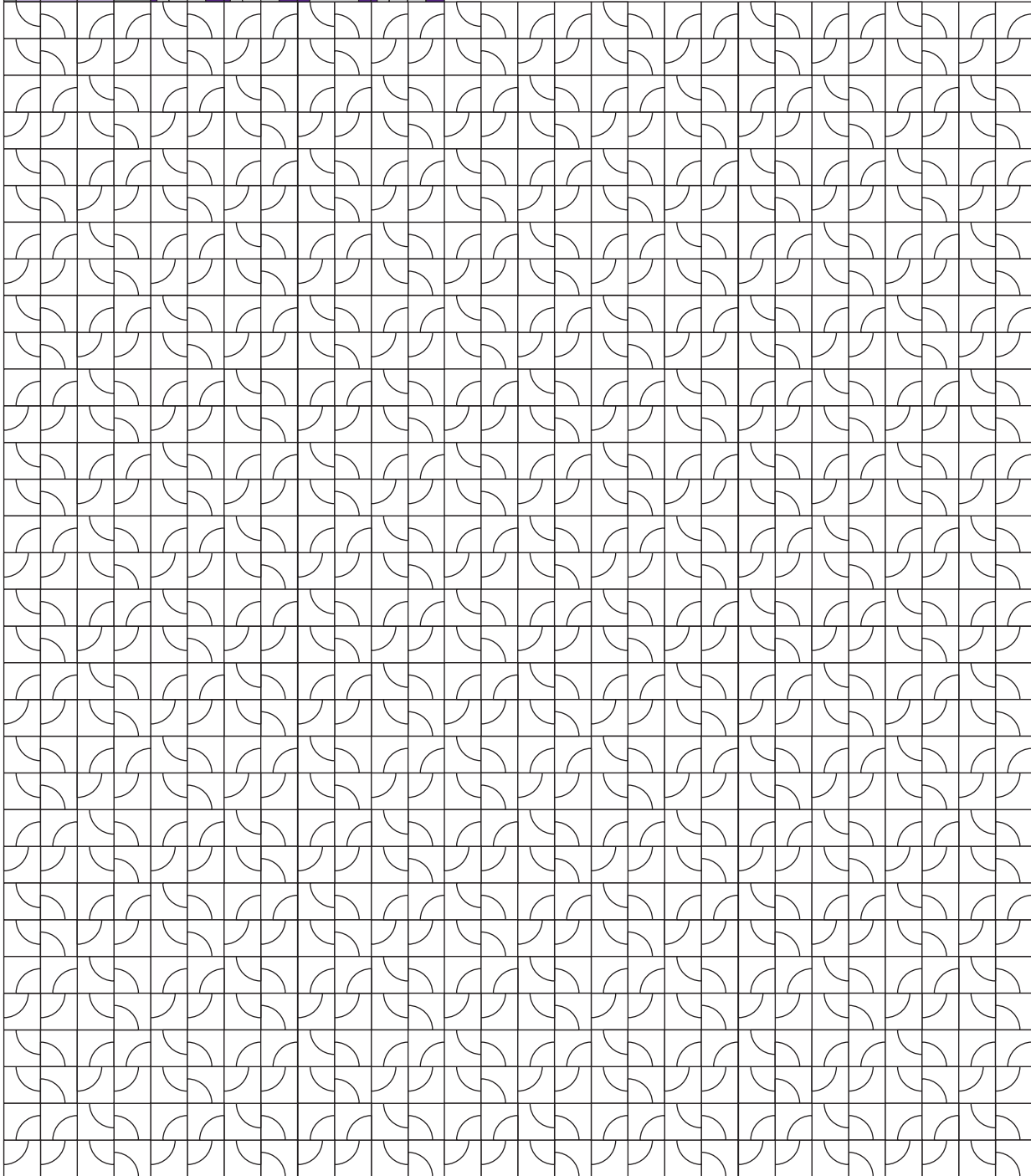


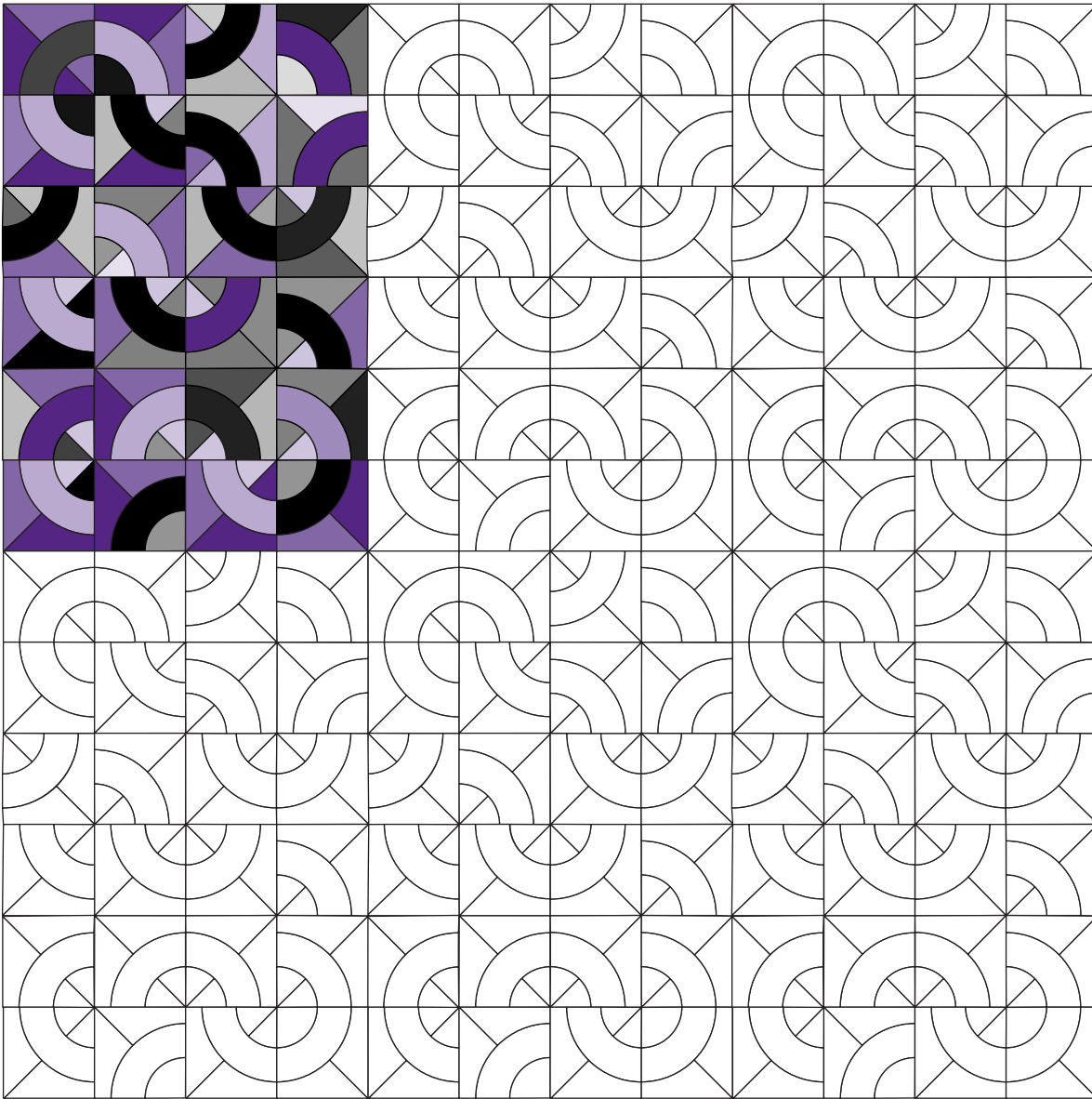
Classic Two-Color Drunkard's Path
Sometimes called Old Maid's Puzzle

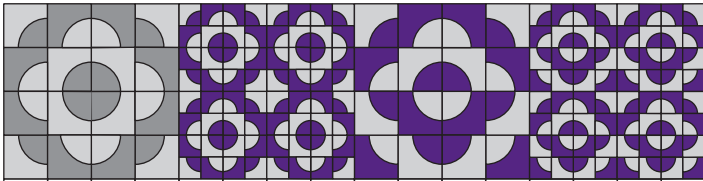


Each block requires 4 sets of

Twister — Cut the blocks apart to rotate in different directions and glue to your worksheet with a gluestick.

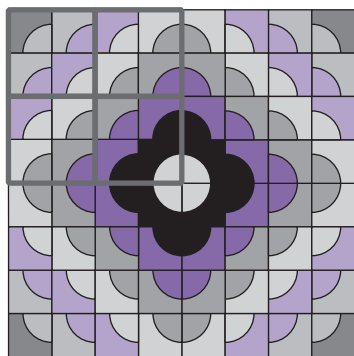
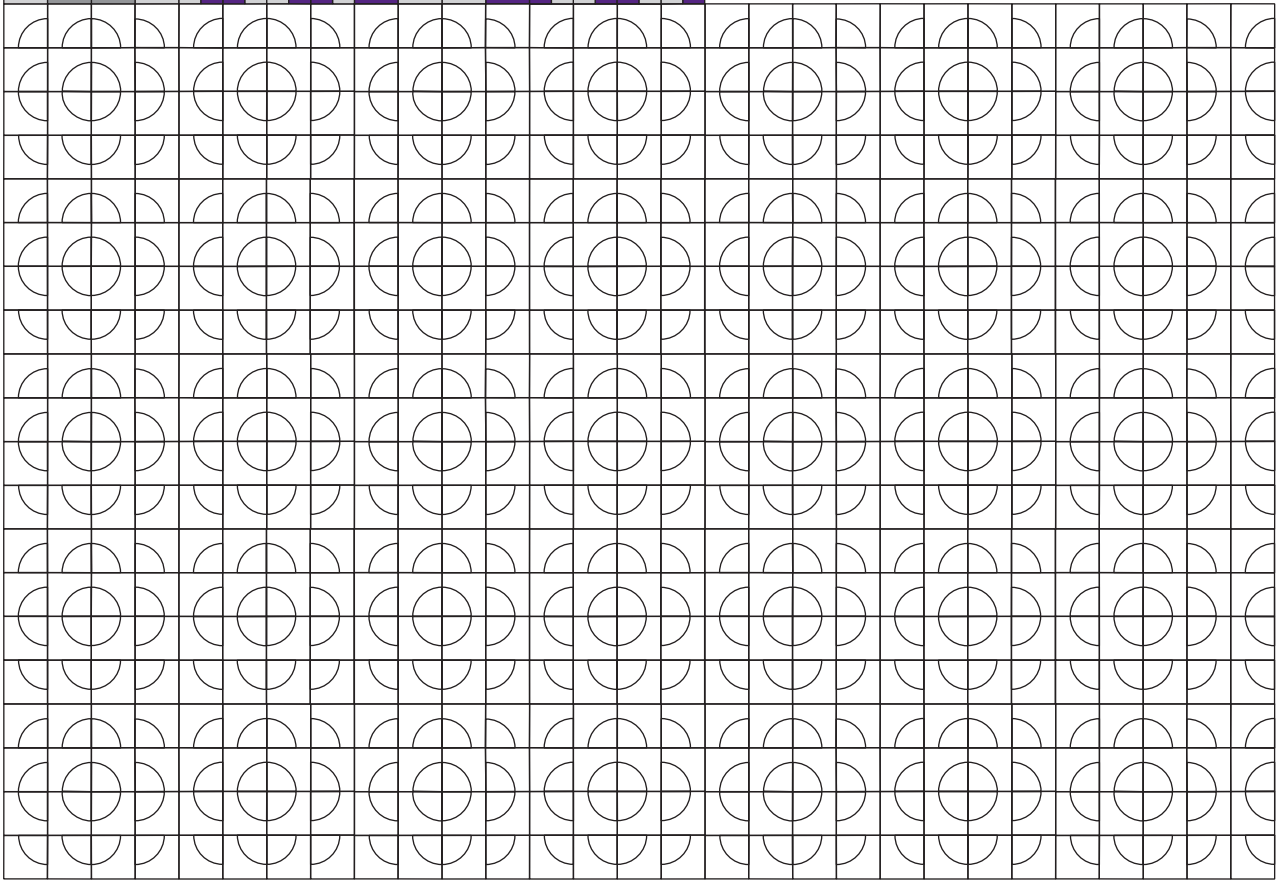




Love Ring



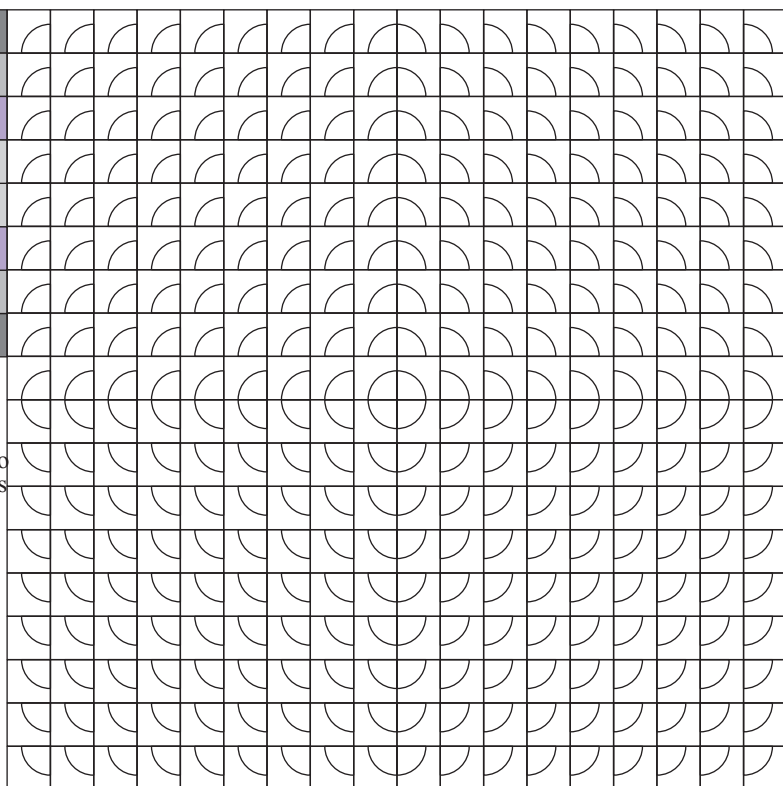

Trip Around the World**



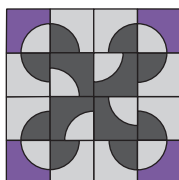
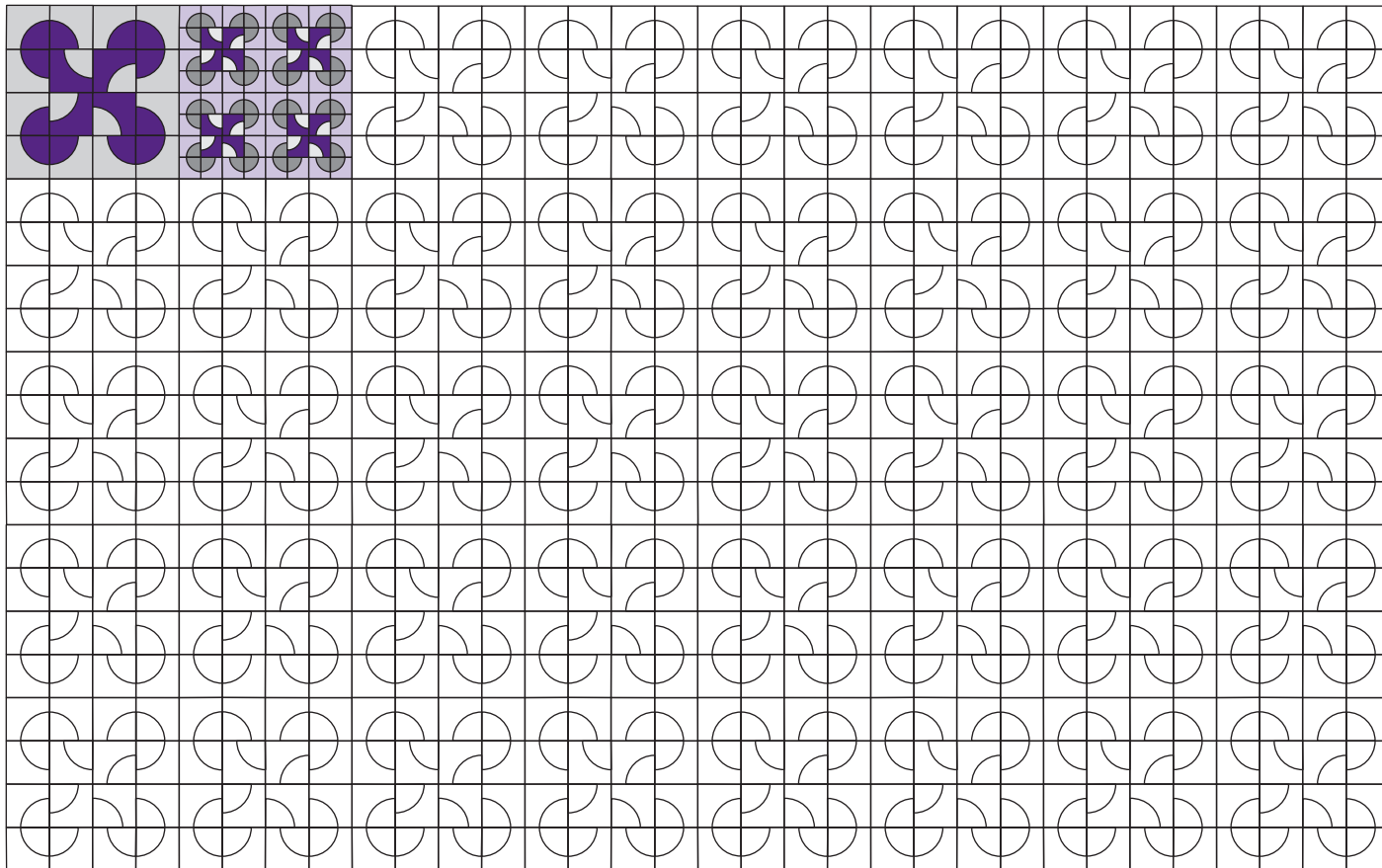
Break each quarter into easy-to-make sub-units and make 4 of each.



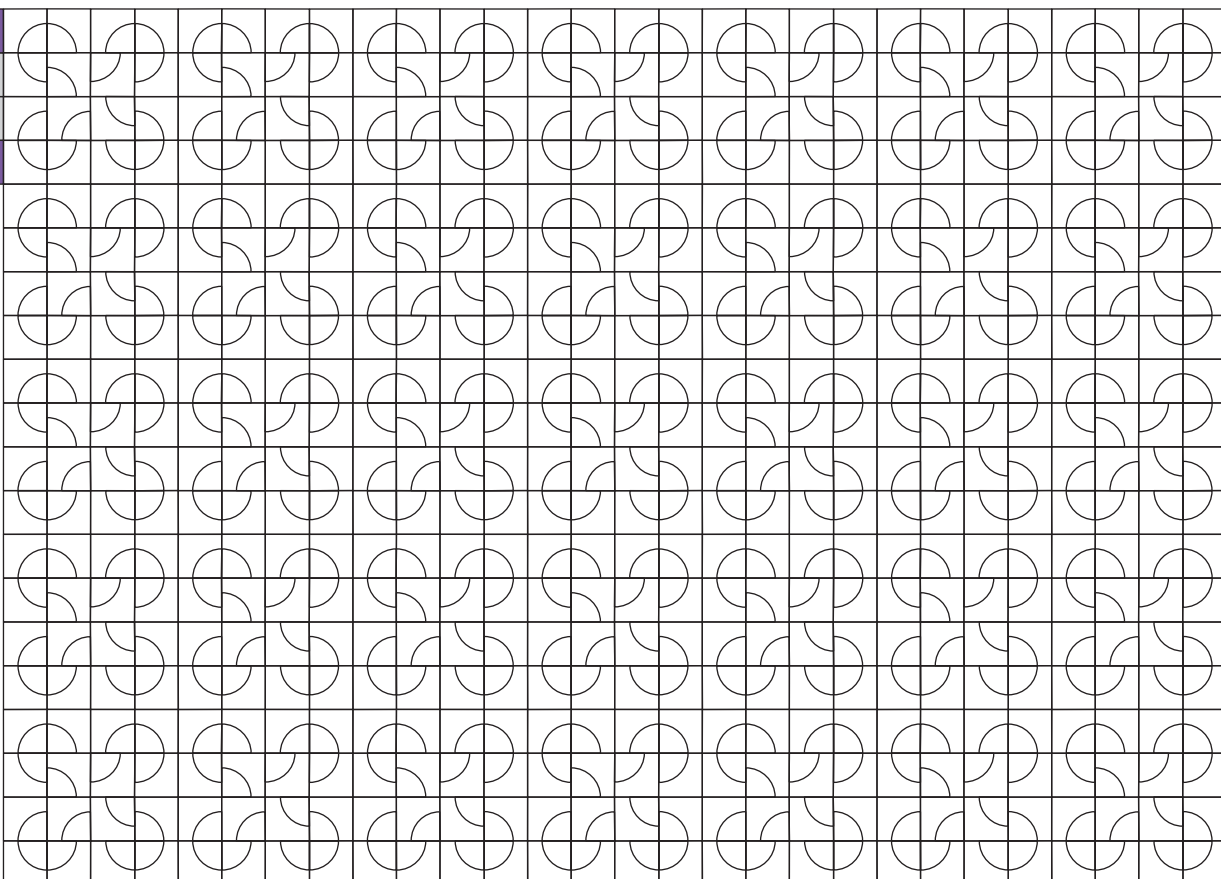

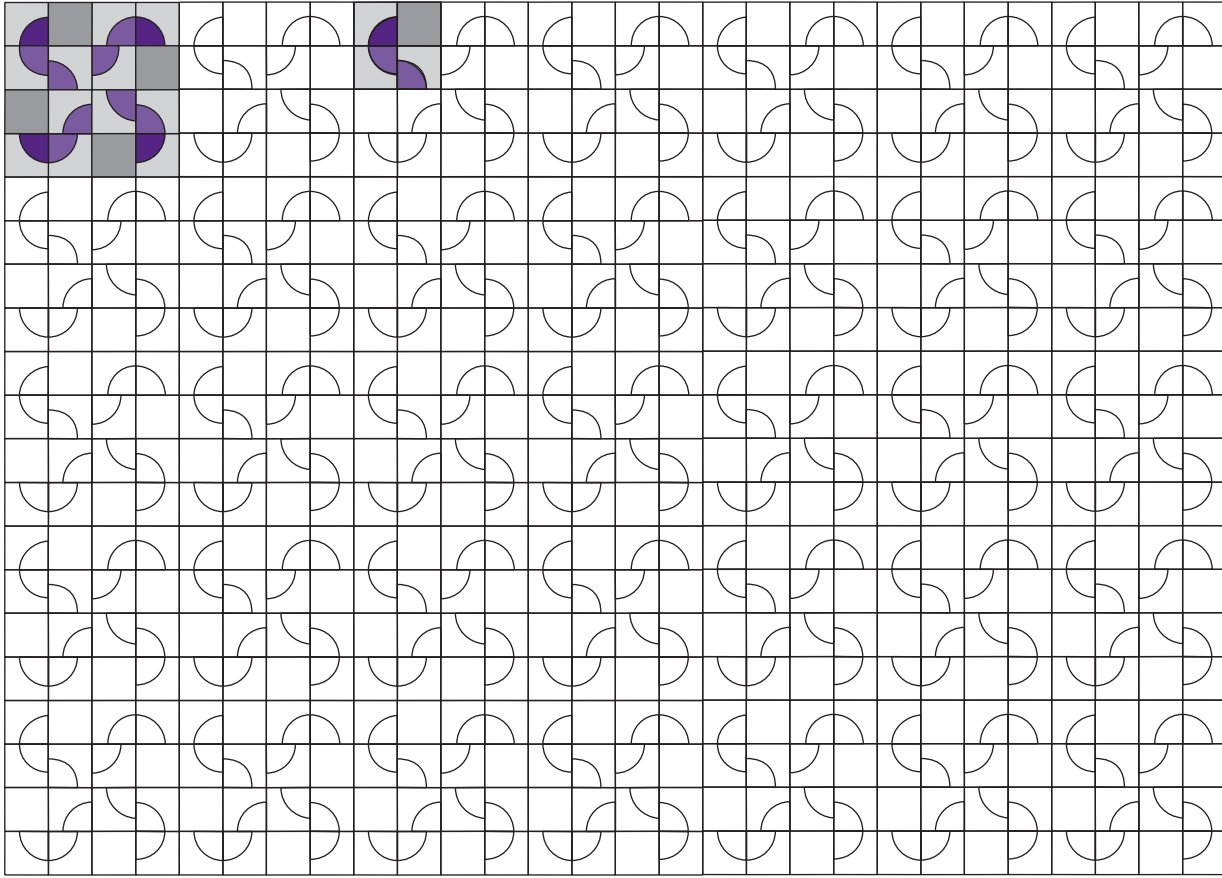
Devil's Puzzle



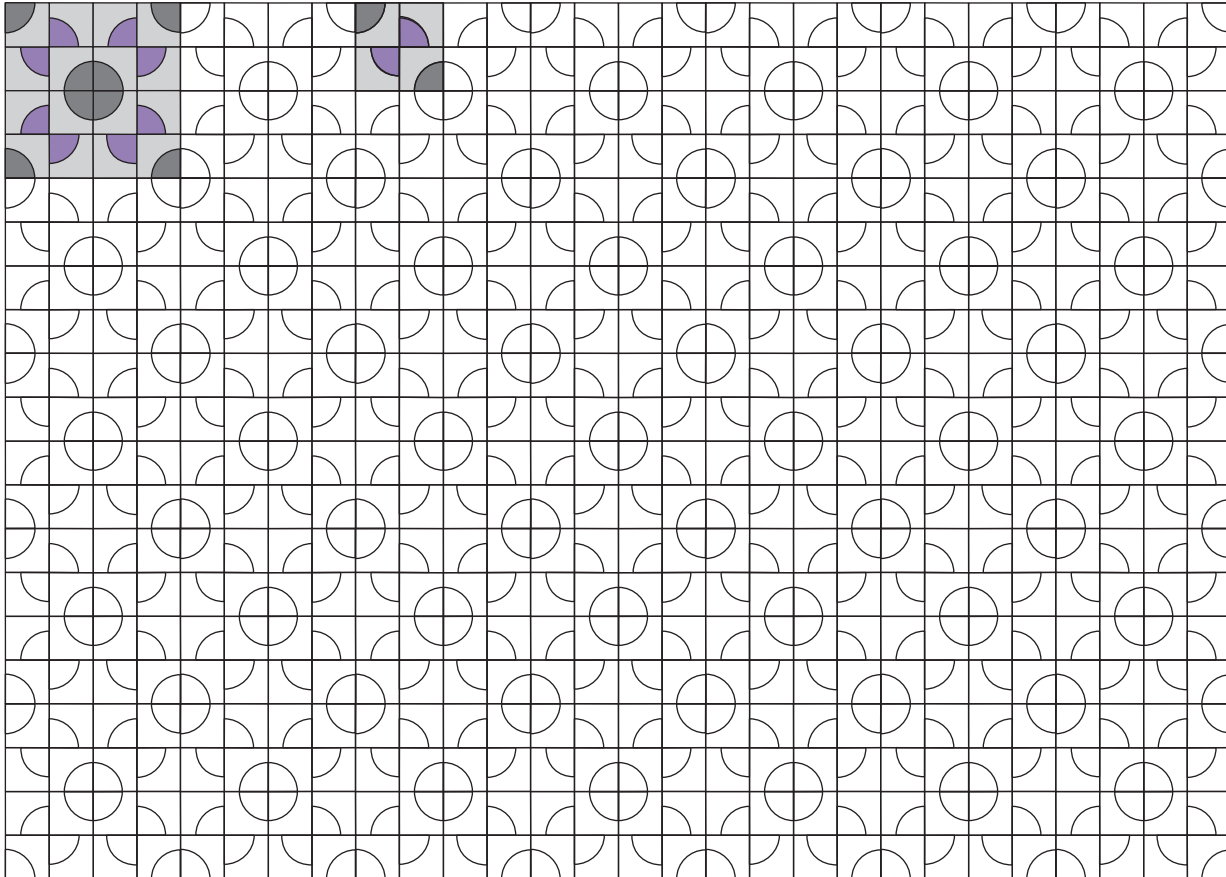
Nine squares are arranged to make one-quarter of the Devil's Puzzle.



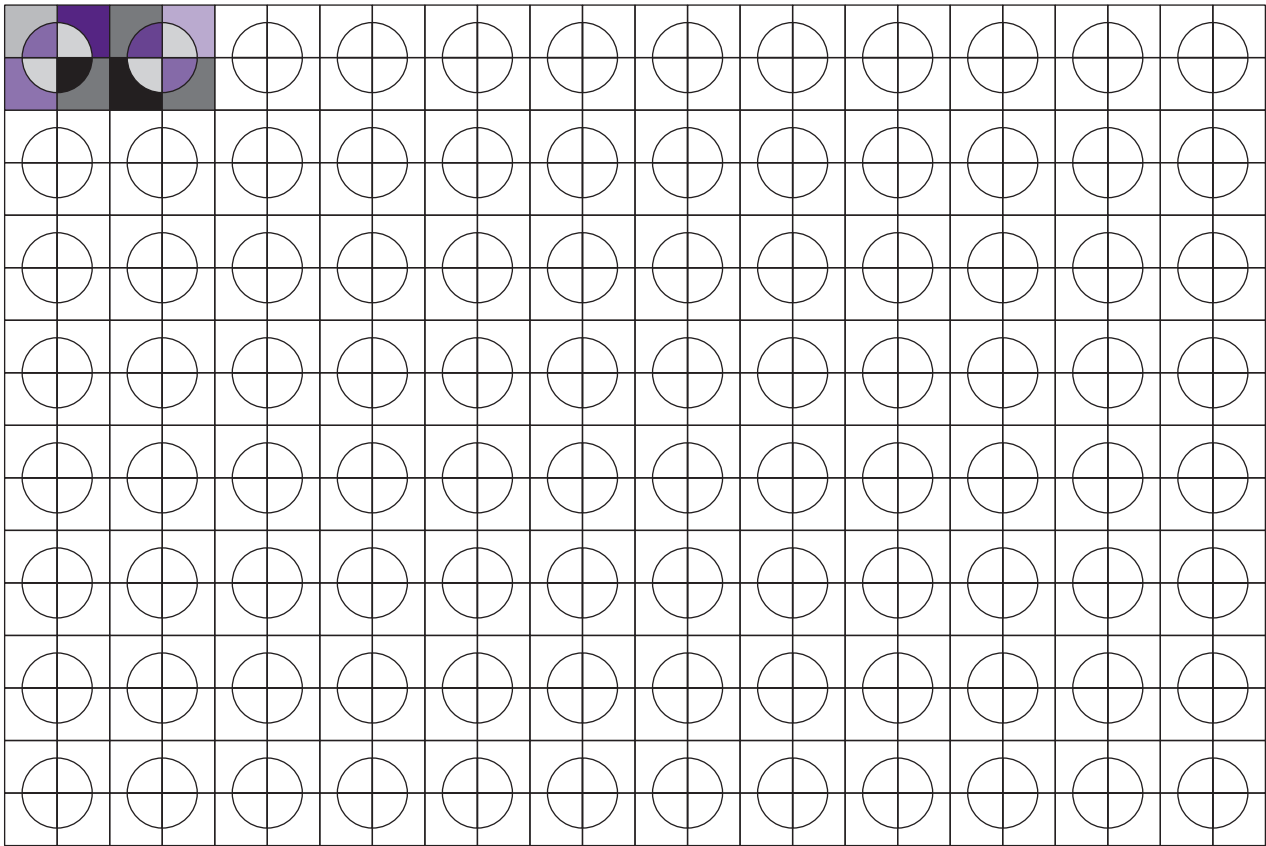

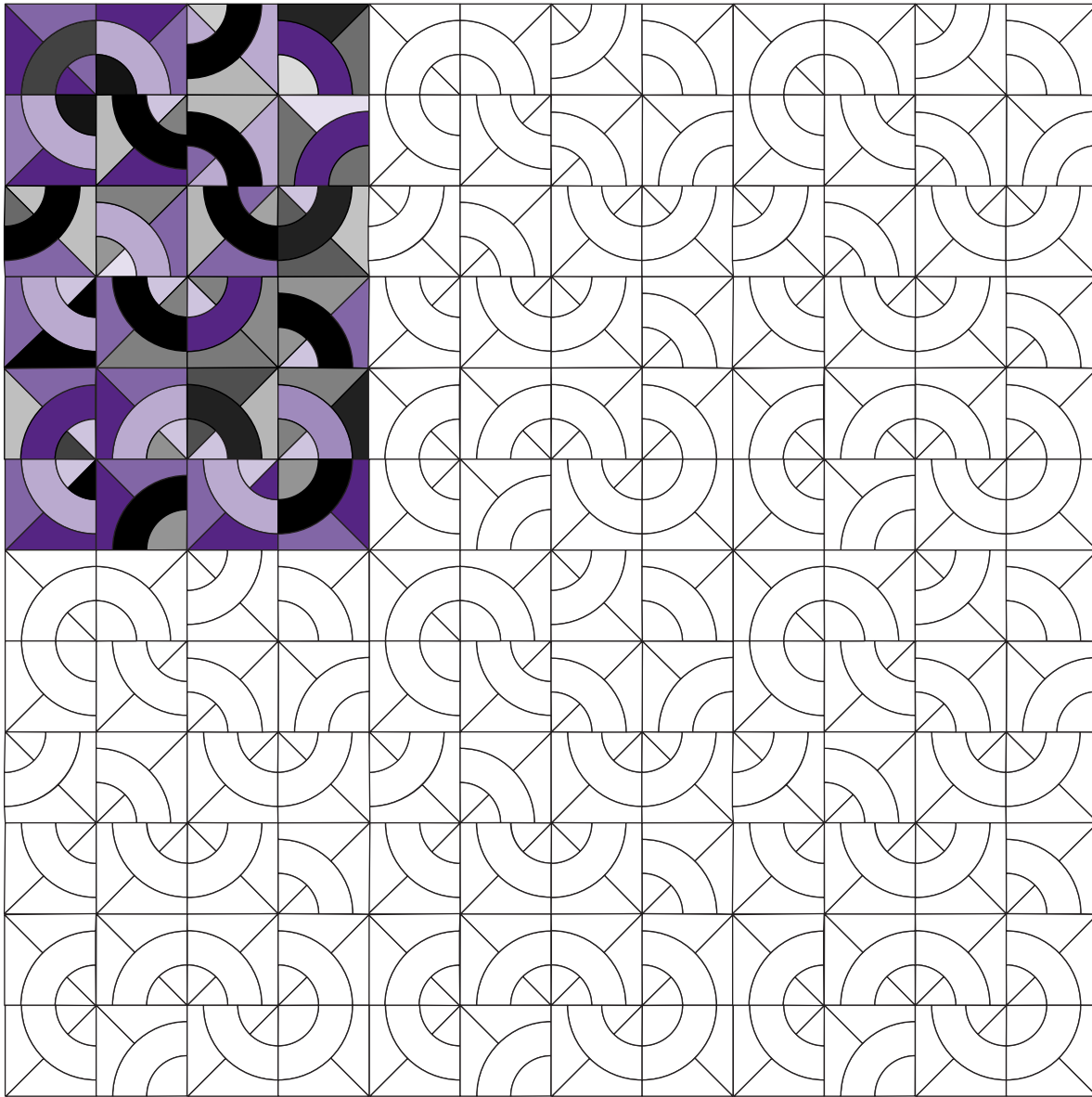


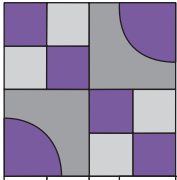
Large Drunkard's Path Templates combined with regular Drunkard's Path templates.

glue in place.



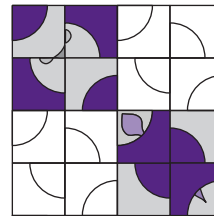
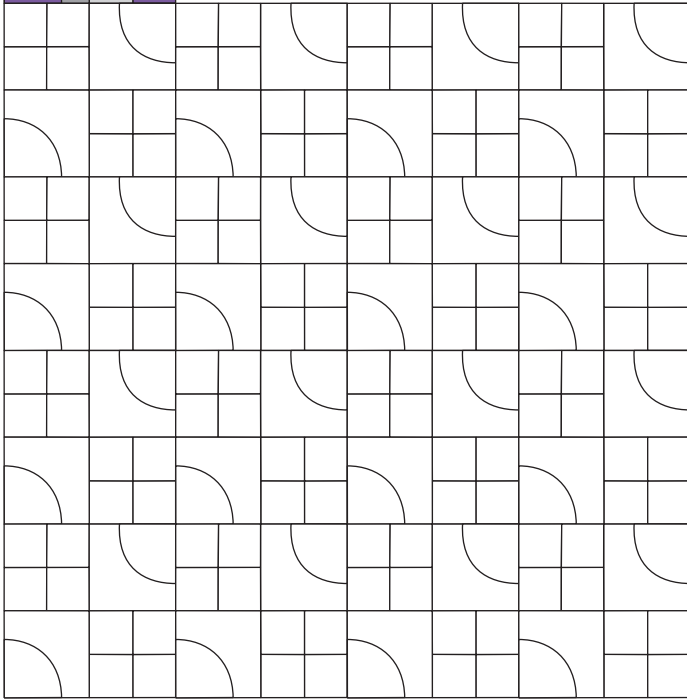

Consider substituting Drunkard's Path units in four patch and nine patch patterns to create entirely new block designs.

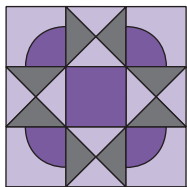
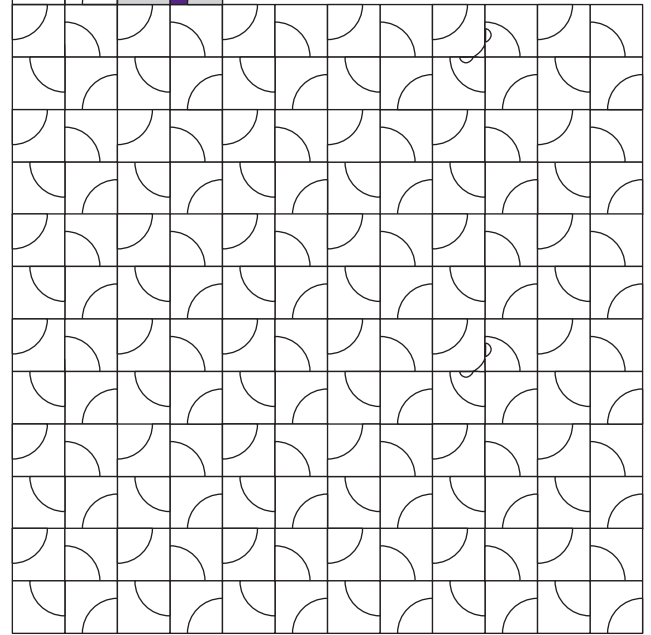


Owls

Applique eyes and add a triangle for a beak.

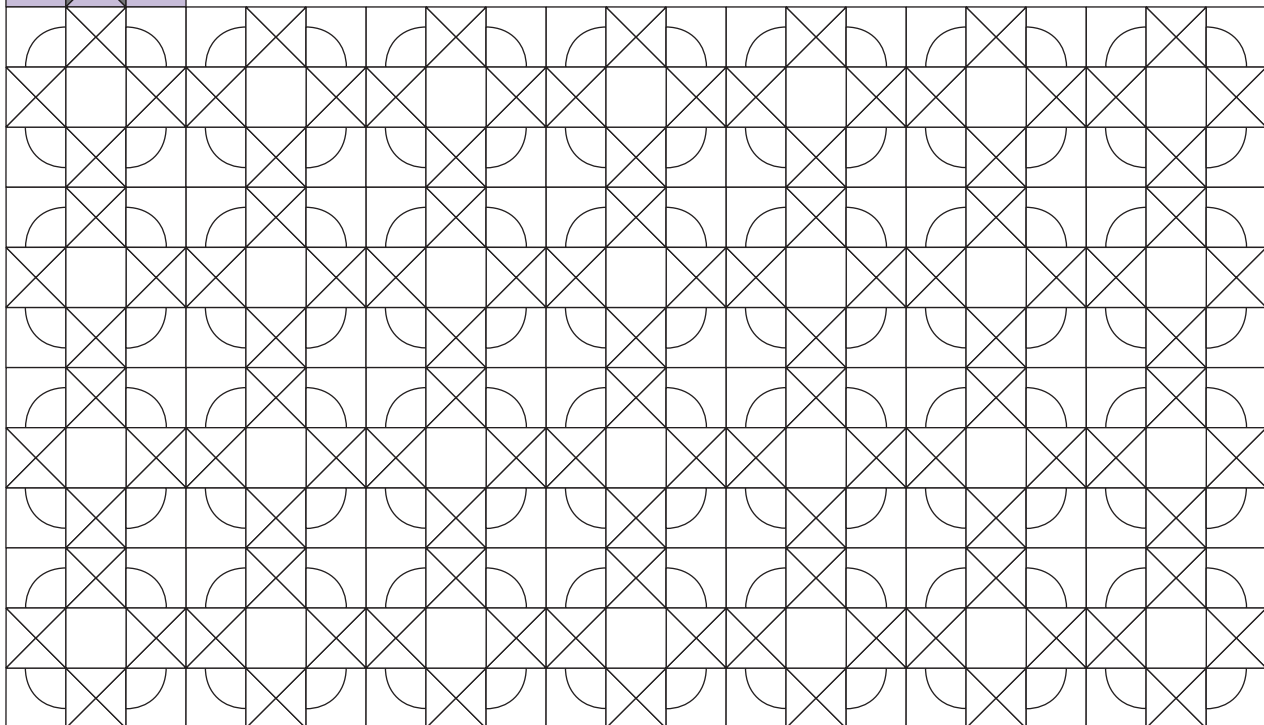
Turtles

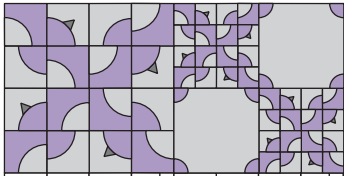
Applique head and tail, or add a folded triangle tail before seaming the two pieces.

At right, we substituted Drunkard's Path for corner squares and made a new Ohio Star variation.

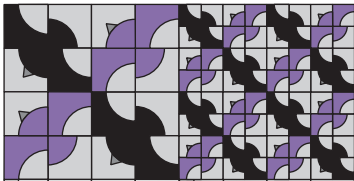
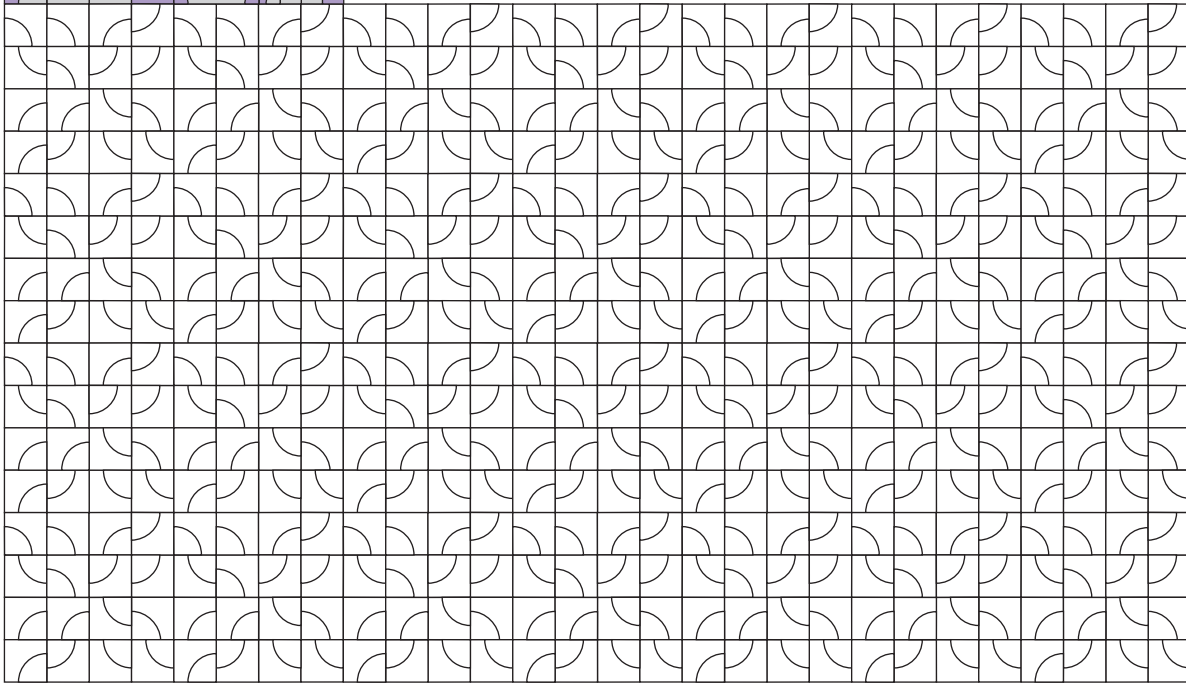




Birds of a Feather (beak optional)



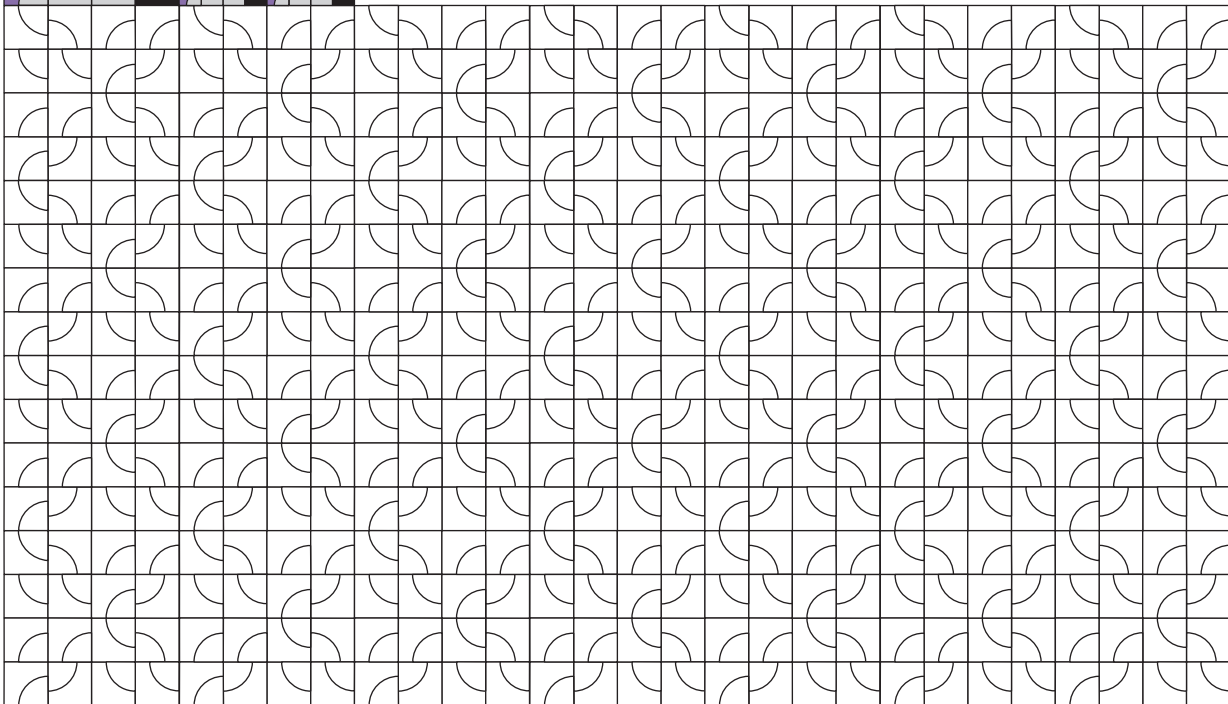
Each block requires 4 sets of Drunkard's Path units in this arrangement.



Birds in a Crosswind (beak optional)



Adding curved corners to plain alternate blocks unites the Drunkard's Path design and means you don't have to make as many! Use the appropriate "L" template to cut away the corners of the squares, then add the pie shapes.
