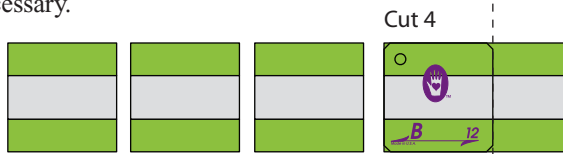

Making the Center and Center Side Units

- Cut 2 strips of green 1" x 15" and 1 strip of gray 1½" x 15".
- Join as shown. Press toward the green. True up one end and cut 4 B-12 squares. True up width of strip set with template if necessary.

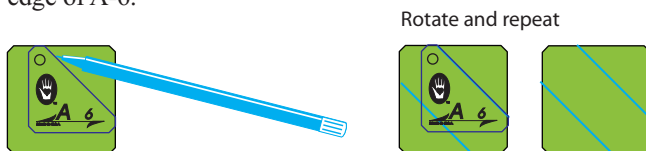


- Cut one gray B-12 center square. The new From MARTI MICHELL Fussy Cutter Ruler Prod #8297 was perfect for this job in my block!

Cut and Make Corner Units

Do you remember Marcella and Primrose (From MARTI MICHELL Charts 60 and 61)? In those blocks, we had a long diagonal piece that went from corner to corner. To insure having straight grain on the square corners, we started with 6½" squares and cut away large triangles on the other two corners. We will repeat the same basic idea on a much smaller scale in Tirzah.

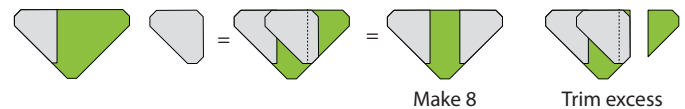
- Cut 4 B-12 squares to replace 96D – yes, they will be altered dramatically!
- Cut 8 A-6 triangles from the same fabric.
- Cut 16 N-81 triangles. Cut 2 strips 1" wide x 12" long. Stack them and cut 8 pairs or a total of 16 N-81 pieces.
- Align an A-6 triangle template on opposite corners on the right side of the B-12 fabric squares as shown. Draw lines on the long edge of A-6.



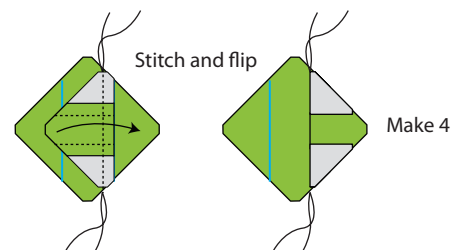
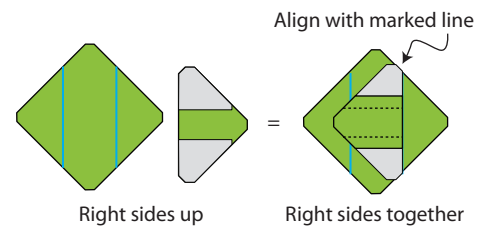
- Position N-81 fabric triangles on the A-6 triangles, right sides together with 1 edge and 1 corner aligned as shown. Stitch ¼" from the edge of one leg of N-81. Flip triangle over to cover the seam allowances. The outside edges of the small and large triangles should match.



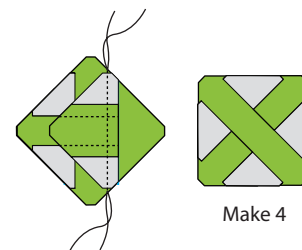
- Repeat on other corner of A-6. Trim away excess A-6 fabric under the N-81 triangles to reduce bulk. Repeat on 7 additional A-6 triangles.



- Now position the altered A-6 units on the B-12 green squares, as shown. Stitch and flip the unit over to cover the seam allowances. The outside edges should match.



Rotate and repeat.



Complete the Block

- Join into rows as shown in the book. Press rows 1 and 3 toward the center units. Press the center row away from the center.
- Join the rows to complete the block. Press toward the center row.
