SSV WORKS STEREO INSTALL

When I originally purchased my Polaris Ranger XP I planned to keep it in basic stock form and I didn't have a bunch of wild ideas on "tricking it out." There were a few aftermarket accessories that caught my eye, but for the most part, I wanted my Ranger to be functional - and light on the wallet. I didn't plan on adding 30 lbs. of billet accessories or sending out for a \$2,000 paint job, but there was one "frill" that I had to have on my new Side X Side, and that was a stereo. While some people may mock me and question my off-road core for playing music while I drive. I'm as big a fan of music as I am of off-road, so if I can combine those two then I'm as happy as a clam.

Finally the time came to install a stereo system in my new Ranger, and for me the choice was clear. When I owned my Rhino I had the same dilemma when installing a stereo system; I wanted something a little more than a basic overhead stereo and speaker combo. I knew I didn't want to install a stereo system myself due to my limited electrical handy work (and prior attempts with my other toys). I found a company called SSV Works that had exactly what I was looking for on, my Rhino and they even came out and installed the whole system for me. The complete system they put in my Rhino worked so well that, when it came time to do one for the Ranger, I knew exactly who I wanted to use. Once again SSV Works had exactly what I was looking for.

SSV Works specializes in Side X Side audio and uses top-of-the-line Scosche and EFX brand products. SSV Works builds custom speaker pods that seamlessly flow into the kick panels and rear bed of your Ranger XP, RZR, and Yamaha Rhino. One of my favorite features that is offered with their audio systems is the BlueTooth wireless iPod transmitter and receiver. This system allows you the option of using a stand-alone iPod with a transmitter to connect wirelessly to your amp and speakers. This simply means that you have no head unit to worry about and no extra wires. Simply plug in the BlueTooth transmitter to your iPod, hit the button to connect, and within seconds you're able to control everything from volume, equalizer, and song selection all from your iPod - and from up to 30 feet away! I'll show you the basics of how the SSV Works Ranger system is installed and just how easy (and affordable) it is to have an off-road sound system tailored for your Side X Side.







An EFX amp is installed underneath the Ranger's dash along with the BlueTooth transmitter. Everything is hidden under the dash and the amp is built to withstand harsh dirt and dust build-up (Top).

The front speaker pods come with a whole kick panel that replaces the stock kick panel for a nice clean look. The speakers are 6x9" (Middle).

The rear speaker pods mount right into the bed corners and wiring is done so you can still open the bed. 6x9" speakers are also used in the bed (Bottom).
