

BEFORE YOU BEGIN

For accurate wrist size measurement when using the print wrist sizer, make sure to review your printer settings. Set **Page Scaling** to "none" and print at 100% scale for proportional accuracy. Measure the one-inch marker in the sample box below to confirm accuracy. Any deviation may result in an inaccurate wrist measurement. These steps ensure the most reliable results.

HOW TO MEASURE (TRADITIONAL OVER-HAND BANGLES)

1. Print out this page. Make sure to measure the box above to ensure accuracy.
2. Cut along the dotted lines around the wrist sizer, including the dotted lines on the inside of the ruler (on the left).
3. Once you've finished cutting out the sizer, with the number markers on the outside, curl the wrist sizer into a circle. Carefully insert the pointed end through the small opening.
4. Close your fingers as if you were putting on a bangle and place the loop around the widest part of your hand, usually where your knuckles are located (if that is the largest part).
5. Pull the pointed end of the sizer tighter until it feels good.
6. If you prefer a tighter fit, keep the wrist sizer tight and consider going down half a size. This will make the bangle feel tight to put it on, but will move less on your wrist. For a looser fit, keep the wrist sizer at a regular tightness and use the exact size indicated.

HOW TO MEASURE (HINGED & CHAIN BRACELETS)

1. Follow the same instructions (steps: 1-3) for printing out the wrist sizer and cutting it out.
2. Use the indications on the ruler part of the wrist sizer to determine the appropriate inch size or XS-L size, depending on the style you are interested in.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

Keep in mind that the width of the bangle will also affect the ease of putting it on. Larger widths (16mm/25mm) may be more challenging to slide on compared to an 8mm bangle.

If you find yourself between sizes, it's generally safer to choose the larger size rather than the smaller one. However, if you don't mind a snug fit that requires a little effort to put on, sizing down is always acceptable.
