Bonsai Tree Care - Ginsena Ficus (ficus retusa)

What is Bonsai?	Bonsai is the reproduction of trees in miniature. This art form has been practiced in Japan and China for centuries. Since Bonsai are grown in pots and not in the ground, they are solely dependent on you for their care. If cared for properly, your tree will live for years to come, increasing in beauty as it matures.	
About Your Tree:	The Ginseng Ficus is a variety of fig tree, native to Southeast Asia. This	
<b>Ginseng Ficus</b>	tree grows oval shaped dark green leaves and has unique large exposed	
(ficus retusa)	aerial roots that look like tree trunks. Also known as: Taiwan Ficus,	
	Indian Laurel Fig or Banyan Fig. Depending on your variety of tree, you	
	can expect to have flowers bloom occasionally during the summer months.	
Placement:	<i>Indoors</i> : Ginseng ficus love light, place in indirect light and avoid direct	
	sunlight. These trees grow in moist dry climates, so you want to be sure	
	you keep it out of any drafty areas.	
	Outdoors: Ginseng Ficus enjoy being outdoors when it is warm. Feel free	
	to bring it outside in the summer months. Again, find a place with indirect	
	sunlight. Bring it inside if temperatures drop below 50 degrees.	
Watering:	Ginseng Ficus prefer humidity, warmth and moist soil that is well-drained.	
	Never allow the soil to dry, water it before it dries out. An attached	
	humidity tray will help to keep the tree watered appropriately. Consider	
	misting it every few days to help with the humidity. Keep it moist in the	
	summer and water slightly less in the winter.	
Notes:	The ginseng ficus makes for a wonderful beginner bonsai as it takes little	
	maintenance. It can survive over-watering or under-watering occasionally.	
	It is a very hardy and forgiving tree.
