SEWING PATTERN #2 - FULL APRON - by Splash Fabric



packets, art supplies and so much more. Ties are generous enough to wrap around your waist to tie in front. Cotton backing makes it sweat-free, even during hot flashes!

26"w x 26"h | 40" ties | 4" tool/towel loop | 2 pockets plus cell phone pocket

Water-based urethane laminated cotton CPSIA certified, BPA & Phthalate-free, food-safe and earth-safe. UV rays harm fabric. Prolonged direct sun will discolor fabric. Wipe clean with damp cloth, scrub stains on back side. Machine wash warm okay, hang dry, iron low.

Materials

Fabric: 1 yd Our 58" fabric fits 2 aprons across, side-by-side. Or cut 1 on on 1/2 and use the rest for a Denny Tote + a couple of pouches. If you pick a fabric with a 1-way print, be sure to cut & sew images upright. (needs to be colorfast for washing

4 yds webbing, or apron strings. I use 3/4" or 1" cotton webbing because it's soft, biodegradable, and folds easily to create binding on the "armholes".

Sewing Notes

Fear not: Sewing with laminated cotton is easier than it looks.

Standard or heavy thread and Denim needle work well.

Needle suggestion: SCHMETZ NonStick size 100 or denim needle

Use a longer than normal stitch length.

No need to bind or serge cut edges. Fabric won't unravel - it's sealed / laminated

Cut

1. Print out the sheet below on 8.5"x11" printer paper. Cut it out. Use it as a pattern for apron "armholes".

NOTE: It doesn't matter which way you cut the patterns on our fabric. Crossways is fine too (depending on the print). Our fabric prints are designed to accommodate cutting horizontal, vertical or upside-down.

2. Cut fabric in 1/2, lengthwise up the middle. Cut selvedge off.

Note: Use selvedge as ribbon for your next gift or to tie together pattern pieces...)

- 3. Cut 8"off the bottom of your 1yd piece of fabric for the pocket.
- 4. Fold apron body in 1/2 lengthwise. Cut out "armholes".

Note: Use cut outs to make a cute small pouch.


Sew

- 5. Fold webbing or binding over full length top of pocket. Clip or pin & topstitch.
- 6. Pin pocket in place, 4" up from the bottom of the apron body. Stitch the bottom & edges. Mark vertical lines for pocket divisions, sew.
- 7. Fold over & hem all 4 sides of the apron body. Take care to fold in pockets on sides.
- 8. Top stitch separations for pockets. (I do this after the sides are hemmed helps it lay flat
- 9. Cut 6" of webbing and sew in place as towel / tool loop (as shown)

- 10. Cut remaining webbing in 1/2, making 2 strings \sim 85" long. Fold and hem ends of webbing.
- 11. Measure 30" from 1 end of each apron string. Pin over top of apron corner. Fold webbing over edge of fabric edge on arm holes. Pin or clip and top. Stitch. Done!

Wear when you: Cook, Garden, Craft, Clay, Vend, Teach, Cut/color hair, Wash the dog....
