# **SEWING PATTERN #4 – Lined Stand-Up Pouch**











The flat bottom and triangular design make it sit upright on counter tops. The top zipper makes it easy to load and contain items. The large Stand Up Pouch weighs under 3 oz. making it light to carry in larger bags while the 1" ring on the side attaches to the hook inside many bigger bags.


Bring these around town, traveling, camping, for your knitting supplies, toiletries, or to gather up loose things around your home. They are a joy to use, eco-friendly and are wipeable, washable goodness!

We invite you to splatter, slop, shop, bike, and juggle babies with Splash Fabric Stand Up Pouches. A perfect fit for cosmetics, art supplies, cords and toys. They make a great travel pouch or use it as a clutch.

#### **Materials**

- **FABRIC** 2 pieces of fabric 8.5 x 11" (Print out the SMALL pattern provided, for your first one.) Use one print on the outside and another one on the inside for a fun surprise every time you open it!
- 18" of 1 side of #5 coil zipper tape + 1 matching zipper pull. I use Black, YKK.
- 1" black plastic ring (or any key clip, carabiner or clip you have)

### **Sewing Notes**


Use a heavier thread and a sharp Denim needle for bags. Even better: SCHMETZ NonStick size 90, or100. Use a longer than normal stitch length - #3.5 or #4 No need to bind or serge cut edges. Fabric won't unravel - it's sealed.

#### Cut

 More advanced: print out the Small/Medium/ Large pattern 12X (there are 3 sizes. Each pattern piece is 1/4 which need to be taped together. Tape them together to make whole patterns for all 3 sizes - see example to the right.

Place 2 fabrics, 1 for each side (1 inside fabric, 1 outside fabric.) Wrong Sides Together. Trace around the edges of the pattern piece(s), cut.

The inside & outside fabrics will stay together WST as you sew it together.




Note: With bags, as opposed to garments, it doesn't matter which way you cut the patterns on the fabric. Crossways is fine, depending on the print.

Our fabric is designed to accommodate cutting horizontal or vertical.


NOTE: Our fabrics are 58" wide.

#### Sew

1. Fold pouch in half along bottom of pouch as shown. Keep 2 fabrics back-to-back sew OUTSIDE sides together thru 4 layers of fabric.



No need to finish the raw edges as laminated cotton doesn't fray. Don't worry about pin holes, you can "heal" them with your fingers. Clips are great too on our fabrics.




## **Add** zipper


Split zipper tape in 1/2 as shown. You will use 1 side of the tape for each bag you make. I use coil zipper by the yard.


After you stitch the right side, open seam flat and pin or clip zipper tape as shown, teeth down and facing the laminated side of the outside front and

Fold zipper up, TOPSTITCH.

Add zipper pull.










## Add side tab + ring


Cut the ends of 1" webbing. Melt ends with a lighter. Fold and stitch as shown to create the tab + loop on the side. (Optional - use any clip or d-ring)

## **FINISH**



Stitch second side of your pouch, double stitching over webbing tab & zipper end. cut zipper ends 1/4" from edge of bag.

Sew both box corners.



Turn your new backpack inside out & load it up!

## ONE PATTERN, 3 SIZES OF STAND-UP POUCHES

Print out 4x per size on 8.5" x 11" paper cut on dotted lines & tape together
