# **Basic Worm Farm Quick Assembly**

#### 1. Set the Collection Base

#### 2. Install the Worm Ladder

Set the worm ladder inside the base. The worm ladder helps worms that have fallen into the collection tray climb back into the working tray.

## 3. Add a Stacking Tray


This tray is referred to as the "Starting Tray."


### 4. Add the Lid

Your Worm Farm Composter is now ready to add bedding materials and worms.

# **Set Aside the Remaining Trays**

The remaining trays are added one at a time as they are needed. It may take 3–4 months to put all four trays into operation.





# **Find a Good Location For Your Worm Farm**

Worms do best in a bedding temperature range of 55–75°F. The bedding temperature is generally an average of the air temperature. So, if it's 45°F at night and 75°F during the day, the average temperature is 60°F, and your worms will be fine.

The Worm Farm can be kept outdoors as long as it is protected from direct sunlight and not exposed to rain and wind.

A porch, patio, or balcony with an overhang is a good location. Placing it underneath a leafy tree can also work. The Worm Farm should be moved indoors during conditions of extreme weather (temperatures below 34°F or over 90°F).

Keeping the Worm Farm inside, in a kitchen, garage, basement, or utility area, also works. As long as the farm is maintained correctly, it will not have an offensive odor.
