MICHAEL HOLM was born Lothar Walter in Stettin in 1943. After fleeing from the advancing Red Army, he spent the first post-war years with his family and twin sister in Wolfsburg, later in Erlangen. He is one of Germany's most successful pop singers, songwriters and music producers, best known for "Mendocino" (1969) and the number one hit "Tränen lügen nicht" (1974). He was awarded the Goldene Stimmgabel five times and was nominated for a Grammy three times. Today he lives near Munich.

MICHAEL KERNBACH was a founding member and lyricist of Guildo Horn & die orthopädischen Strümpfe, for whom Holm was a producer. Together they celebrated the biggest success of the retro-slag wave of the late nineties with the gold album "Danke!". He has already written numerous books.



These letters tell of important political events, nature conservation and adventurous research trips, exchanges about holidays, reading experiences and health problems. But they are above all one thing: the vivid portrait of a great friendship.

Letters, cards and telegrams were exchanged between Lilo and Siegfried Lenz on the one hand and Loki and Helmut Schmidt on the other between 1965 and 2014. What makes it so fascinating is that not just two, but four people were involved in the correspondence. We know how significant the friendship was for the two men, but only now does it become apparent that it was about an intense friendship between two married couples, in which all four participants contributed their interests and in which they met, enriched and complemented each other.

This correspondence over five decades is not just between a politician and a writer; a conservationist and a passionate gardener play an equal role in it. This volume tells the story of a friendship between two married couples and at the same time shows the portrait of an era from politics, art, music and - above all - literature to nature and environmental protection.

Language is a living thing – it's constantly changing. Lots of people like to bemoan these changes, especially with English-isms popping up every- where. Much more decisive and of far greater importance than the current changes for the German language, however, was the First World War.

Until 1914, the spread of German seemed unstoppable. A leading language of scholarship, it was also an administrative language in the colonies and Eastern Europe. Conquerors and emigrants brought German not only to exotic regions in Africa and the South Pacific but also to the USA. In many areas, what force alone couldn't accomplish was achieved through the cultural influence of Germany - when the Austro-Hungarian monarchy gathered people in some corner of Eastern Europe to hear the music of Richard Wagner, for instance. Then came the First World War. After 1918 German disappeared from various Slavic nations, as well as Alsace and Lorraine and several countries below the equator, where it had been forced on the local population, but its influence also waned in areas like South Tyrol, where nothing but German had ever been spoken. Kaiser-Wilhelmsland became New Guinea, the house of Saxe-Coburg was suddenly called Windsor, and even the German Shepherd was redubbed the Alsatian. Even the Swiss no longer wanted to sound like Germans, so they started speaking dialect again. It proved the beginning of a gradual process which ended with Germany losing its significance in the global world of science and with the dramatic decline of the German language in Germany, Austria, Switzerland and a few other leftovers. Journalist, linguist and historian Matthias Heine explores how the World War led to the downfall of German as a language.

How did the mouse hook up with the computer? What do you mean, there's a draft as if I've been angling for pike? How does a canard survive in the day and age of fake news? And no, life is no dog and pony show.

We encounter far more animals in our daily use of language than in real life: in metaphors and turns of phrase. When and how did these become proverbial? Matthias Hein has tracked them down. There is the mole, which is indebted to a famous spy novel for learning its trade as a secret agent in the times of the Cold War. Or the bull which entered the china shop for the first time in the German parliament building, the Reichstag. And there is the "inner pig dog", whose career is so shady that there should be no doubt it should be let off the leash once and for all.

A book full of curious and revelatory discoveries, making connections that we have only had vague notions of.



Reflections of a Female Barbarian by writer and journalist Asal Dardan is a collection of ten autobiographical essays on themes around identity, culture and belonging, examining the concepts of identity politics and structural racism.

Born in Iran, Dardan arrived in Germany as a baby but always struggled to belong. Now in her early forties and with two children of her own, she returns to Germany after several years in Sweden. With sensitivity and nuance, Dardan questions what it means to grow up in a "foreign" country and maintains that living together in society necessitates the acceptance of differences.

The ten essays cover a variety of topics, all of which interweave the personal with the political. The themes of exile and belonging in particular are explored from different perspectives. In the opening essay, Dardan describes her childhood in Cologne and her alienation from both Germany – where she was perceived as a foreigner – and Iran, whose language she didn't speak and whose traditions she didn't uphold. A later essay compares her experiences in Germany with the six months she spent in the USA, where she felt accepted.

A further chapter is set on the Swedish island of Öland, where her husband's family has owned a house for generations. Alongside beautiful descriptions of the island's environs, Dardan considers the way we form emotional attachments to places and things. She contrasts the many traditions her Swedish mother-in-law is passing down to her grandchildren with her own lack of Iranian rituals and traditions.

One particularly powerful essay examines the trial of the National Socialist Underground or NSU, which took place between 2013 and 2018 and dominated the German media. The case dealt with neo-Nazis who were accused of killing a number of workers with immigrant backgrounds over the course of seven years, and revealed the racism inherent in the German police force. Dardan describes the extreme discrimination suffered by the families of the murder victims. She takes a close look at some of the recent events in Germany's history of violence towards migrants, while also reflecting on the country's wider attempt to come to terms with its past. In a message which is just as relevant to the UK and the USA, she sounds a clear warning against right-wing populism.

These nuanced and highly topical essays will appeal to fans of Laila Lalami's Conditional Citizens and Zadie Smith's essay collections.

But it is dangerous to see any status as permanently 'achieved' and secure. As recent developments clearly show, our society's value must be constantly re-established and reaffirmed.

Carsten Brosda sketches the central role of art and culture in the effort to secure freedom and to enter into discourse as a society. Art irritates and inspires. It is a motor of our democracy and the foundation of creativity and innovation. It gives meaning and establishes social cohesion – even if, or rather because, it questions this cohesion. In this paradox lies a power that we must preserve at all cost. Perhaps more than at any other time since the foundation of the Federal Republic of Germany, we are challenged to ensure the freedom of the arts.
