## Community Rallies for 8th Annual Arctic Outreach In Spite of Wintry Conditions

Manahawkin, NJ (February 26, 2023) On Saturday, Feb 25<sup>th</sup> the 8<sup>th</sup> Annual Arctic Outreach took place at Mud City Crab House in Manahawkin, NJ. It was one of the coldest instances of this event in recent memory, with temperatures plunging from uncharacteristically warm weather earlier in the week. But the low temperatures and snowy conditions did not deter the community from coming out to support those in need.

Now in its 8<sup>th</sup> year, Arctic Outreach was originally created to help support a beloved community member, Mallory McBrien, who was battling cancer at the time. Since then, it has continued in her memory with a small portion of the proceeds going to support Mallory's surviving young children's education funds and the majority of proceeds from the event going to the Jetty Rock Foundation to support other community members facing extreme hardship.

This event is presented each year by Jetty, the Tide Table Group, Reynolds Garden Shop, Reynolds Landscaping, Rustic Drift, and Scissor Sisters and Family - all groups with a personal connection to Mallory. Additional long-standing support for this event has come from Sunny Rae's Kitchen and MK Productions.

This year, a record number of local businesses signed on as major sponsors to continue the legacy and impact of this powerful event. Arctic Level sponsors who each donated \$2,500 included: Equity Prime Mortgage, K. "We all realize that coming together to endure the discomfort of a cold day is nothing compared to the hardships that some in our community are facing."

This year's event featured something for everyone including arcade games, face painting, alpacas, horse-drawn carriage rides and a larger-than-life snowman bounce house for the kids as well as fire pits with s'mores, delicious food from Sunny Rae's Kitchen and Mud City Crab House, local oysters from Barnegat Oyster Collective, a wine ring toss, and a photo booth. With toasty winter beverages and live music flowing all day the crowd barely took notice as snow began to fall. The event capped off with winners being announced for the 50/50 as well the raffle and silent auction which boasted several high value items and experiences.

Proceeds from this year's Arctic Outreach are specifically earmarked for a series of grants provided by the Jetty Rock Foundation to support community members facing extreme hardship.
