





B: 'Nah, too many words, man, like always...



The Buzz Bros Band is, along side Second Vision and the Marnix Busstra 4-tet my third, own band.

What makes this formation so special is that everything's fallen into place from the very beginning – it has never been a search, but rather a discovery, from the composition process to the live performances to these very recordings. The time was obviously ripe for this brother's band...

Berthil and I used to play a lot together, always busy with *our* sort of music: Miles, Hancock, Scofield, et cetera. Still, at a certain point, we grew apart and proceeded to follow our own musical paths. Logically, that period didn't seem to be the correct time to start a band together. My feelings were that it was necessary for each of us to develop musically on an individual basis, and unite again later when our specific musical strengths and personalities had grown.

A couple of years ago, we decided that the time had come. I went ahead and wrote a number of pieces for the brother's band we intended to begin, in an idiom that we both felt comfortable with and wanted to explore. It was important that this music had to be of this time, not just offer a good old times feeling.

To produce a specific sound for this band, we wanted a drummer who grooves and uses brushes exclusively and a bass player who grooves on contrabass, not on a bass guitar. Berthil suggested Chris and René, who have turned out to be an unquestionable enrichment for the band. Together, they form a unique rhythm section with a musical approach that is irreplaceable for this group. Add Berthil's Fender Rhodes, analogue keyboards and my bouzouki, electric sitar and jazz guitar and a typical BBB-sound is the result.

The atmosphere and feeling that this music eludes are very personal to me in that it is expressive of the specific bond I have with my brother Berthil.

I find it very special to actually be able to make this music together, while being totally matter-of-fact about it at the same time.

Perhaps a somewhat late *Busstra Brothers* debut album, but if you ask me, one that has arrived at the moment it could truly become just that: an album representative of and from the Buzz Brothers.


Marnix Busstra



After years of working with many different musicians in a variety of formations and situations, the idea of starting a band together with my brother Marnix was a challenging one. Actually, the question was not whether we could play well together, but rather which rhythm section we should ask to join us. I'd played with drummer Chris before in various circumstances and was immediately sold on him: his fantastic groove combined with the tremendous openness and creativity in his playing is almost unheard of, something one seldom hears in musicianville. I've often played with bassist René in other formations as well, and that has always been virtually effortless: it's sometimes like there's a telepathy in our communication which is almost scary at times. Marnix and I have, of course, played together quite often in the past and we have great musical respect for each other. Frequently the interaction between keyboardists and guitarists is troublesome because it's so easy to get in each other's way harmonically and/or rhythmically. We have actually never had that problem. We know each other so well that we can anticipate each other's travels. Each of the numbers on this CD are individually inspiring; they provide us with every possibility to musically express all that we feel and have inside us. For me, the Buzz Bros Band is the most inspiring



band of my career thus far.








