Discussion Questions

- 5 Isabelle's fascination with Prague was triggered by a Christmas song about good King Wenceslas. Does Evan play the role of the good King Wenceslas in Isabelle's life, or does the song signify something else?
- 6 Isabelle believes The Black Place is not depression and anxiety, but rather a more sinister and ancient force. Why?
- 7 Is the Australia Day Party Isabelle's attempt at redemption? Discuss.
- 8 Isabelle worries that she is 'mad'. Is her world view any more 'crazy' than Evan's Catholicism or Jack's managerialism?
- 9 What does the novel suggest about our personal responsibility to the burden of history?
- 10 Why does Isabelle think she is wrong for Evan?
- 11 What is the role of the priest in Prague in helping Isabelle find peace? Does his appearance fill the role left by Evan's absence as religious counselor?
- 12 How does Prague's history help Isabelle find absolution?
