how to make













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DIFFICULTY ••

Approximate Time of Project: 1 hour

MATERIALS:

45x115cm printed cotton fabric 45x115cm felt fabric Polyester wadding 25mm bias tape Thread (complementary to fabric) Thread (complementary to binding)

EQUIPMENT:

Ruler Washable fabric marker Pins Fabric scissors Sewing machine Sewing needle

HELPFUL HINTS

0.5cm seam allowance included.
Do not use polyester or acrylic fibres in hot temperatures.
Do not use these pot holders to move things to and from the oven.

STEPS

- Cut out an 85x20cm rectangle and two 20x20cm squares from the print. Repeat for the felt and the wadding.
- Sandwich the 85x20cm wadding between the print and felt of the same length so the right side of the print is showing. Repeat for the two squares.
- 3. Pin sandwiched fabric down and baste around the edge to hold the wadding in place.
- 4. Quilt the three pieces as desired.
- Trim all corners on the rectangle so they are rounded and trim two corners on each square to match.

- 6. Cut a 20cm length of bias tape. Pin and sew bias tape to the straight side of a 20x20cm square. Repeat for the other square.
- 7. Cut a 10cm piece of bias tape fold it in half so the raw edges are inside and sew along both long sides. Fold and place it half way along the long side of the pot holder. Pin and baste.
- Pin squares to either end of the rectangle with felt sides touching and raw, rounded edges together. Pin and baste along raw edges.
- Pin and sew bias tape around the outside edge of the potholder.
- 10. Fasten off thread and tidy up.
