

Hooded Jacket

EASY KNIT

Make this fashionable and cosy hooded jacket in our super bulky Chunky Sherpa Yarn. A boxy oversized fit with front patched pockets and a hood, this garment is knitted on big needles and will take no time at all to make. The pattern is easy enough for beginner knitters to follow.

MEASUREMENTS

YARN REQUIRED

Makr CHUNKY SHERPA Yarn 226g balls

NOTE: This pattern is written in British English. All measurements in charts and instructions are in cm. For conversion from centimetres to inches please divide by 2.5cm. Please be aware that there are different terms for crocheting and knitting in American and British English, if in doubt, we've included a list of common abbreviations.

Please use only the yarn specified. Another yarn is likely to yield different results. Quantities are approximate as knitting styles may vary between knitters. Check the ball bands to ensure all yarn is from the same dye lot.

DIFFICULTY • • •

NEEDLES AND EQUIPMENT:

25mm straight knitting needles Removable Stitch Markers Stitch Holder

TENSION:

25mm: $3sts \times 4rows = 10cm \times 10cm stst.$

KNITTING ABBREVIATION:

Cont Continue. K Knit.

Kfb Knit into the front and the back of the stitch as an

increasing method.

P Purl.

Pfb Purl into the front and the back of the stitch as an

increasing method.

St(s) Stitch(es).

Stst Stocking Stitch (alternatively knit 1 row, purl 1

row).

NOTES

The collar and hood is joined to the garment by a 'knit-in method. A 'knit-in' technique is a 'join as you knit method', by picking up a stitch from the edge you are connecting to.

HOODED JACKET PATTERN

BACK

Cast on using cable cast on method, 16 (18, 20, 22) sts.

Rows 1-15: Work 15 rows stst.

ARMHOLE:

Row 16-17: Cast off 2 sts at start next 2 rows:.

12 (14, 16, 18) sts.

Row 18 - 23(24, 25, 26):

Work 6(7,8,8) rows.

Cast off.

FRONT RIGHT

Cast on 9(10,11,12) sts.

Rows 1-10: Work 10 rows stst.

SHAPING NECKLINE

Row 11: K to last 2 sts, kfb, k1. 10(11,12,13) sts Row 12: P1, pfb, p to end. 11(12,13,14) sts Row 13: K to last 2 sts, kfb, k1. 12(13,14,15) sts Row 14: P1, pfb, p to end. 13(14,15,16) sts

ARMHOLE

Row 15: Cast off 2 sts, k to end. 11 (12,13,14) sts

FRONT NECK LAPELLE

Row 16: Pcast off 4 sts, p to end. 7(8,9,10) sts.

Row 17-23(24, 25, 26):

Work 7(8,9,9) rows stst.

Cast off.

LEFT

Cast on 9(10,11,12) sts.

Rows 1-10: Work 10 rows stst.

SHAPING NECKLINE

Row 11: K1, Kfb, k to end. 10(11,12,13) sts Row 12: P to last 2 sts, pfb, k1. 11(12,13,14) sts Row 13: K1, kfb, k to end. 12(13,14,15) sts Row 14: P to last 2 sts, pfb, k1. 13(14,15,16) sts

ARMHOLE

Row 15: K row.

Row 16: Cast off 2 sts, p to end. 11 (12,13,14) sts

FRONT NECK LAPELLE

Row 17: Kcast off 4 sts, k to end. 7(8,9,10) sts.

Row 18-23(24, 25, 26):

Work 7(8,9,9) rows stst.

Cast off.

SLEEVES X 2

Cast on 8(10,12,14) with long tail cast on method.

Work 7 rows sts.

Row 6: k1, kfb, k to last 2 sts, kfb, k1. 10(12,14,16)

Row 8-15, cont. stst.

Cast off loosely.

POCKETS X 2

Cast on 8 sts with cable cast on method.

Work 8 rows stst.

Cast off.

JOINING

Join front side seams to back.

Join front shoulders to back, leaving back neckline opening of 12 (14,16,18)sts.

Join sleeves sides and into armhole apex.

Sew pockets onto left and right fronts aligning bottom edge with bottom hems, and centre each pocket.

HOOD

You will knit -in a hood by picking up stitches first along the left hand side of the garment neckline, adding stitches to the count on every 2nd row, as follows:

Pick up 4 sts from the cast off horizontal edge of the front neck lapelle.

- 1. Knit row.
- Pick up a stitch from the vertical front neckline, and purl it separately on the next row so that 1 extra stitch is added to the count. (5 sts)

Keep working as per rows 1-2, working your way up the front vertical neckline edge (you will pick up [3,3,4,4] sts along here) and then along the front horizontal neckline (you will pick up [4,4,5,5] sts), and when you reach the horizontal edge of the back neckline you will have [10,10,12,12] sts on your needle in total.

Continue working along the back neckline picking up 4 sts along this edge as follows:

- Pick up a stitch from the horizontal edge of the back neckline, and purl it together with the first stitch on the next row. (10,10,12,12) sts remain on the needle)

Now you are going to work your way across the other side, (the right side) of the garment neckline. This time you will be reducing stitches on every 2nd row, as follows:

- 3. Knit row (10,10,12,12) sts
- 4. Pick up a stitch from the vertical edge of the right hand side neckline, and purl it together with the first stitch on the next row, p2tog, p to end of row (9,9,11,11 sts)

Keep working as per rows 3-4 above, working your way along the horizontal right hand side neckline edge (4.4, 5,5 sts), then along the vertical right face of the neckline edge (3,3, 4, 4) sts, and when you have 4 sts left on your needle, cast off. Seam the cast off edge into (cast off edge) of the left hand side lapelle.

Darn in all ends with your fingers and trim to neaten.
