- The company's internal assessment concluded that the risk of forced labour or child labour in its supply chain is minimal. The company's primary business is to purchase small quantities of consumer products for resale, usually from large distributors and not typically directly from factories. These distributors are typically large well-established reputable global (typically North-America based) companies, who the company believes abide by labour laws and are ultimately responsible for their supply chains. Also, in the majority of cases, the identity of the factory is not known to the company, and the company is not in a position to know or influence the factory's production process or labour policies. In the rarer cases that the company purchases directly from a factory, it chooses where possible reputable factories in well-established and sophisticated manufacturing regions where labour laws are well known and respected.
- Based on this assessment and ongoing monitoring, the company is not aware of any instance of forced labour or child labour in its supply chain. Finally, the company is a long-standing and responsible member of the business community and engages with industry and government stakeholders to do its part.
