WEEK 13 A Determined Shepherd Boy The Story of David and Goliath

HEAR THE BIBLE STORY

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Sadly, the Philistines did not like God's people, the Israelites. They wanted to fight the Israelites in a war. The Philistines had a mighty warrior named Goliath. He was a giant over nine feet tall! He wore a shiny, bronze helmet and a heavy suit of armor. Goliath carried an enormous spear and shield. He seemed fearless! Each day Goliath shouted at the Israelites and said, "I dare you to send one of your soldiers to fight me!" King Saul and the entire Israelite army were terrified! No one was willing to fight Goliath. This went on for 40 days!
