to operate a pet food plant on the premises.

- 2. Category 3 animal by-products shall be dehydrated at temperatures between 90 to 130 degrees Celsius for perios between 1 and 12 hours (depending on the product, as per HACCP agreed with APHA). Afterwards product will be dried in dry rooms for 3 to 6 days.
- 3. The pet food shall be sampled monthly to verify compliance with the microbiological standards in Chapter II, paragraph 5 of Annex XIII of Regulation No. 142/2011
 - Samples should be submitted as per protocol agreed with APHA and tested at a laboratory accredited by UKAS. Sampling frequency will be assessed and verified periodically and may be amended.
 - Plant will be subject to regular risk-based inspections by APHA Inspectors. Visit frequency may be amended
 according ro risk assessment.
- 4. This approval replaces AB05 approval issued 6/2/2012.
