Uncorked:

Domaine du Cayron Gigondas is a small town in the southern Rhone valley of France that produces some fantastic wines, and Domaine du Cayron is the premier producer in Gigondas. This domaines vines are 40 plus years old, some are up to seventy years of age. These old vines produce terrior expressive wines with great complexity and personality that is unmistakably unique. Domaine du Cayron Gigondas is a blend of 70% Grenache, 15% Syrah and 15% Cinsault. The nose is complex, filled with red berry scents, wood smoke, spice and white flowers, the palate is explosive, with raspberry, floral notes and more of the inviting spice from the nose. The finish is long and persistent with smooth integrated tannins and repeating floral and spice notes, the complexity and balance of this wine is unique to this domaine. Domaine du Cayron pairs well with roasted leg of lamb, beef stew and even heavier fish meals. We will be trying this wine at our December 9th tasting so please come by and give it a try, I'm certain you will fall in love with this special wine.

Barrell Bourbon

Barrell Craft Spirits is a special and unique whiskey company that sources the best distillates possible and further enhances them by using different barrels and ageing environments. They have achieved this by forming relationships within the whiskey community all around the world. Barrell Bourbon #13 is a 5-8 year blend from Indiana and Tennessee, 3 different mashbills are used, 1 corn heavy and 2 rye heavy, this creates a complex and delicious bourbon. The flavor is sweet up front, with hints of apricot and sweet toffee, with a beautiful spice on the finish surrounded with smoky notes of barrel spice and vanilla.
