

A UN Parliamentary Assembly?



The lofty ideals of the United Nations speak of protecting human rights and of peace for all people. Yet the UN is an assembly of ambassadors representing the views of their national governments. The UN has no place for actual significant input of the people. Governments act to protect their own interests, which may coincide with their own population's interests, but not necessarily the interests of all humanity. A UN Parliamentary Assembly (UNPA) would give a voice to citizen-elected representatives and would make decisions in people's best interest. For example, living sustainably is unquestionably in the collective interest of humanity, even if it may not be in the interest of any one nation to lead the way





Convenor of the Campaign for a UNPA

Andreas Bummel is the convenor of the Campaign for a UNPA. He is also co-founder and executive director of Democracy Without Borders and known worldwide as a leading expert and advocate for a world parliament. He is one of the convenors of the We The Peoples campaign, which advocates for more democracy at the UN. From 1998 to 2008, he served on the Council of the World Federalist Movement, and in 2018 he co-authored a book entitled A World Parliament: Governance and Democracy in the 21st Century. Andreas was elected a fellow of the World Academy of Art and Science, and the Society for Threatened Peoples made him an honorary member. Born in South Africa he is based in Germany.
