PROLOGUE

Colorizons

Antonia Pia Gordon

With her *Colorizons* series *Antonia Pia Gordon* concentrates on the pairs of opposites that are typical of her signature duality of theme. The *Colorizons* series, with its bold and expressive colours in the horizon, combines the finite with the infinite – the horizon in its pure Greek sense being the separating circle that divides the Earth from the sky and the horizon as an infinite plane that extends as you move into it. The sky meets the earth, air meets water, limitation meets freedom. With her multi-layer textured canvases and with the perspective view of the end of world and beyond it, *Gordon* invites her viewers to follow her into the mystery of the universe, where the moods of the different times of the day are reflected in the colours of the sky and the water, where the clouds alternate between being symbols of freedom surfing in the sky to tamed, static and warm and soothing ornaments on the water surface.

Drawing her viewers into infinity, *Gordon* offers the possibility of reflecting on where we originate from and where we are going in a juxtaposition of memory and floating future in a continuation of one of the essential underlying themes of many of her works, the quest for self-knowledge and self-enhancement.

This series particularly emphasizes *Gordon's* unique ability of combining colours that could be potentially threatening to a surprisingly serene meditative combination that invites the soul to rest. The series is a witness to *Gordon's* many years of living on different coasts in different climates and to the closeness to water that plays such a great role in her life from childhood onwards. The clouds meeting and separating, the sky meeting water and separating itself from it are indeed strong symbols of movement towards and away from places and people, a prevalent theme that runs like a silver line through many of *Gordon's* works. The forms of the spatula technique painting hint upon the horizon being spherical and

its being imperceptible to the naked eye, in unique symbolism of the different emotions and experiences that lay hidden in people of all kinds.

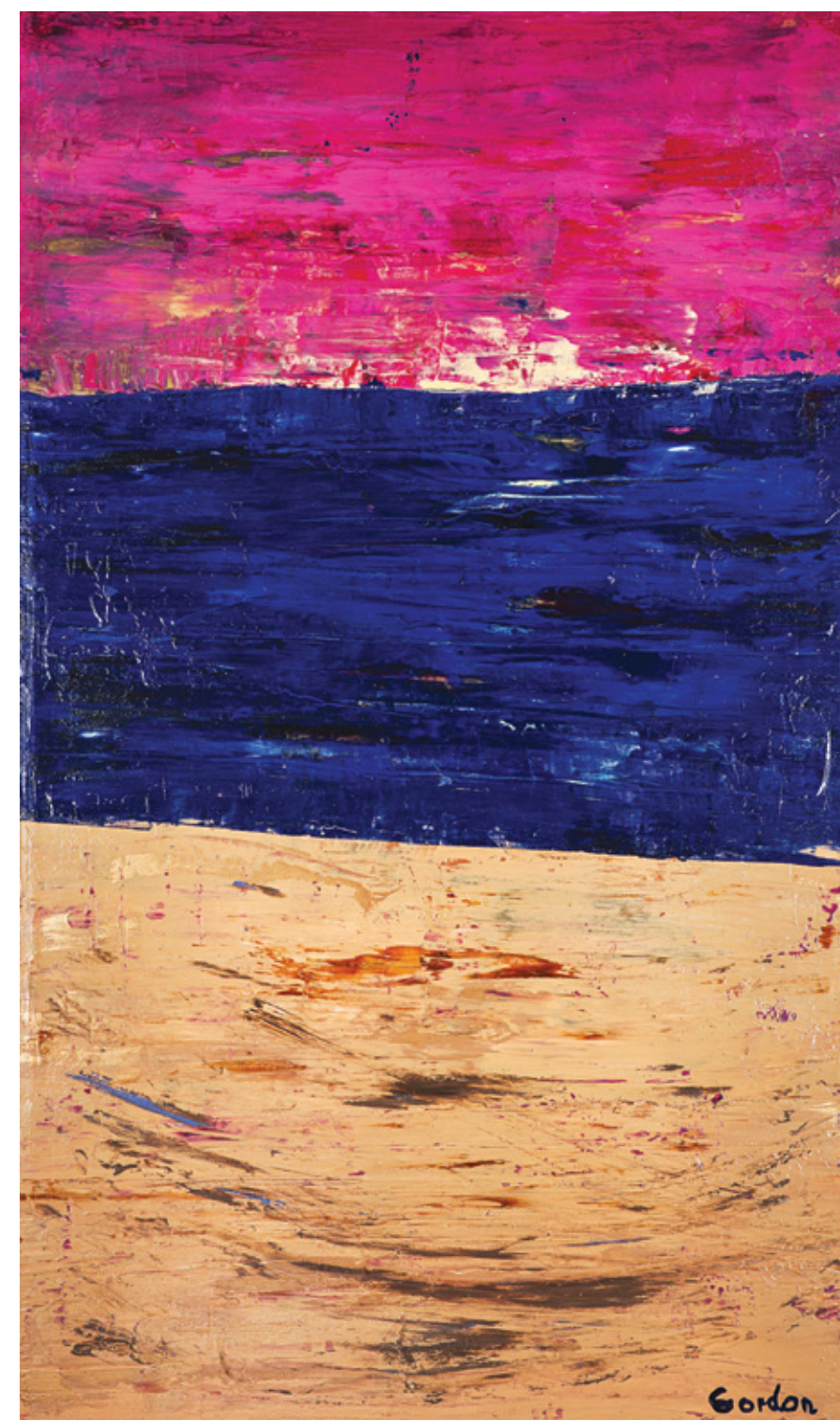
The endless fields of floating colour lead to reflect on knowledge and the unknown, on experience and what is still to be experienced and form a fascinating framelessness for lightness of topic change, whilst offering a background for the search for peace and self-empowerment - universal questions of mankind. This series epitomizes hope. The horizon is the farthest you can see in the physical world and yet we all know there is something beyond the vanishing point.

Gordon's Colorizons series includes paintings bearing titles that reveal *Gordon's* fascination with [Thomistic truth](#) and some of which of course are a nod to Shakespeare's "Taming of the Shrew" in which the wild becomes gentle, the urge for freedom becomes settled and other titles reflecting serene mantra-like energy: *Taming the Light, Revealing Nights, Pink Passion, Perfect Balance, Heaven on Earth, Water's Edge, Unlimited Blue, Taming the Light with Clouds, Energy of Light*.

The *Colorizons* series with its layer after layer of vivid acrylic colour emphasis and its combination of impressionistic and expressionistic styles is an energizing mediation which bears witness to *Gordon's* vast artistic range in a series of bold colour canvases and to her ability to skip with ease from the dramatic to the serene, yet another of her many dualities.

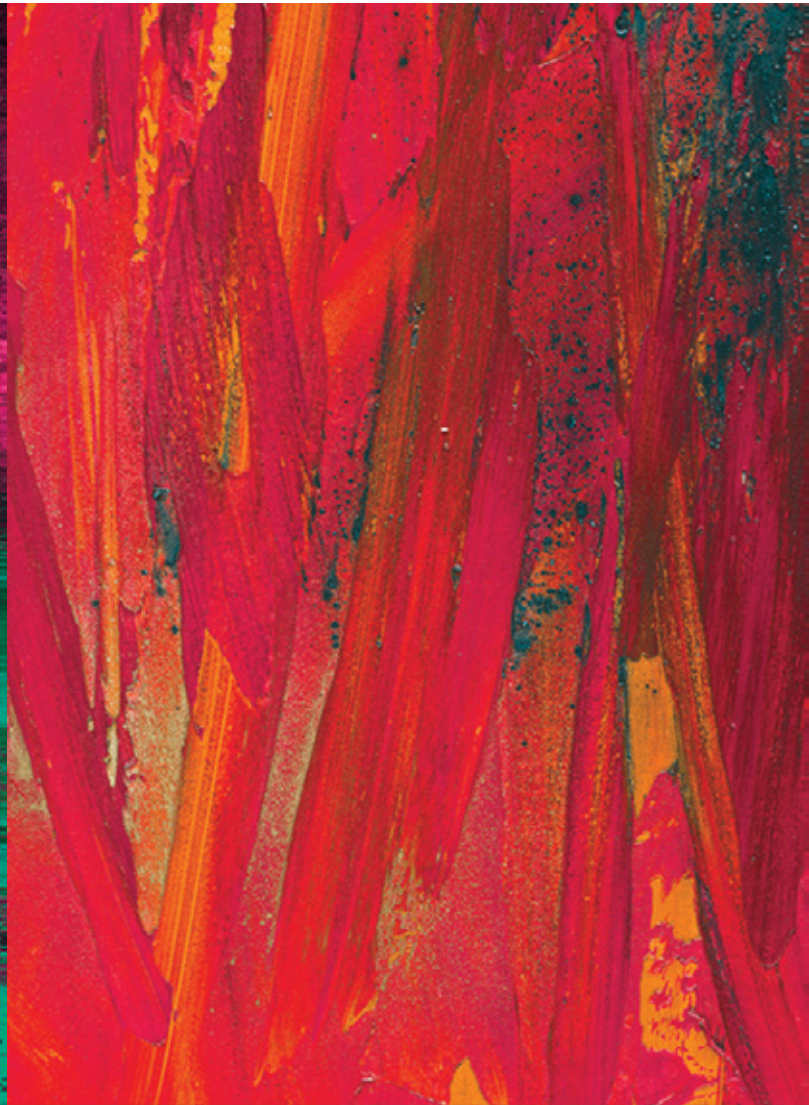

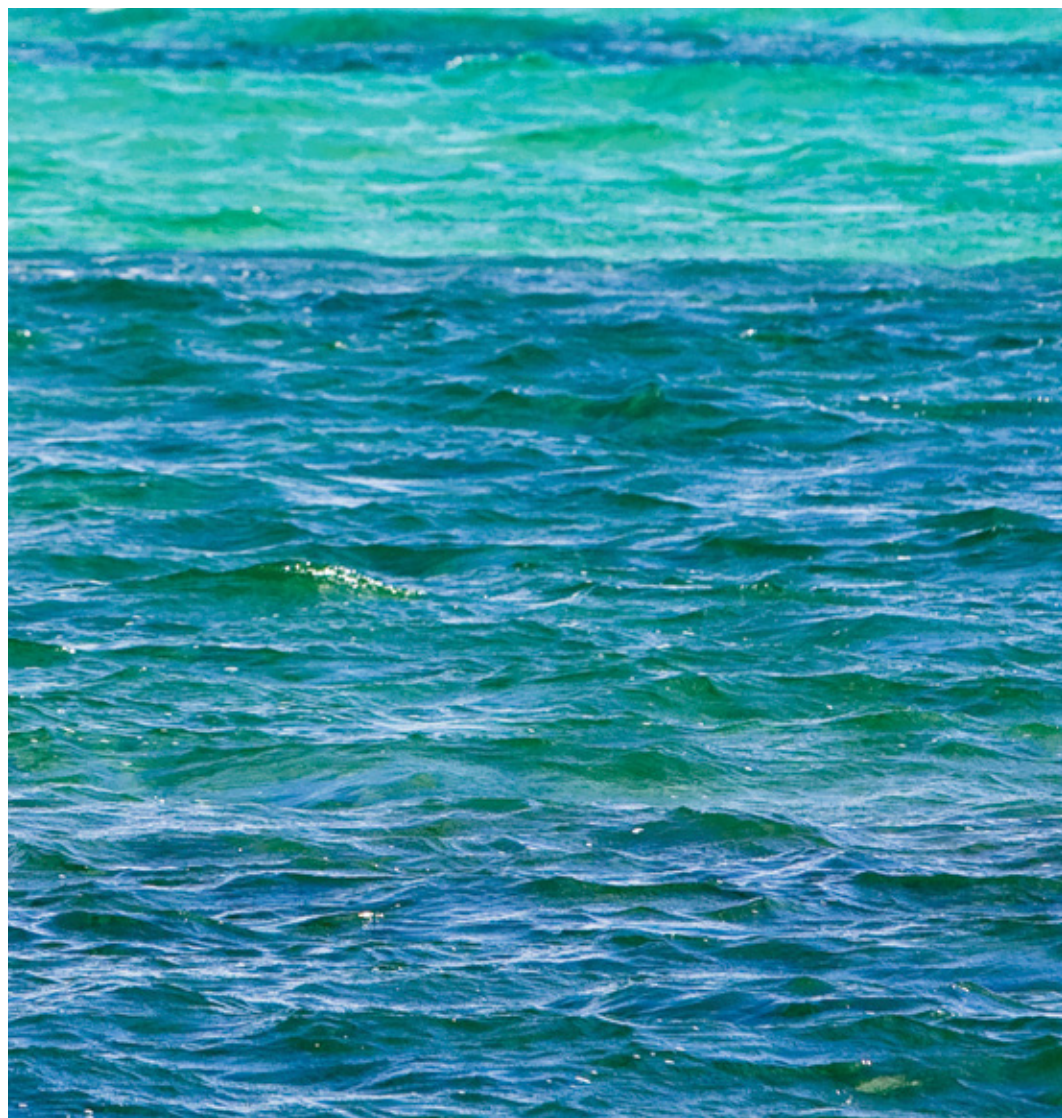




Colorizons 1: Speed Of Light | 2008

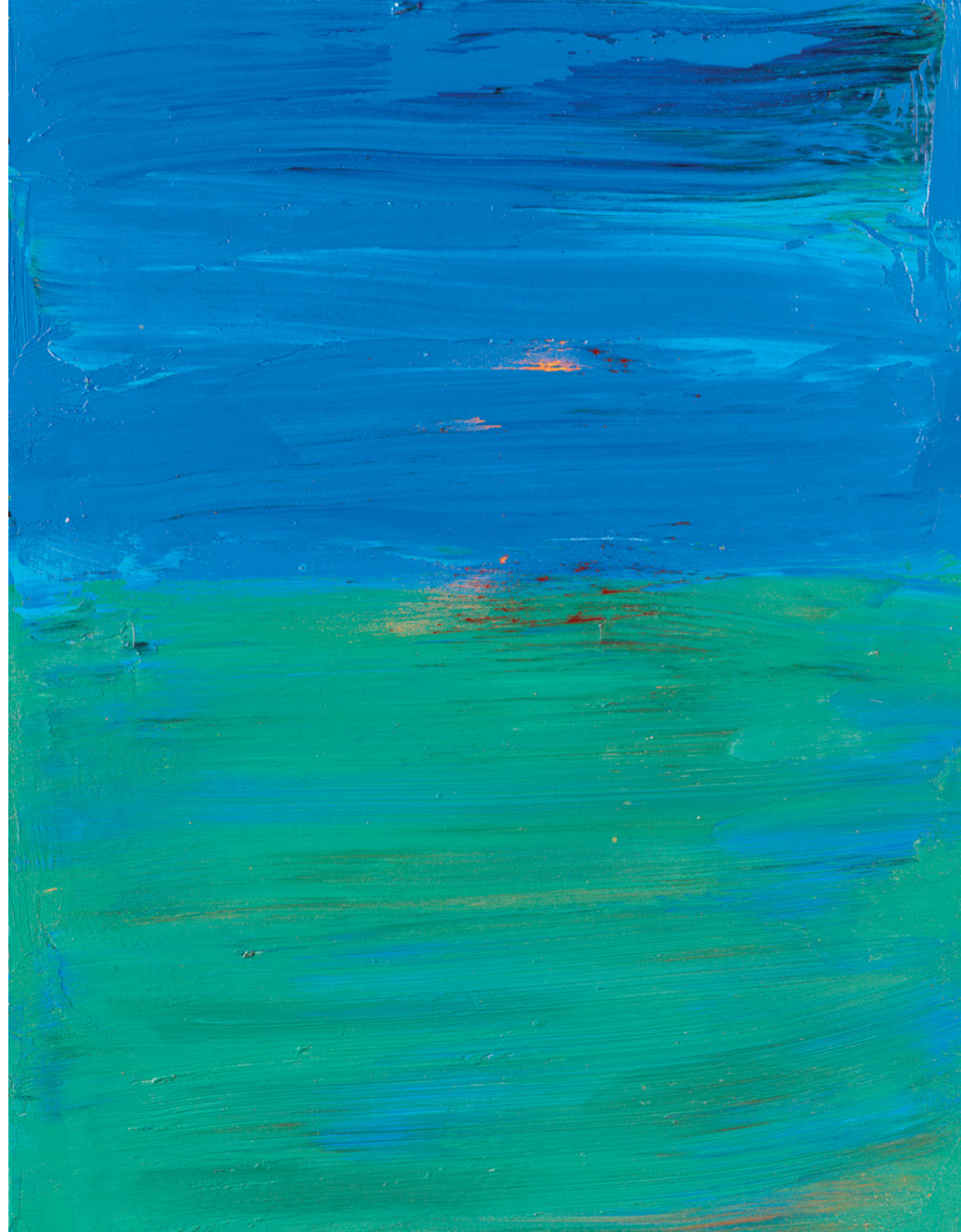


Colorizon 14: The Deep Blue | 2008

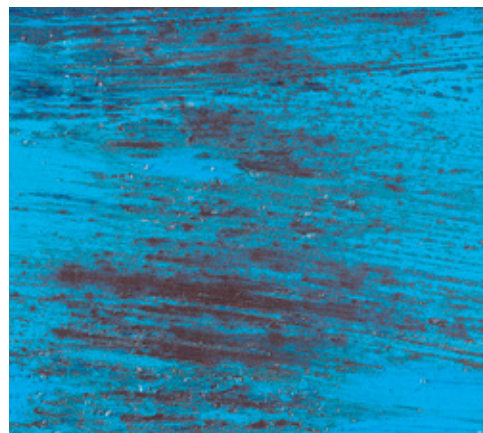

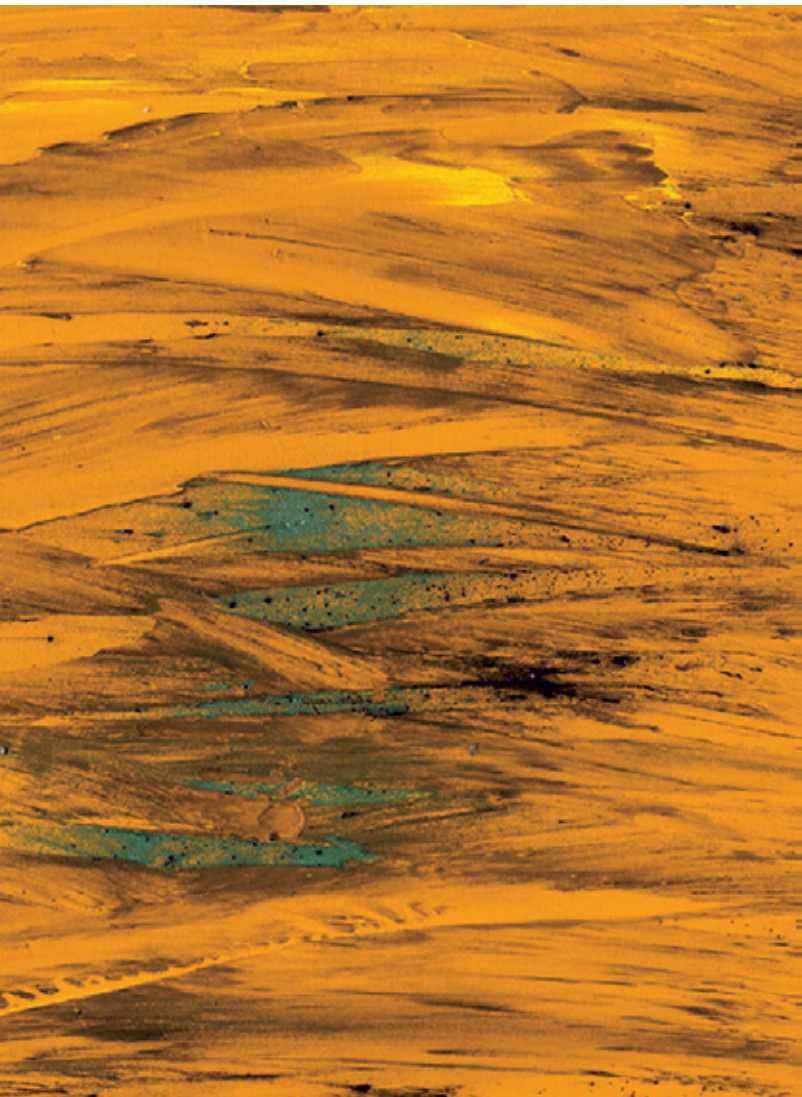

Antonia Pia Gordon was born in Hamburg, Germany and lives and works in the United Arab Emirates.

She was educated in Germany, Switzerland and in France. Her diversified interests and talents manifested themselves early on in her choice of studies in French, Literature, Art, Design, Psychology and Business Administration.

After leaving the business world to explore the works and techniques of famous artists such as Van Gogh, Chagall, Picasso, Rodin, Hockney, Warhol, participating in theatre, film, cross-cultural and media projects all over the world, and investigating different life patterns, *Antonia Pia Gordon* went on to leave the beaten path with her own individual artistic style, creating works of art that encompass highly expressive paintings, striking sculptures and continual experiments with new materials, and eloquent and poignant writing, presenting classic thoughts in modern contexts. She participated in a number of artistic projects such as screenplay and play writing at UCLA, Los Angeles and studying and reading plays at the London Guildhall School of Music and Drama.

Gordon has a distinct and unmistakable style of multi-media interdisciplinary modern and expressive art. What makes *Antonia Pia Gordon's* works unique are her occupation with dualities of colour and theme and the harmonic combination of opposites such as male and female, child and adult media, light and dark, serenity and chaos, that comes to life in her series "COLORIZONS". Gordon possesses the exceptional ability to tame chaos with harmony and to move tradition into the modern with classical installations reminiscent of masters with modern media. She is gifted to bridge cultures with her works. Her pre-empting social and economic theorism and her visionary genius are combined with timeless fashionability.

Antonia Pia Gordon's art bears witness to the deep and secure values of tradition, whilst simultaneously questioning the staidness of tradition with breaks to move it into a forward-looking basis for innovative movement and reflection.
