

I'm sooooo looking forward to starting the new school year!










BACK TO SCHOOL

He asked me what I ate. I told him I had french fries dipped in chilli and ice cream.



A SCOOP ON POOP!

Let's celebrate the first issue of Poop Fiction by giving thanks for the greatest invention of humankind! The toilet. Did you know that we owe the invention of the modern day toilet to Sir John Harrington, an Englishman who invented the world's first flushing toilet in 1596? But what was life like before the toilet was invented?

A long time ago, about 10,000 years back, people did their big business anywhere it pleased them. Archaeologists have found the earliest evidence of pipes built to carry human waste in Scotland. In the areas we know as Pakistan and Syria today, there is also evidence of ancient people who had used pipes and water to get rid of human waste. But more concrete evidence of bathroom invention was found on the island of Crete, which historians have labelled as the birthplace of European civilisation, around 2,000 B.C.. Palaces that were built had more than 1,500 rooms, and they included bathrooms with toilets, built with comfy wooden seats flushed by rainwater.

Around 500 B.C., the Romans had public toilets where men could sit and chat while engaging in big business. Bottoms were cleaned with a sponge on a stick, kept in a pail of water mixed with salt. Yucks! Remember, toilet paper was not invented yet. The Romans used a sponge on a stick to wipe their bottoms clean. In other parts of Europe, in medieval times, people threw waste out their windows! It was called a closestool where he would relieve himself! The King was also a multi-tasker. While holding court on his "throne", he would write letters and



issue orders! (So I can't claim to be the first to write my diary in the toilet. King Louis wrote while sitting on the potty way before me!) It was recorded that at the King's most vulnerable moments, the lords would ask for grants of money or special favours. Doesn't a king deserve his privacy? Sheesh... The toilets of today are so vastly different, depending on which part of the world you're living in. Some have you sit, some prefer that you squat. There are flushing toilets with built-in water-saving features that control the amount of water used. There are bidets invented by the French to wash your burns. 
