INTRODUCTION

On 3 April 2020, Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong announced a partial lockdown, known as a "circuit breaker", to contain the spread of Covid-19 in Singapore. These measures came after an increase of unlinked cases over the preceding month, as well as the risk of a huge cluster of infections. All non-essential places closed from 7 April. All schools transitioned to home-based learning from 8 April. All food establishments were only allowed to offer take-away, drive-thru and the delivery of food. In addition, the wearing of masks was made mandatory outside the home, with fines and prosecution for offenders who refused to do so from 14 April. The circuit breaker period was meant to end on 4 May 2020, but was extended to 1 June 2020.
