"Melody!" Bob interrupted excitedly. "Just the

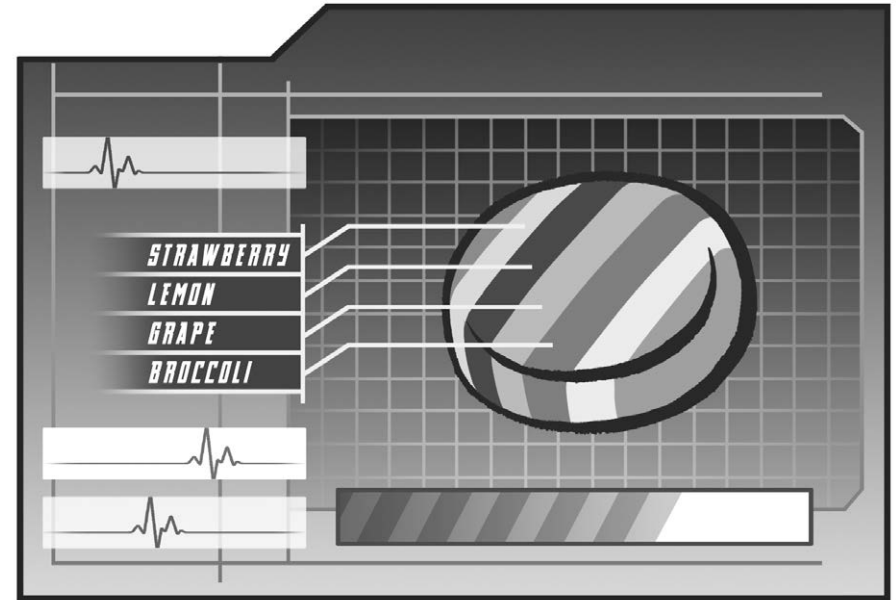
person I'm looking for." He carefully lifted the pastille with a tweezer and placed it in Melody's palm. "Taste this!"
