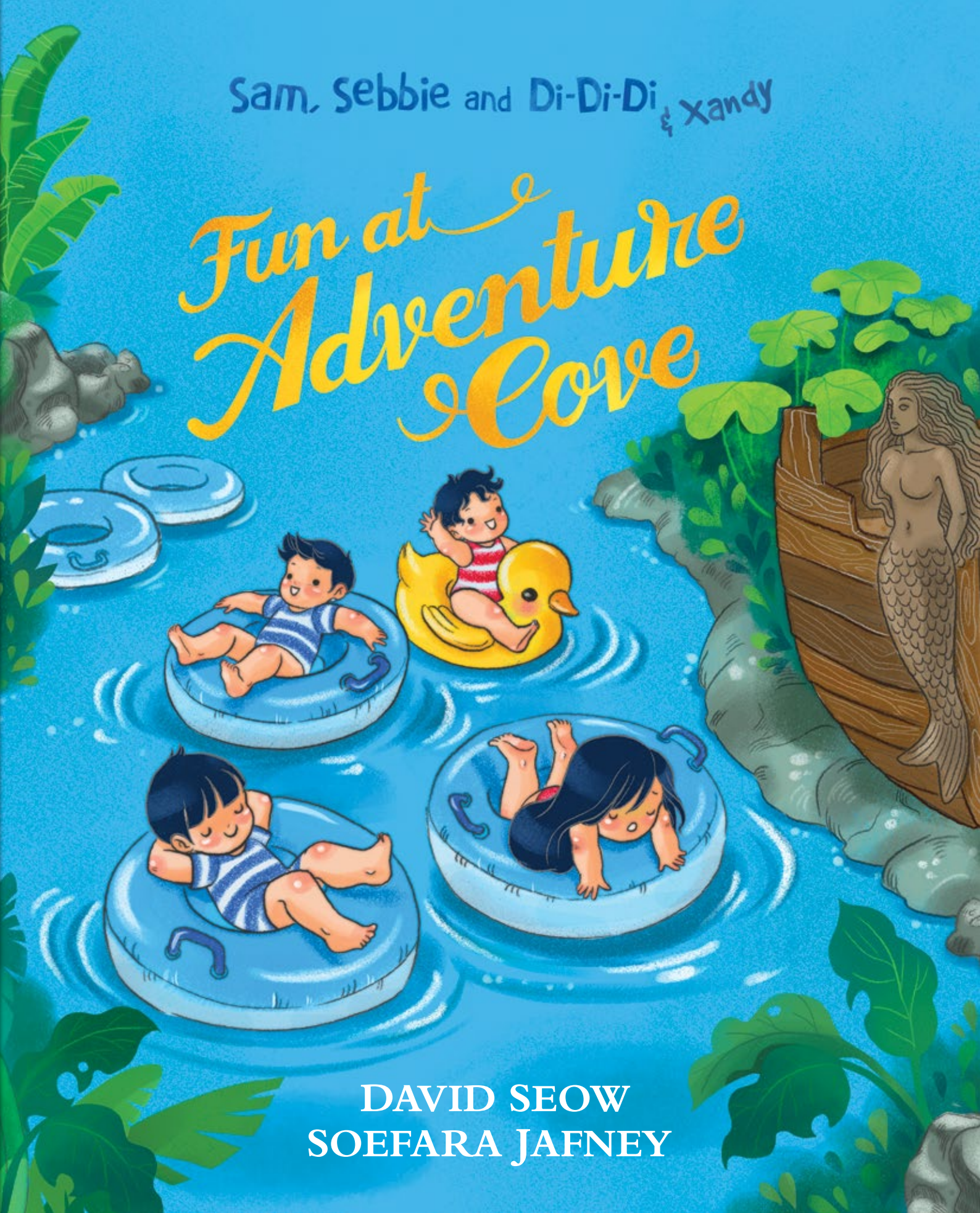

“You see, there are pirates and treasure!” said Xandy.

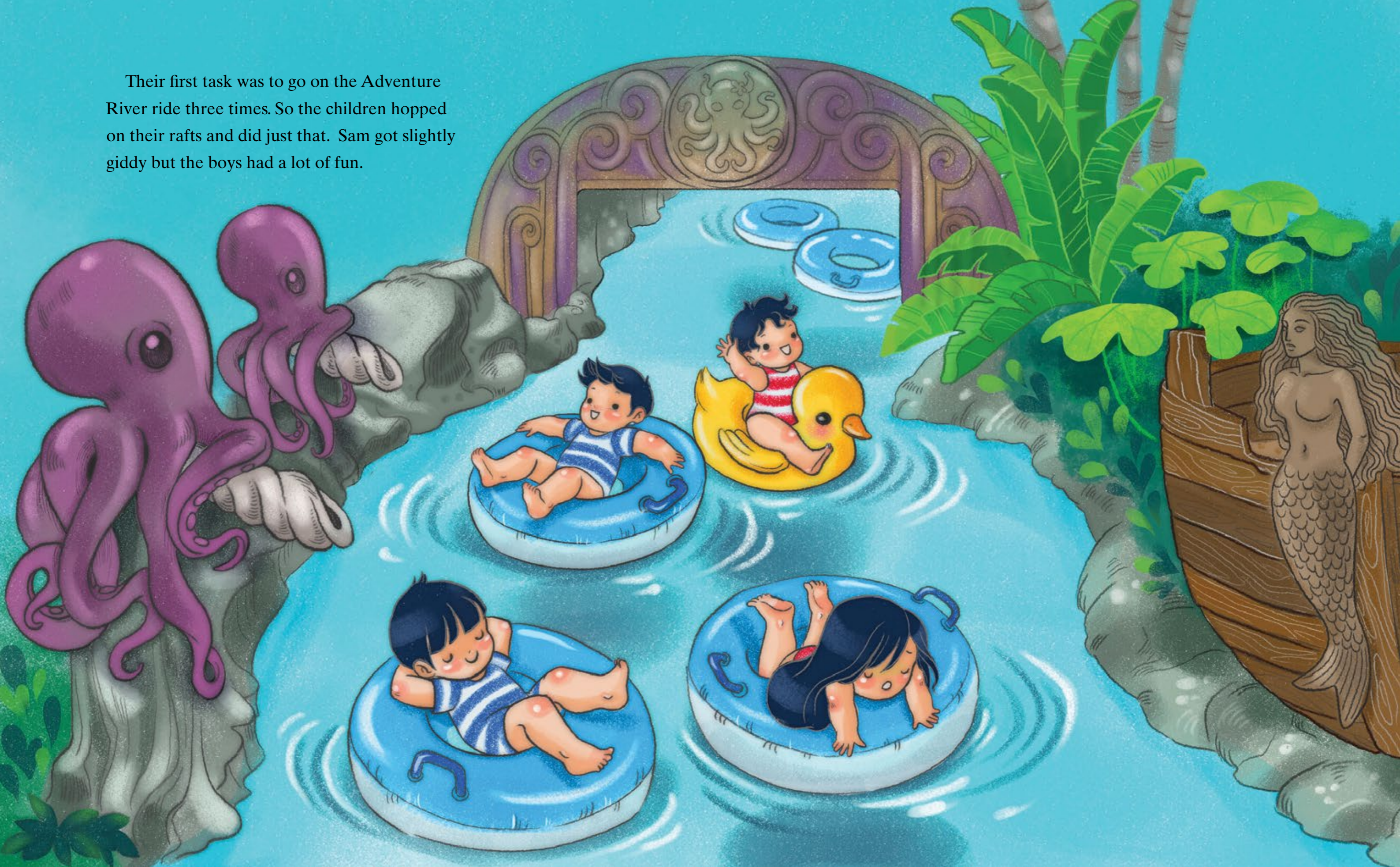
“Let’s do this quickly. I don’t want the treasure to disappear,” said Di-Di-Di.
